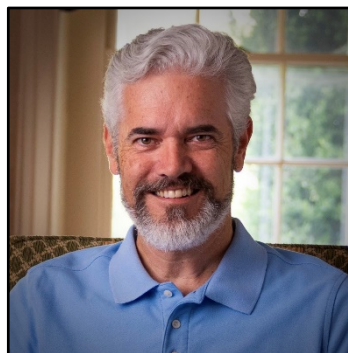

Gerald V. Burke, MD, JD.

A Reproductive Endocrinologist currently practicing in Voorhees, New Jersey, Gerald Burke has been practicing Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility, a sub-specialty of Gynecology, in Southern New Jersey since completing his fellowship at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in 1985. While practicing all aspects of Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility as a Catholic, Pro-Life physician, Dr. Burke does not perform IVF or abortions. Also an attorney in the Health Care division of the firm Lomurro, Munson, Comer, Brown and Schottland, Burke practices medical malpractice law in Freehold, New Jersey. Dr. Burke is a resident of South Jersey and a graduate of LaSalle University, the Hahneman Medical College (now part of Drexel University) and performed his residency in Obstetrics and Gynecology and a Fellowship in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in Philadelphia. While practicing medicine full time, he attended Rutgers, Camden Law School, graduating after four years in 2008. Current president of the South Jersey Catholic Medical Guild in the Diocese of Camden, Dr. Burke has served as president of both the Philadelphia Area Reproductive Endocrinology Society and the New Jersey Obstetrics and Gynecology Society, continuing his membership to both while serving on the board of the latter. Dr. Burke is a member of the New Jersey State Bar Association Committee for Medical Malpractice. When not at work Dr. Burke resides in Medford, New Jersey with his wife and daughter.

Dr. Daniel A. Drain grew up in Toledo, OH and converted to Catholicism at age 17. After initial studies in Philosophy and Theology at DeSales University, he attended the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family, earning both an MTS and PhD (Theology, with specialization in Person, Marriage, and Family). A scholar of Hans Urs von Balthasar's theology, the themes of his research and publication also include eschatology, the nature of Catholic education, sex and gender issues, and fundamental theology. His first book, *Saving Finite Freedom: Hope, Freedom, and Salvation in Hans Urs von Balthasar's Theology of Redemption* is forthcoming from Wipf & Stock. Locally, he has taught at DeSales University, Immaculata University, and was a full-time faculty member at St. Bernard's School of Theology and Ministry in Rochester, NY. He lives in Bucks County, PA, with his wife and daughter, and is honored to serve now as the Director of the Office for Life and Family for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia and as an adjunct professor at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. He is an Ordinary Member of the Sacra Doctrina Project, a peer reviewer for Word on Fire Academic and other scholarly journals of Catholic theology, and was recently appointed to the Advisory Council of the Administrative Committee of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Dr. Marguerite Duane, a board-certified family physician, is co-founder and Executive Director of FACTS about Fertility, an organization dedicated to educating medical professionals and students about scientific evidence supporting fertility awareness-based methods (FABMs). She also serves as an Adjunct Associate Professor at Georgetown and Duquesne University, where she is the Director of the Center of Fertility Awareness Education and Research. Dr. Duane cares for patients via a direct primary care house-calls based practice, MD for Life, and previously worked as medical director of the Catholic Charities community health centers in DC and Maryland. Dr. Duane currently serves as the CMA State Director for DC and is the past president of the St. Giuseppe Moscati DC CMA Guild. She has served on the board of the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) and the Family Medicine Education Consortium (FMEC). Dr. Duane trained as a Creighton, FEMM and NeoFertility Medical consultant, and a TeenSTAR educator. She received her M.D. degree from the State University of New York at Stony Brook and completed her Family Medicine residency at Lancaster General Hospital in Pennsylvania. She received a Bachelor of Science with Honors and a Master of Health Administration degree from Cornell University. In 2022, Dr. Duane completed a primary care research fellowship at the University of Utah earning a Master of Science in Public Health. Dr. Duane is married to a fellow family physician, Dr. Kenneth Lin, and they are delighted to be the parents of 4 children, Isaac Thomas, Eden Rose, Ellis John and Gianna Marie Lin.
