How will we ever get people to come back to church? This has been the question many of you have asked yourselves and others since the lockdown forced us perhaps to become too accustomed to sleeping in on Sunday mornings, tuning online into the parish or other Masses at our own convenience, or sadly, skipping Mass altogether. As you know, Bishop Zurek announced several weeks ago that the dispensation from obligatory Mass attendance in our diocese is coming to an end next weekend, May 22-23, The Solemnity of Pentecost. Hopefully, we'll all come back because we recognize that we cannot be fully alive in Christ without hearing God's Word, receiving the nourishment of the Holy Eucharist, and joining ourselves together as the Body of Christ by our presence with one another at weekly Mass. On the other hand, sometimes being nudged and/or compelled to come to Mass by obedience to the Commandments and deference to Catholic obligation can hold us in the right place when our mere feelings try to convince us that they're more important than the Way, the Truth, and the Life. As we come back to Mass, let us rejoice in the gift and the opportunity! Let us also reach out to our fellow parishioners, neighbors, family, and friends to urge them to get back to church with us. Each of us is an evangelizer and thus called to help one another to continue on and/or return to the path of holiness in Christ.

So how are we going to do this? Even as I write this, the CDC has just made a new announcement that those who have been vaccinated should feel safe

and free to not wear masks in most indoor and outdoor events, with some exceptions. As the situation continues to change, please note how our parish of St. Ann 's intends to proceed for now:

\*Masks for adults are still strongly encouraged at parish Masses and events.

\*Starting next weekend, we will have our overflow space in the parish hall open for the Sunday 9 a.m. Mass with social distancing for those who are concerned and want to play it safer than the guidelines indicate. This will continue until further notice.

\*We will continue to reserve the back southwest corner of the church for social distancing until further notice.

\*We will continue to be kind and loving to one another, choosing first and foremost to love our fellow parishioners who are vulnerable, cautious, and have experienced firsthand the virus's devastating effects and thus wish to remain as careful as possible until things are more assuredly safe.

Thank you again for choosing to come together in this time rather than to allow a virus and the various understandings and misunderstanding of the virus to separate and divide us. You're doing well, St. Ann's!

Please remember that I'll be away from the parish this week to attend my nephew's graduation from Washington University School of Law in St. Louis. Please call the parish office if you have any need and thank you for your understanding that a good ole' fashioned getaway can be good for the body, mind, and soul.

## **MEMORIAL TO THE UNBORN**



Another component of our Memorial to the Unborn was added this week. A display case on the southwest corner of the church building will house a list of names of unborn children who died before birth but continue to intercede for us in heaven. More of our fellow parishioners than we imagine have suffered the sadness of miscarriage. We don't want to forget these precious souls who changed their parents' lives forever and wish for a place where their names can be written and their short lives acknowledged. If you would like to have your child remembered at our Memorial to the Unborn, please watch for bulletin and pulpit announcements the next several weeks for the plan and format. We recognize of course that the loss of an unborn child is private and want to avoid any pressure to participate. Pray about the possibility and continue to be salved by God's parental grace.

After 658.75 volunteer hours from over 40 people, the project is finally drawing to a close. Over \$25,000 was contributed monetary and in-kind donations for the project. This is very impressive.

This project wouldn't have been possible without the time, advice, service, and donations of the St. Ann's Parishioners, St. Ann's Knights of Columbus, Fr. ### FROM THE BISHOP'S DESK

# BEFORE LIFTING THE DISPENSATION FROM THE OBLIGATION TO PERSONALLY PARTICIPATE IN SUNDAY MASS PART III

"The people devoted themselves to the teaching of the Apostles, **to the communal life**, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers (of the Apostles)." (Acts 2:42)

This coming together of the faithful is the foundation, the manifestation and the confirmation of all Christian practices, from prayer, to works of charity and the concrete example of Christian love for one another, especially the poor. This communal celebration of the Eucharist is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and his Body, the Church. All are strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit.

This unity of the Mystical Body is strengthened through our coming together as the one Body of Christ in the world. As pope St. John Paul II, wrote in one of his Encyclicals "The Eucharist makes the Church, and the Church makes the Eucharist." At this coming together, we not only experience the joy of physically being with each other and supporting and encouraging each other in the Faith, those who come and receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. Through this communion Christ unites them to all the faithful in one body—the Church. Communion renews, strengthens and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved in Baptism.

After the celebration of the Easter Vigil and again after one of the morning Masses at the Cathedral I experienced what this 'coming together' means for the faithful believer. People not only greeted each other with 'Happy Easter!' but they did it with exuberant joy! They also exclaimed 'What joy the Lord has given us in his dying and rising; yes, we will all die, but now we have the 'great hope' of our own resurrection! We, too, will live forever with Christ!

It has been a long time since we have experienced a normal existence here on our beloved planet. However, slowly, but surely, we are returning to a more normal way of life, Many parishioners may not have been able to personally attend and participate in the celebration of Holy Mass because of the pandemic. Surely many have longed with a deep desire to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. We priests have longed for the day when the Churches will again be filled with the faithful. Now the time has come
