



#### **BAPTISM OF CHILDREN:**

Parents must be registered in the parish and participate in a parent preparation class. A preparation session is held every other month. You must RSVP in advance; this can be done on our website or by calling the parish office.

#### **CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:**

Adults interested in becoming Catholic are always welcomed. For more information on the RCIA process, please visit our website or call the parish office.

#### **SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Couples planning to be married at St. Elizabeth must contact one of our parish priests before a wedding date is set and at least six months in advance. Participation in a preparation program is required.

#### **SICK CALLS:**

Please notify the parish office as soon as possible with information about anyone who is hospitalized, sick, or homebound and who may wish to be visited by a priest or a Eucharistic Minister.

#### SUPPORTING YOUR PARISH:

Secure automatic giving is provided to our parish through FaithDirect. Please visit www.faithdirect.net to enroll online, or call toll free (1-866-507-8757). Our parish code is MD19. (Note that enrollment in FaithDirect does NOT automatically register you in the parish. Please call the parish office for details.)

#### PARISH MEMBERSHIP:

We ask that if you wish to make this your parish home that you please fill out the online registration form by going to **stelizabethchurchmd.org/registration**. You must be registered to receive **certification letters of eligibility for baptism, to be married in the Church, to be a sponsor for confirmation, to be a godparent,** or to receive sacramental preparation. You should be registered to enroll in Saint Elizabeth School or the Religious Education Program. If you are over the age of 21 and have previously been registered as part of your parents' household, we ask that you register under your own name. We ask that you notify the parish office if your family status changes, including any contact information, or if you move out of the area.

Dear St. E's parish family,

This week we will celebrate the legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and inaugurate President Biden. As we do so, let us pray for an end to division, hatred, violence, and bigotry in our nation and for a smooth and peaceful transition of power at all levels of our government.

Below is the text of my homily from last Sunday, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which is the official end of the Christmas season. My basic point is that Christmas is God's perfect answer to the world's injustice and political unrest. I hope and pray that as a parish we will continue to live this answer well and bring healing and hope to our fractured world.

Christmas, day 17 of 17 days of the Christmas season this year. The official finale. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. I know it doesn't really feel like Christmas this late in the season, especially in a pandemic after the horrendous attack on the Capitol on Wednesday. Christmas feels very, very far away.

Yet Christmas seems to me to be God's perfect answer to what's wrong with our politics, though we don't usually think in those terms. Let me try to explain.

First, what's wrong with our politics? Have you noticed how both ends of our political spectrum are working from the same basic pattern? Oh, they disagree passionately, even violently, about the issues. But whether we're talking about storming the Capitol because of a stolen election or storming federal buildings because of racial injustice, the same basic three-step pattern emerges:

- The pattern starts with a collective belief that we on our side are victims of grave injustice. Let's leave the validity of this belief aside for now. The fact is that over the past year on polar-opposite sides of our political spectrum, millions of people believe that people on our side are victims of grave injustices perpetrated by people who are not on our side.
- The next step in the pattern is the belief that the system is broken our institutions have failed. This belief is deeply, passionately held, though it tends to be based on information that is incomplete, debatable or outright wrong.

• Then there's the final, most dangerous step in the pattern: violence. Burn it down. Force the people who did this to take us seriously. This violence feels justified, even necessary in order to gain what is rightly ours.

This is a very ancient pattern – the pattern of war and insurrection that is as old as humanity itself – a pattern of tribal hatred and violent struggle for power that is magnified today by social media. *Step one*: we're victims of a grave injustice perpetrated by that other tribe. *Step two:* the system is broken. Throughout history there's generally enough truth in these first two steps that step three is inevitable: our tribe will use the violence necessary to gain what is rightly ours.

What does any of this have to do with Christmas? Christmas breaks this ancient pattern in our relationship with God. On one side of the relationship is tribe Trinity of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. On the other side is the tribe of all humanity. Steps one and two are already familiar:

*First:* Tribe Trinity is the victim of the grave injustice of tribe humanity's sin.

**Second:** The system is broken by our sin. It is inescapably corrupt and incapable of remedying our injustice. We cannot restore tribe Trinity's plan. We cannot save ourselves.

If ever in the history of the world any tribe was justified in resorting to violence, it would have been tribe Trinity crushing tribe humanity for our sins. Tribe Trinity had every right to the violence of a great flood or the all-consuming fire of a super nova.

But God does *not* restore justice through violence. Instead God restores justice slowly, gently, patiently as the prophet Isaiah prophesied in today's first reading:

...not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street; a bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench, until he establishes justice on the earth...

That's the Incarnation of the Christ. That's Christmas, which is God's perfect answer to our ancient pattern of tribal violence. God's Word is born to us: conceived by a virgin, born in a stable, a carpenter's son, baptized by his cousin. Today this Word is born anew

in the Church Jesus founded, in our prayer, in our service, especially as the Eucharist. Why? To restore justice through mercy, not violence. To save us through a loving personal relationship with God that is only possible through the Incarnation of the Christ.

So yes, today is Christmas. In an era of political violence and pandemic, the Christ is born to us so that we might bear him out into the world to break the pattern of tribal violence and heal and save all that can be healed and saved. More than our politics and philosophies and worldly power, Christmas is humanity's hope.

Merry Christmas.

#### **Bereavement Support Group**

St. Elizabeth Bereavement Ministry will offer a seven week bereavement support group series for adults 18 and over who have experienced the death of a parent, spouse or significant other. Because of the current Covid19 pandemic participants will be able to attend the sessions from the comfort and privacy of their own homes using our ZOOM format. This winter series will be held on Thursday evenings, 7–8:30 PM, from January 14 – February 25, 2021. There is no fee but registration is required. Space is limited to 10 participants so call early. #### St. Elizabeth's Support for the St. Camillus Food Pantry

St. Elizabeth has a long standing relationship supporting the St. Camillus Food Pantry. When COVID-19 prevented our usual "first Sunday of the month" food collection for the Pantry (which averaged about 1,900 bags of groceries annually) we created a secure way to contribute financially to support St. Camillus through Faith Direct. This on-line giving has provided the pantry \$29,393 through December 2020. Individual parishioners have also provided direct financial support. This financial support from St. Elizabeth has been critical in helping the Pantry to cover the costs of purchasing huge quantities of food from several suppliers every week. The Pantry and its many volunteers are working tirelessly to meet a dramatic increase in the demand for food, e.g., 644 clients were served on the weekend before Christmas. (All clients receive ID cards which entitle them to come to the Pantry once a month.) Recent discussions with St. Camillus on resuming our parish food collections for the Pantry concluded that such collections are not now practical given severe storage/space constraints at the Pantry which make it difficult for them to manage such food donations. These have to sorted outside in the parking lot in all sorts of weather and stored in two cramped trailers with no shelving units. (A planned, but delayed until Spring, construction of a permanent free standing structure with shelves and electricity would greatly improve the Pantry's ability to manage large food donations such as St. Elizabeth provided in the past.) The Pantry still needs and relies on our assistance. If you already have a Faith Direct account, you can log in and add St. Camillus as a "One Time Gift" or add it as a part of a monthly recurring donation. If you do not have a Faith Direct account, you can get started by visiting faith.direct/MD19, or text Enroll to 301-888-6290. 
