From the Desk of Fr. Kaim

Fathers impact us more than we know... even at Mass!

On this Father's Day weekend, I thought of something I had read. One of our book giveaways was on the life of St. Thérèse, affectionately called the *Little Flower*. In it there was a story about how even though she would always listen attentively to the sermon at Mass, she would also learn much wisdom simply by watching her father's face. "I looked at Papa more than at the preacher, for I read many things in his face. Sometimes his eyes were filled with tears which he strove in vain to keep back; and as he listened to the eternal truths he seemed no longer of this earth, his soul was absorbed in the thought of another world."

What a beautiful way for this small child to experience the Word of God! She listened to the priest at Sunday Mass, but was also attentive to the way the priest's words affected her father. I mention that to all our fathers (and mothers!) because we never know what things our kids are picking up from us at Mass, the "sponges" that they are.

Hail and Farewell

Those of us in the military call our seasonal changing of the guard, "Hails and Farewells." It's when we acknowledge someone who is leaving and recognize his or her replacement. It's a time-honored tradition that has its place in the life of the parish, although we may not call it such. This week we get to say our goodbyes to **Fr. Fitzpatrick**. I wanted to publicly thank Fr. Fitzpatrick for his three years here. Many of you have expressed to me sadness at seeing him leave. That's a testament to his dedication to you and to his priesthood. Many have also commented on how he's grown in his priesthood. That's also a good sign, because it shows he learns from his mistakes and doesn't settle into a rut. I admit to a bit of selfishness in asking the Bishop if we could keep him another year beyond the normal three years that an associate usually spends at a parish. The Bishop wisely decided to move him, because it's good for a priest to get exposure to many different situations. Having a varied experience will make him a better priest and get him ready to be a pastor, should the Lord call him to be one. So we just have to thank God for the time we had with him and wish him the best as we say our goodbyes.

At the same time, we express great joy and excitement for one of the diocese's brand new priests, **Fr. Blood**, born and raised at nearby St. Bridget's Parish. He will preach at all the Masses next weekend. You will quickly come to love your new associate and see for yourselves the many gifts the Lord has blessed him with. While he will not be teaching at Boylan, where he graduated high school, he will spend some time there. As you know, it's a real struggle to keep our kids Catholic. The record has not been good over the last decade or more once they get to college, so an increased presence of a priest in their lives is called for. He will also be very active with Grace Heim, our Youth Minister, as we seek to fortify our middle school kids from the ravages of our secular world. He will take over the duties of Fr. Fitzpatrick, which includes six nursing home Masses each month, a rotation with two other priests for the TV Mass in Rockford, and a few other ancillary duties. Be sure to give him your very own Holy Family welcome when you get a chance to talk to him.

Trinity Sunday

All analogies limp when it comes to describing such a great mystery as the Trinity. We might use things like the shamrock when explaining it to



kids, but the above picture I think comes closer to what we are trying to describe. This experiment takes three projectors, each of which project a circle: one red, one green, and one blue (the three primary colors). At the intersection of the three circles the color white appears. Mysteriously, the three primary colors are present in the color white, but only one color shows forth. The analogy is not perfect because the three persons of the Trinity do not "blend" to make God, but it does manifest a mysterious "three-oneness" of the color white. Somehow in the one, three are present. There you go. Maybe that's the best we can do in trying to get our heads wrapped around this great mystery.

Donating IRA assets to charity

Turn your Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) into charitable donations



IRS rules mandate that individuals age 70½ and older take RMDs from their IRA each year, regardless of whether the income is needed. These annual withdrawals are subject to ordinary income taxes. By making a charitable contribution from your IRA, you can satisfy your RMD amount without reporting additional income. This provision may be especially attractive for retirees who do not need all the income from their IRA to meet current living expenses. By donating the money to charity, you can enjoy the

satisfaction of knowing that you are contributing to a worthy cause while effectively lowering your tax bill.

How it works

The provision allows retirees age 70½ and older to donate up to \$100,000 tax free from their IRA each year. Generally, when you take a distribution from your IRA, it is treated as taxable income. Under this provision, made permanent in the 2015 federal spending and tax package, those assets are excluded from income if the distribution is made directly to charity. The distribution is not included in your income so you avoid the potential negative consequences that regular IRA withdrawals in retirement can create, including taxes on Social Security benefits. Distributions excluded from income are also equivalent to a 100% deduction. Normally, charitable contribution deductions are limited to a lower percentage (or are eliminated altogether) for taxpayers who do not itemize and take the standard deduction.

Guidelines for donating IRA distributions to a charity

Eligibility	IRA account owner must be age 70½ or older at time of IRA distribution in order to take advantage of this provision. Rule applies only to Traditional, Rollover, and Roth IRAs; SEPs and SIMPLE IRAs are generally excluded. Distributions of non-deductible IRA contributions also do not qualify.
Annual Limit	Maximum amount of a taxpayer's qualified charitable distribution must not exceed \$100,000 per tax year and may include required minimum distributions (RMDs).
Qualifications	Distribution must be made to a qualifying charity; private foundations and donor-advised funds are not eligible. Consult a tax professional for additional information.
Direct Contribution	The IRA Trustee or custodian must make the distribution directly to the charity. Distributions made payable to the IRA owner and transferred to the charity will not qualify.

Example: Tax savings from donating required IRA distribution to a qualified charity

- Charitably minded retired couple over the age of 70 ½ with income of \$80,000
- Required distributions from IRA totaling \$10,000
- Claiming the standard deduction on tax return
- They make annual charitable gifts of \$10,000 annually

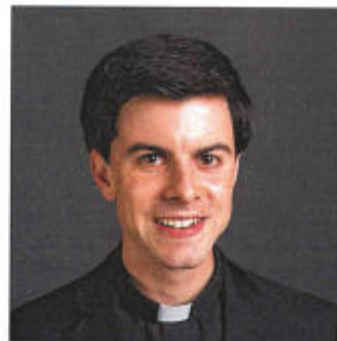
