Pastor's

Even though I had met her in passing years ago, my first real chat with Cindy Good occurred at Roaster's Coffee on Georgia Street in Amarillo. I had heard that she was looking to be more involved in a parish's music ministry after many years of being on the staff at St. Hyacinth's parish in Amarillo and she had heard that St. Ann's was looking to replace Mykel Byersmith as he headed for a full-time teaching position. She insisted that she could benefit St. Ann's with a passion for music and a disinterest in a high salary, but little did I know then how invaluable Cindy would become in continuing St. Ann's excellence in liturgy and music when she did in fact come onto our staff. Cindy was an extremely hard worker. Even when she was lying in a hospital bed battling the health setbacks that beset her the last few months, she was assigning our music ministers to lead and cantor and attending to liturgical details. I can't speak for our other staff members, but I can truly say she worked harder than St. Ann's parish priest. Among her many accomplishments during her almost four years as part of our parish staff, here are a few:

- She had our church organ repaired and tuned up, saving us thousands of dollars in the process. What had at first looked like a project costing hundreds of thousands of dollars, Cindy coordinated the work to be done for just \$15,000.
- Cindy grew our choir and musician corps, reaching out to students at WTAMU and beyond as well as recruiting new and old members to join.
- A new speaker system was installed in our church. Headed by her son Jack Good, Cindy made sure that thousands of dollars were saved by her knowledge of other resources and less expensive options.
- Concerned about the high step near the organ bench and the safety of our organists, Cindy pushed to have a beautiful protective rail installed there.
- Cindy made sure that the children and youth of our parish were part of a special choir for our Christmas Eve children's Masses and practiced many evenings to get them ready.
- When the Covid pandemic required us to remove the hymnals from the pews, Cindy began to produce a weekly liturgical aid that continues to be our parish practice.
- Last Lent our parish hosted one of the area ecumenical Lenten concert sessions, orchestrated of course by Cindy.

When I asked the staff what we would miss most about Cindy's presence in the parish office, we talked about her sarcastic-yet-funny sense of humor, willingness to have lunch with whomever wanted to order food in, get-it-done dedication, camaraderie, a good cup of morning coffee, filling our office and church during the day with music, and personal touches with those planning weddings and funerals.

If we will miss Cindy's presence and gifts, even more so will her husband Bill, son Jack, daughter-in-law Danielle, and grandchildren, Matthew and Addison. Let us pray comfort for them and thanksgiving for ourselves that she helped us praise God with the heavenly choir where she has most certainly taken her place.
