

I stopped in third grade for a bit on Tuesday and was intrigued with what third graders were working on in science. They were learning about how thermometers work. The green liquid represents mercury. Students had three different types of water, room temperature, hot and cold. Students marked where the green dye moved up and down. They also made predictions about what would happen when using hot and cold water and no water.





Vocabulary is more fun when you can include art to represent the word's meaning. Fifth graders have their vocabulary artwork posted in the hallway and it is very eye catching. I am so glad these are there for our students and staff to see. They can learn a new meaning and appreciate artistic talents. Bravo fifth grade! These are fantastic!
