6th Literature: The 6th grade has been taking a look at various fictional genres and reading short stories to practice identifying different reading strategies within those genres. We are finishing the quarter studying techniques to use when reading nonfiction. We are also doing a read aloud of *The Westing Game* which they've been really enjoying! They are memorizing the poem, "The Destruction of Sennacherib" by Lord Byron.

7th Literature: The 7th grade is really enjoying the novel, *The Hobbit*. We have had some great discussions, and that will only continue as we are making our way to the climax! Brian McMichen is a guest speaker coming on Dec 15 to discuss the importance of the way Tolkien writes his narratives, which should be very interesting! They are also working to memorize the poem "Opportunity" by Edward Rowland Sill. Next quarter we will be reading *The Door Within*, a Catholic allegory.

8th Literature: 8th grade is currently reading *A Christmas Carol* while learning and identifying the different types figurative language. They are working to memorize the poem "The Charge of the Light Brigade" by Alfred Lord Tennyson.

8th English: 8th grade has been getting a lot of daily practice of grammar, especially focusing on how and where to use commas. In writing, we have been working on retelling a narrative, based on historical events, as well as peppering in some writing pieces for the Science Fair.

7th Grade Religion: 7th grade just finished and introduction to the Sacraments. In January they will study all 7 Sacraments beginning with Baptism. When we study the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, we will also study enter into a further study of the Mass and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

March 4: This week will begin the Living Stations practice, students will also be reading the book, The Door Within. Living Stations is on March 27 beginning in the church at 2:00 p.m.

<u>8th Grade Religion</u>-This semester completed a look at the Saints with the book, Christians Courageous. They also looked at the difference and similarities between civil and church laws. The semester ended with a look world religions. Next semester the 8th grade will study the Gospel of Saint John, morality within the teachings of the Catholic Church, and Theology of the Body. Additionally, they will learn about and participate in a variety of different types of prayer.

Science 5: The 5th graders have been doing a great job on their plant growing experiment and, overall, have been seeing success. After break, we will be moving on from our study of plant and into the study of Animals. The students are very excited about this and it should be a fantastic learning experience.

Science 6: The 6th graders have completed their study of Chemistry. They did a phenomenal job on their Bohr and Rutherford models and have been practicing how to identify elements based on the Bohr models. We will be looking forward to starting our Physics unit after the break.

Science 7: The 7th graders have been working hard on their Astronomy unit. They created beautiful solar system posters and have done an incredible job throughout the unit. After the break, they will be starting their Hydrology unit and learning about the earths waters.

Science 8: The 8th Graders finished their Hydrology and Environmental Science units. They worked very hard on their inquiry based Dam posters in order to answer the question of "should another Dam be built in Nebraska on the Missouri River?". They created amazing posters and articulated their thoughts incredibly well during the presentations. After break, we will be starting our Chemistry unit.

### **Miss Hums**

**6th History:** 6th Grade has been continuing their time in Ancient Civilizations, studying the life of the Ancient Egyptians and Mesopotamians. Highlights included studying each of their writing systems (hieroglyphics and cuneiform) and practicing it out for themselves! They now are shifting their focus to different groups that arose in the Holy Land during this time period.

**7th History:** Students are continuing their studies of Medieval History by looking at the rapid spread of Christianity into parts of Europe, by means of many holy saints at missionaries from the time. Some areas of focus have included France, Spain, Germany, Ireland, and England.

**8th History:** Students are in the midst of studying the 13 colonies with particular focus on analyzing events that led up to the American Revolution.
