INTRODUCTION

This Lenten Devotional was inspired and based on the children's book, "Images of God for Young Children" by Marie-Helene Delval and illustrated by Barbara Nascimbeni. The book is described as: "It is impossible to know what God looks like. But the Bible describes many other ways that God is revealed to us. God is joy and wisdom. God is light, and bread, and breath. We have seen God's face in Jesus Christ. This book uses simple language to help young children discover these images of God in their world."

Though the book is written for young children, I read it and realized how good of a reminder these images are for all ages, especially during Lent, a time focused on our relationship with God. A great way to connect with God is to start seeing God more in all that is around us. It is an important reminder that God is not an old man sitting in the clouds, but is part of all creation and works in and among us to bring about good and righteousness in the world.

THE DEVOTIONAL

The Devotional goes through the 40 days of Lent. You may not know that the 40 day count between Ash Wednesday and Easter does not include Sundays, as those are thought of as "mini-Easters" focused on the upcoming joy of the resurrection instead of the somber reverence taken on through the rest of Lent. This Devotional follows that tradition and gives a daily devotional for Monday through Saturday.

Each day includes the text and paired illustration for each of the 40 images of God shared in the book, a Psalm that connects to the theme, a short reflection written by Pastor Kelsey, and a prayer from the #PictureLent series that is based on the Psalms this year. REFLECTION:

God does not only speak to us but listens to us, in our praise and frustration, in our adoration and our anger, in our prayers and in our grumbles. Sometimes we can find silence for ourselves with God's help. When we take time to connect with God, God can bring quiet to the noise and busyness of our daily lives.


PRAYER:

DAY 6: GOD IS SECRET

FEB. 23



PSALM 69:16-18

16 Answer me, Lord, for your faithful love is good!

Turn to me in your great compassion!

17 Don't hide your face from me, your servant.

Save me because of my enemies!

REFLECTION:

Like Psalm 69 expresses so well, often enough God can feel unreachable or unknowable. Since God is bigger than human form, we don't get to see, talk to, touch, or get to know God in the ways we are used to with our community. Since God is so much wiser and above all worldly things, we cannot know all about God until we are fully in God's presence in Heaven. Though that means there is much about God that remains secret to us during our life, it also means there is always more to discover about God and God's work in the world. Let us discover and learn with joy.

PRAYER:

Dear God, we are not very good at waiting. Sometimes we wait in excitement, and you sustain us. Sometimes we wait in fear, and you comfort us. Thank you for being with us in the waiting. Amen.⁶

DAY 7: GOD IS OUR TEARS



PSALM 40:1-3, 16-17

- I put all my hope in the Lord.
 He leaned down to me;
 he listened to my cry for help.
- 2 He lifted me out of the pit of death, out of the mud and filth, and set my feet on solid rock. He steadied my legs.
- 3 He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise for our God.
- Many people will learn of this and be amazed; they will trust the Lord.
- 16 But let all who seek you celebrate and rejoice in you.
- Let those who love your salvation always say, "The Lord is great!"
- 17 But me? I'm weak and needy. Let my Lord think of me.

REFLECTION:

God is our tears. This one is perhaps the most abstract of the bunch. God is the salty drops of water leaving our eyeballs? Perhaps our tears are not literally God, but when tears leave our eyes, we can remember that God is there. Tears come in moments of strong emotion, and often the moments we may need or want God to be there the most. God comforts us when we have tears of sadness or hurt, hears our grumbling when we have tears of anger or frustration. God celebrates with us when we have tears of joy. Often enough those tears come because of the ways we love and care about people and happenings in the world. Those are the moments that we get to experience a piece of God's care for the world which is our promise that when we are together with God, we will not have sadness and heartbreak anymore.

PRAYER:

God, I affirm that you can hold all my tears, sorrow, or anger. Even in the darkest places, your face radiates light, the Holy Spirit is a beam of hope in our world. Jesus Christ, walk closely with me this day, guiding my footsteps, bringing me closer to You. Amen.⁷

We share in God's laughter and joy.


REFLECTION:
