<u>Sacrament of Baptism</u>: Expectant parents must attend our Baptism Preparation Program which is offered monthly. Baptism is the first and most important Sacrament as it introduces us to the Faith. Baptisms are offered on the **First Sunday** of the month at the **11:30am Mass** and immediately following. Call the Parish Office to schedule a baptism and to make arrangements to attend our Baptism Program.

<u>Sacrament of Marriage</u>: Arrangements should be made well in advance of an intended marriage, at least six months and even up to a year prior. Please call the Parish Office to arrange an appointment with the Pastor. Attendance at the Marriage Preparation Program is required.

<u>Sick and Hospital Visits:</u> Please let the Parish Office know if you have a family member who is ill at home or in the hospital so we may add them to our prayer list and arrange, if appropriate, for visits from our Homebound Ministry and the Pastor.

Other Gods

We believe in one God. But it wasn't always that way. At the time of Moses, people believed in many gods. There were gods who governed the weather, gods who controlled illnesses, and gods who inspired the arts. But we believe in one God, the source of all creation and the sustainer of all that is good.

The first commandment asked people to stop offering allegiance to other gods. It asserted the supreme authority of the one God who led them out of slavery and promised them a new land.

When we review the Ten Commandments, we usually skip over number one. We don't believe in other gods. It's two through ten that cause problems. We curse and swear. We skip church on Sundays. We disobey. We destroy life, even human life. We commit adultery. We steal and we lie. We covet everything about our neighbor's possessions and family. We sin a lot on two through ten. But we believe in one God.

Or do we? Do we substitute other gods? Do we prefer possessions, selfish pleasures, and the esteem of others more than we prefer allegiance to the one God? That first commandment may be the root of all our sin.

Modeling good choices. Parents have the biggest impact on forming children's consciences. The process begins when children start developing attachments. Children start to imitate the mannerisms, speech, and habits of trusted adults. It is important that they see our faith in our actions.

Experience is a powerful teacher. If parents are attentive, respectful, and murturing to a child, she learns

to internalize these characteristics as the way to relate to others. For example, attending to a child's emotion pain will teach remorse when she causes others pain. Invest active time in children, foster a sense of belonging, and communicate love.

Accountability is loving parents holding

children responsible for their own decisions. When confronted by their bad behavior, youngsters may try to shift blame, refuse to acknowledge or follow rules, or attempt to avoid consequences. Set standards, give consequences, and follow through.




Why do we fast?

Find renewal during Lent

When choosing Lenten observances, children are inclined to give too much or too little. For example, "I'll give up playing video games for the entire season!" or "I'll give up green vegetables that I don't like." Yet, Lent isn't just about sacrifice. This is also a time to make changes that will bring us closer to God and give Him a central place in our family life.

Practice gratitude, Gratitude helps to keep everything in perspective. Encourage children to share what they count as Make Sunday about God. If you have to choose between sports and Sunday Mass, choose Mass. Resolve to make sure the Eucharist and Mass come before anything else.

Spend time with your family. In a pandemic, alone time may be what keeps us sane. Yet, family time is critical to forming healthy families. Try to find ways to spend more time together. Read books, tell stories, draw pictures. Make the good times overwhelm the bad.

The more often we remember, the more it will help us recall that Jesus was human, too, and experienced what we feel – and so much more. If we offer him our suffering and remember his, it makes our pain easier to bear.

Every day our frustrations, our fears, our loneliness and temptations can become ways in which we share in the suffering and death of Christ, Likowise, our joys, our good health, our family and friends are all important ways to share in the joy of his Resurrection. The point is to offer everything to

Christ.

What can a parent do?
Suffering is part of life. Yet,
disciples of Jesus can have
the same attitude toward
suffering as he did, and we
can also share in his joy of the

Resurrection. When children are hurt, sad, or scared, help them remember to turn to Jesus because he wants to comfort them with his great love.
