Mid-Winter/Year Reminders

As a means to keep our students *safe*, *respectful* and *responsible* (our SAINT JAMES KNIGHTS expectations for everyone,) we periodically take time to review procedures. We will be doing so this week at several of our morning prayer gatherings.

To that end, we will also spend some space in this newsletter, outlining safety procedures and practices we have in place at school as well as reminding parents of certain safety expectations for them. By working together, we can feel confident that we are providing our children the safest and most secure environment possible.

AT SCHOOL...

- All doors directly accessing the school are locked throughout the school day. This includes the doors which separate the church from the school AND all outside entrances to the school.
- Students are under the supervision of a school employee at all times. This includes escorting students to and from special classes that meet in the basement of Tobin Hall.
- The doors to the basement classrooms are locked while students are in them.
- Every room in the school and every office throughout the Saint James campus have telephone access.
- School personnel will not release students to anyone who does not have authorization to pick them up. Even if the student *seems* to know the individual picking them up, unless we have a name on file or verbal or written permission, we will NOT release the student.

ARRIVAL & DROP OFF EXPECTATIONS FOR PARENTS & STUDENTS...

- For their safety, students **should not** arrive at school before 8:00 a.m. Doors to the school building do not open until 7:50 a.m. IF students arrive before that time they are NOT supervised and will need to wait in the breezeway entrance between the outside doors and the school lobby doors. Early arrivals will be permitted to wait in the lobby and will be supervised by staff beginning at 7:50 a.m.
- With the exception of preschool parents, parents are asked to NOT escort their children to their classrooms. Parents or caregivers of K-5th grade students should drop their children off in the school lobby. The supervising adult will dismiss these students beginning at 8:05 a.m. This insures that no adult other than school personnel has access to the building beyond the preschool rooms where parents sign their children in upon arrival.
- The drop off lane for students is the north side of 2nd Street directly in front of the school. This is a moving lane. At no time should a driver get out of the vehicle to assist their child. If the child needs assistance, the car should be parked in the lot on the south side of 2nd Street.
- If, for some reason, a parent needs to enter the building during drop off, s/he should park their vehicle in the parking lot and use the crosswalk to cross the street, especially in the event that a child accompanies them.
- Parents should drop their children off for school on the north side of 2nd Street with the child exiting the vehicle on the curb side of the street NOT the street side. Students should NOT be dropped off on the south side of 2nd Street.

DISMISSAL & PICK UP EXPECTATIONS FOR PARENTS & STUDENTS...

- School is dismissed at 3 p.m. Students are escorted out of the building by school personnel for car, yellow bus and mini-bus pick-up at the conclusion of afternoon prayers.
- The pick up lane for students is the north side of 2nd Street directly in front of the school (same as the drop off lane) between the white post in front of the school and the church driveway. This is a moving lane.
- At no time should a driver in the pick up lane get out of the vehicle. If the child needs assistance getting in and out of the car, it should be parked in the lot on the south side of 2nd Street where parents can easily assist their children.
- Students will be allowed to board a car from the curb side of the north side of 2nd Street ONLY
- After your child has boarded the vehicle, a car is free to pull out to leave ONLY when that car has no other cars in line in front of it. This is necessary in order to avoid accidents.
- Students need to be escorted by a parent in order to cross the street and need to do so at a crosswalk.
- We will not permit students to cross the driveway to meet a parent vehicle, therefore cars in line along this side of the street will need to wait their turn to pick up their child in front of Tobin Hall and the school.
- No cars should park along the south side of West 2nd Street or along N. Ave E to pick up children.

One more word about safety for parents...

A recent internet scare causing great concern for parents is Momo. To be truthful, I don't know that much about it but am in communication with local technology experts to insure our internet safety. In the meantime, I am providing a publication from *Boys Town* containing some prudent guidelines for internet use at home.

TIPS for PARENTS

- 1. Become computer literate and be actively involved in your children's online experiences.
- 2. Place computers in high-traffic areas, not a child's room.
- 3. Use screening software.
- 4. Read unfamiliar e-mails. Monitor telephone and modem changes. Check out unfamiliar phone numbers and e-mail addresses.
- 5. Don't allow children to spend long periods of time on the computer, especially at night.
- 6. Help children understand that online users may not be who they claim to be or who they seem to be. Get to know your children's Internet friends.
- 7. Tell children to report anything they come across online that seems strange or makes them uncomfortable especially if they are ever asked personal questions or invited to personal meetings.
- 8. Tell children to report to you suggestive, obscene or threatening e-mail or bulletin board messages. Forward copies to your ISP (Internet Service Provider) and insist they help deal with the problem.
- 9. Be concerned if children mention adults you don't know, become sensitive, or appear to have inappropriate sexual knowledge.
- 10. Post the Internet Safety Rules for Kids by your computer.

RULES for KIDS

- 1. Never give out personal information, such as your name, address, school name or address, or parents' or teachers' names or addresses.
- 2. Never create online profiles.
- 3. Never visit chat rooms or join an IRC (Internet Relay Chat) without permission.
- 4. Never go to private chat rooms or meet online friends in a private online setting.
- 5. Never go to new Web sites without permission.
- 6. Never respond to rude or offensive e-mail, instant messages or postings.
- 7. Never post, send or receive pictures (usually files that end with GI, jpg, jpeg, or tiff).
- 8. Never meet online friends in person without a parent present.

Dear St. James School Families,

The 2019-20 St. James School Scholarship Application and the STO Application are now available. Every family is invited and encouraged to complete these scholarship applications.

<u>St. James School Scholarships</u> are considered for all applicants that express a need. Financial need is not the only factor considered. Family size, active parish membership, personal circumstances, and volunteerism are all a part of the confidential application process. We are interested in knowing what motivates you to choose St. James School for your child.

School scholarship awards can reach as high as \$1000.00 per student. Last year, we were successful in providing financial support for EVERY family that completed an application. If your children are enjoying St. James School, then our goal is to find a financial arrangement that works for you.

Applications are due May 15, 2019.

<u>STO Applications</u> (School Tuition Organization of Southeast Iowa) are due no later than April 15, 2019. This application requires that you include a copy of your 2018 Federal Tax Return. Qualifying individuals are K-12 students who live in an Iowa household and whose income falls into the guidelines outlined at www.stoseiowa.org. Based on eligibility, your family may receive an award that covers a majority of your tuition bill. Please consider applying for an STO scholarship, the awards can be amazing!!

St. James School is eligible to receive over \$60,000.00 in STO funds in 2019-20 for qualifying families!!!

Please don't let financial concerns stop you from choosing St. James School for your children. If you are committed to having your student attend St. James School, then we are committed to finding a way to make that happen. Questions?  to all individuals who live in the same dwelling place, regardless of age, legal relationship, or dependency status.
 Your household may include different people than those in your family.
