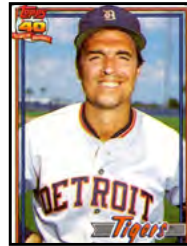

What am I?

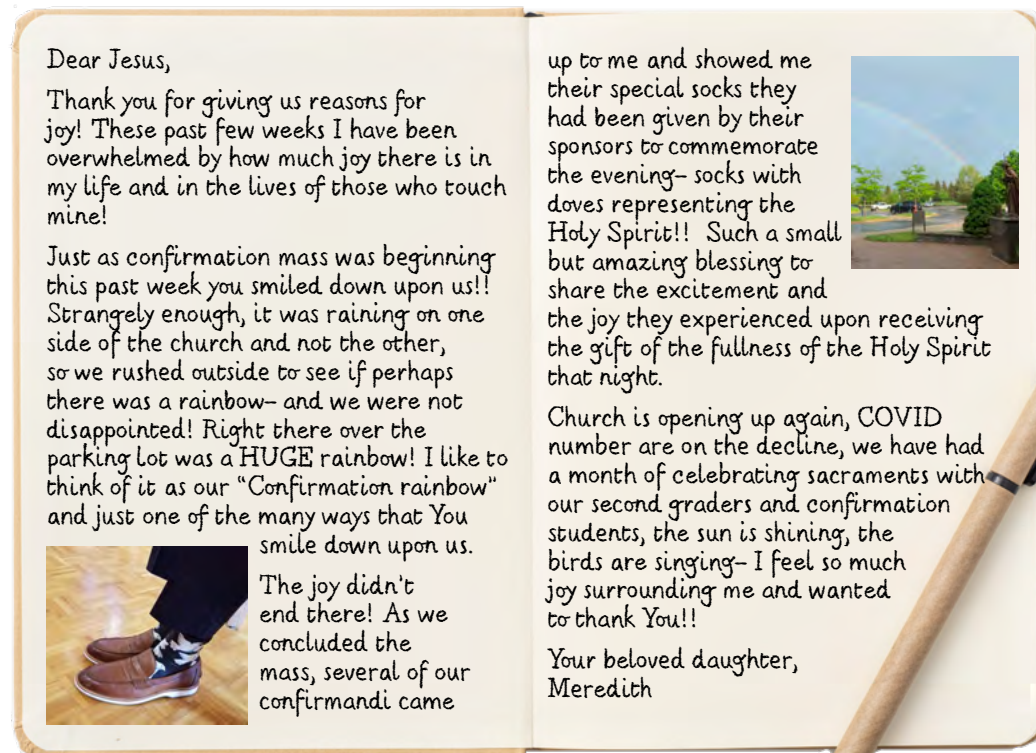
#### A Promise!

### Body and Blood of Christ Mt 14:12-16, 22-26

How does your family remember loved ones who have gone to heaven? You may have pictures, keepsakes, or recipes. I have an afghan that was made by my Grandma and is a special reminder of her, but I feel most strongly connected with her when I am sewing. Grandma used her sewing and knitting skills to create gifts and volunteer, like when she knitted socks for

soldiers during WWII. Her spirit was with me as I sewed hundreds of masks over the last year. When do you feel the spirit of loved ones?

How do we remember Jesus? We have crosses and crucifixes, medals, statues and, of course, the Bible. But how did Jesus choose to be remembered? ## St. James Food Pantry Reverse Collection

Every summer food donations decrease due to vacations, no Religious Education classes, etc.

At the same time, the need becomes greater for the families we help, due to children being home all day with no school lunch provided. To help with the decrease in donations, our annual Reverse Collection would normally take place at all masses this weekend. However, because of COVID restrictions, we will not be passing around a basket with slips of paper listing the items needed for the pantry. Instead, you will find the list of items here:

The students pick up their backpack at the end of the week and return the backpack the following week to be filled again.

## From Your Parish Nurse

### June is National Safety Month

At every Ascension SE Michigan Trauma Center, falls are the number one cause of injury.

Falls are not a normal part of aging. Understanding the reasons for falls and making simple changes can lower your risk of falling so you can stay independent longer. Challenge yourself to make at least one of these changes:

Do a walk-through of your home:

- Keep walkways free of clutter.
- Ensure power cords are secured and not in walking paths.
- Have sufficient lighting. Keep a flashlight next to the bed or add nightlights.
- Remove throw rugs, or replace with rugs that have non-slip backing.
- Watch out for pets! Furry friends and their toys create a fall hazard.
- Add grab bars in the bathroom.
- Wear sturdy, supportive footwear. Avoid flip-flops and backless slippers that become a tripping hazard.
- Having a cell phone with you can be a lifesaver! Throw it in your pocket when in the garden or going to the basement to do laundry.

**Stay active.** Chair Yoga is a great form of exercise that can improve balance and leg strength.

**Communicate with your health provider.** Keep them informed on any falls or if you begin feeling unsteady. Keeping your doctor in the loop can help them identify risk factors to prevent a future fall.

**If you fall — tell someone.** Even falls that don't seem serious can have severe complications.

**Attend a class about fall prevention.** Classes like A Matter of Balance or S.L.I.P. (Senior Lifestyle and Injury Prevention), and so much more.

Many falls can be prevented by utilizing these simple steps above.

# News From Around The Archdiocese of Detroit

## NEW COVID-19 LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS:

1. Those who are fully vaccinated may wear a face-covering and social distance but are no longer required to do so in churches.
2. Those who have not been fully vaccinated are to continue wearing face-coverings and to practice social distancing to protect themselves and others in churches. Because a parish community – and our society – requires mutual trust and a commitment to the common good, each individual is asked to make the best decisions for himself as well as for others. Parishes do not have the responsibility to verify who is and who is not vaccinated.
3. Each parish is to provide a portion of the church – with a size to be determined by the pastor – where social distancing and face-coverings are consistently maintained.
4. All unvaccinated Catholics are encouraged to consult with their doctor about the vaccines. Resources to assist Catholics in understanding the moral use of COVID vaccines can be found at [aod.org/vaccines](http://aod.org/vaccines).
5. The Sign of Peace may resume with the normal wording, "Offerte vobis pacem / Let us offer each other the sign of peace," allowing parishioners and families to make their own determinations about how widely to share some sign of peace.



## COVID LITURGICAL PROTOCOLS WHICH REMAIN IN PLACE:

1. Parishes should continue to provide signage about current COVID protocols.
2. Parishes should keep doors open to ventilate churches as they are able.
3. Parishes are encouraged to continue the COVID arrangement of vessels for bread/wine on the altar.
4. Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion should continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion.
5. Parishes are encouraged to maintain sanitization stations at the locations of the distribution of Holy Communion.
6. Parishes are to continue to refrain from the distribution of the Chalice to the faithful (except for a Bride and Groom on their wedding day).

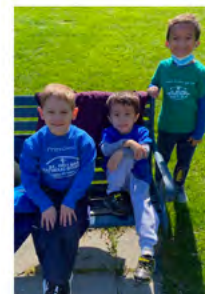

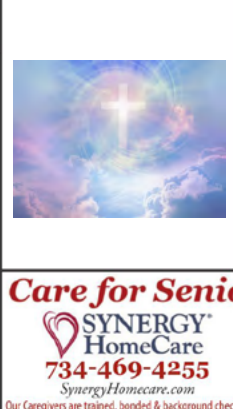
