



#### **BAPTISM OF CHILDREN:**

Parents must be registered in the parish and participate in a parent preparation class. A preparation session is held every other month. You must RSVP in advance; this can be done on our website or by calling the parish office.

#### **CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:**

Adults interested in becoming Catholic are always welcomed. For more information on the RCIA process, please visit our website or call the parish office.

#### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Couples planning to be married at St. Elizabeth must contact one of our parish priests before a wedding date is set and at least six months in advance. Participation in a preparation program is required.

#### **SICK CALLS:**

Please notify the parish office as soon as possible with information about anyone who is hospitalized, sick, or homebound and who may wish to be visited by a priest or a Eucharistic Minister.

#### SUPPORTING YOUR PARISH:

Secure automatic giving is provided to our parish through FaithDirect. Please visit www.faithdirect.net to enroll online, or call toll free (1-866-507-8757). Our parish code is MD19. (Note that enrollment in FaithDirect does NOT automatically register you in the parish. Please call the parish office for details.)

#### PARISH MEMBERSHIP:

We ask that if you wish to make this your parish home that you please fill out the online registration form by going to **stelizabethchurchmd.org/registration**. You must be registered to receive **certification letters of eligibility for baptism, to be married in the Church, to be a sponsor for confirmation, to be a godparent,** or to receive sacramental preparation. You should be registered to enroll in Saint Elizabeth School or the Religious Education Program. If you are over the age of 21 and have previously been registered as part of your parents' household, we ask that you register under your own name. We ask that you notify the parish office if your family status changes, including any contact information, or if you move out of the area.

#### MARYLAND BISHOPS ENCOURAGE USE OF COVID VACCINE

December 12, 2020 Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As the current pandemic continues to devastate families and communities, we must, as people of faith, continue to take necessary steps to protect the health and life of our families and communities, even when it is difficult or uncomfortable.

We are grateful to the clergy, religious and lay people in our parishes, schools, social service programs and health care facilities who have been providing ministry under very difficult circumstances, as well as the parishioners and parents who have made significant sacrifices to help protect public health.

We look with hope toward recent developments to produce effective and life-saving vaccines. We are heartened by the quick progress to date and look forward to working with federal, state and local government leaders to promote widespread vaccination against COVID-19 in the interests of protecting public health and human life.

In response to some questions about the source of the vaccines, we wish to provide some clarity regarding the ethical and moral status of COVID-19 vaccines. As a recent communication from the chairmen of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' pro-life and doctrine committees notes:

"Neither the Pfizer nor the Moderna vaccine involved the use of cell lines that originated in fetal tissue taken from the body of an aborted baby at any level of design, development, or production."

At the same time, they add, "They are not completely free from any connection to abortion, however, as both Pfizer and Moderna made use of a tainted cell line for one of the confirmatory lab tests of their products. There is thus a connection, but it is relatively remote."

Over a number of years, the Holy See has addressed the use of tainted vaccines and, as the chairmen write, "at the level of the recipient, it is morally permissible to accept vaccination when there are no alternatives and there is a serious risk to health."

Therefore, a Catholic can in good conscience receive these COVID-19 vaccines. Moreover, given the grave risk of harm to others, we strongly encourage the faithful to receive a vaccine against COVID, unless medically indicated otherwise. It is vitally important that the most vulnerable among us and those who are from communities that have been disproportionately impacted by COVID receive the vaccine swiftly. It also is imperative that pharmaceutical companies be urged to develop vaccines that fully respect the dignity of the human person at all stages.

This has been a difficult year. We mourn with all those who have lost loved ones. We pray for the faithful departed and for all those experiencing deep suffering, including illness, loss of employment, isolation, loneliness and anxiety. May the intercession of Mary, Health of the Sick, bring healing and comfort to our Catholic community. And may she draw us ever closer to her Son, the Divine Physician.



#### St. Elizabeth's Support for the St. Camillus Food Pantry

St. Elizabeth has a long standing relationship supporting the St. Camillus Food Pantry. When COVID-19 prevented our usual "first Sunday of the month" food collection for the Pantry (which averaged about 1,900 bags of groceries annually) we created a secure way to contribute financially to support St. Camillus through Faith Direct. This on-line giving has provided the pantry \$29,393 through December 2020. Individual parishioners have also provided direct financial support. This financial support from St. Elizabeth has been critical in helping the Pantry to cover the costs of purchasing huge quantities of food from several suppliers every week. The Pantry and its many volunteers are working tirelessly to meet a dramatic increase in the demand for food, e.g., 644 clients were served on the weekend before Christmas. (All clients receive ID cards which entitle them to come to the Pantry once a month.) Recent discussions with St. Camillus on resuming our parish food collections for the Pantry concluded that such collections are not now practical given severe storage/space constraints at the Pantry which make it difficult for them to manage such food donations. These have to sorted outside in the parking lot in all sorts of weather and stored in two cramped trailers with no shelving units. (A planned, but delayed until Spring, construction of a permanent free standing structure with shelves and electricity would greatly improve the Pantry's ability to manage large food donations such as St. Elizabeth provided in the past.) The Pantry still needs and relies on our assistance. If you already have a Faith Direct account, you can log in and add St. Camillus as a "One Time Gift" or add it as a part of a monthly recurring donation. If you do not have a Faith Direct account, you can get started by visiting faith.direct/MD19, or text Enroll to 301-888-6290. 


