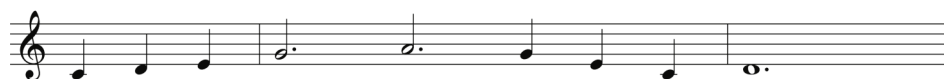

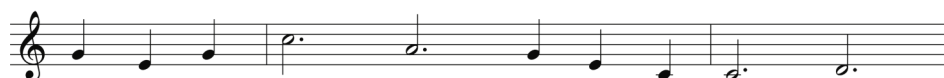

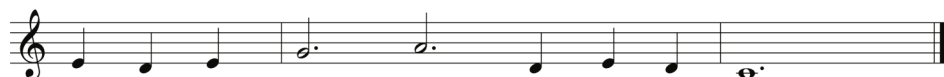

HOMILY

PROFESSION OF FAITH

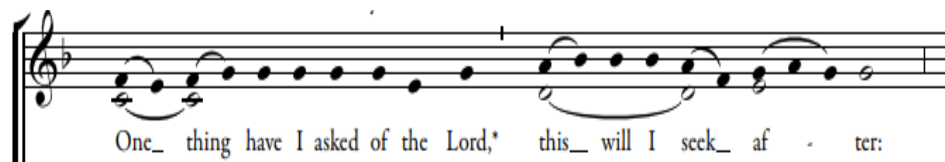
