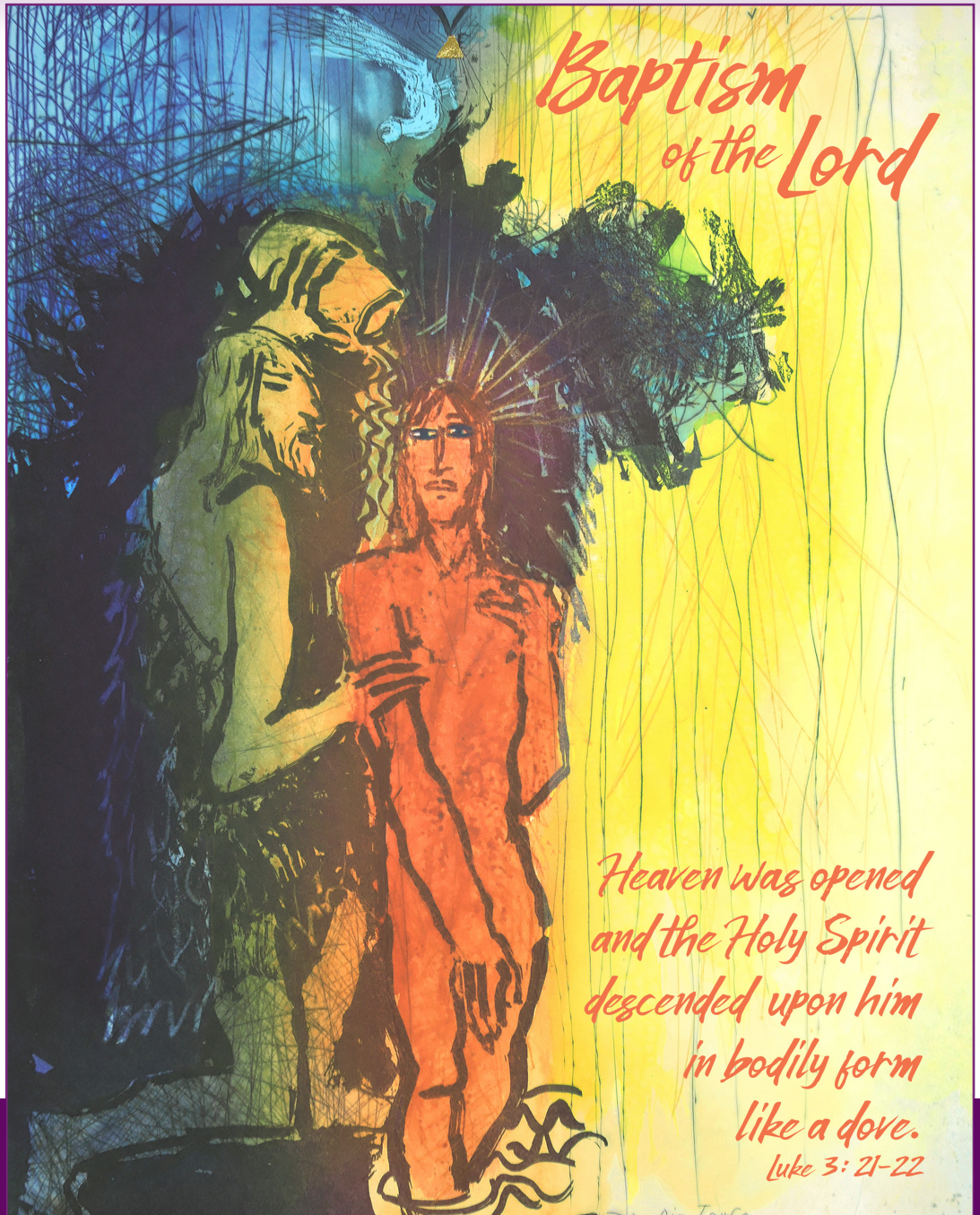

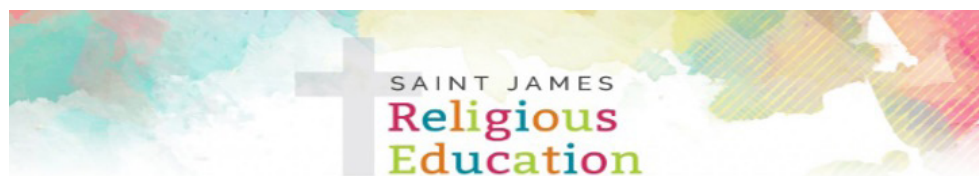

Our son Logan, now 10 years old, was a calm baby, constantly smiling, giggling and always seemed to "go with the flow". One exception to this was during his baptism. Instead of his usual passive self, the moment the water began to flow over his head he unleashed a series of loud cries! Every parent's worst fear! While at the moment this was mortifying, looking back, I like to think this was Logan's way of sharing his excitement with Jesus, as his soul was cleansed and sanctified.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord this weekend, I began to think about the sacraments and how Jesus entered the Jordan river not to be baptized for His sanctification, but to empower Him to sanctify us. It was at the time of His baptism that the water became an outward sign of the bestowal of the Holy Spirit, who brings rebirth, transformation and an inner cleansing to our souls. Upon exiting the water, the Holy Spirit came down upon Him in the form of a white dove, which, for us, symbolizes the gift of the Holy Spirit first at our baptism and more fully at the time of our confirmation.

It is through the sacrament of Baptism that we receive the Holy Spirit, through the Eucharist we are given the body of Christ, and in Confirmation, we receive "our mission" with an out-pouring of the Holy Spirit and His spiritual gifts. It is through the gifts of the Sacraments that we are called to "transform the world" as a missionary community of Christians, at our baptism when become the "anointed ones" of God, and are called to practice our Catholic faith in all aspects of our lives as we become witnesses of Christ in every situation.

As Logan grows in his faith, he has begun to reflect more, usually with comments before bed when we spend some time talking about the blessings that he has received, small or large, throughout the day and sharing things we are grateful for. Over the course of the years he has found the joy in helping others and through his own volition, with care and compassion, he has found many ways to practice his faith. One that he looks forward to each year is donating all the money he has saved to a charity that he researches and feels drawn to. It is beautiful to watch him grow in his faith as a Christian as he continues his personal trek from baptism to confirmation.

Watching Logan reminds me that I should reflect and pray daily about how I am living my faith. Am I transforming the world as a Christian, as "an anointed one"? How can I better embrace the Holy Spirit as I act as a missionary of Christ?

For He is the way to everlasting life.
