

ST. CECILIA PARISH & SCHOOL: INCOME, EXPENSES & FACILITIES

Church - Year Ended June 30, 2020

- Annual offertory was 91% of prior year. For reference, fourth quarter (Apr-Jun 2020) offertory was 75% of prior year.
- The \$112K reduction in offertory accounts for almost all of the change in net income from the prior year.
- A PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) loan was received in April 2020 which has allowed us to maintain current staffing. Loan forgiveness application has been submitted. There is no profit and loss impact until forgiveness is determined.
- Your Lenten offerings were distributed to St. Vincent de Paul (\$6,500), Social Concerns (\$2,000), our partner parish, St. Alexander Church in Cornelius (\$1,100), and Emergency fund (\$946).

Facilities:

 In early August 2020, a water pipe leak resulted in significant damage to the north side of the parish center. Thankfully, insurance covered all of the expense after the deductible. The repair process has been slow but should be completed by mid-December.

- Total income was \$13K higher than budget as a few more students enrolled.
- Due to the school closure with the pandemic, expenses were lower than budget.
- The net income from operations was added to the STAR fund and an additional \$30K was used for financial aid to school families financially impacted by the pandemic.

Facilities

- Added a transitional kindergarten classroom across the hall from the current kindergarten classroom adding a bathroom and sink.
- Many PPE and disinfecting items were purchased for the safe use of the school by the students in the current school year.

MINISTRY TO THE HOMEBOUND COMMUNION VISITORS

Once upon a time, nine months ago, we had an active ministry visiting our Homebound and/or Sick parishioners who could not join us in the celebration of Mass. We represented the Face of the Church, weekly, with love, conversation, friendship, news and, most importantly, the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Covid brought about the lock down of all senior living facilities. These beautiful people have been denied family, friends, all group activities, communal dining, or any face-to-face contact. Of course, our Communion Services have been denied too.

Over the months, we have been allowed infrequent services: outside, masks and social distancing; indoors, five people or less, masks and social distancing; through a window, masks and social distancing; to one-on-one, masks and social distancing. At a few places, Communion Visitors take the Eucharist to a qualified, trained resident who conducts a service. Those residents are now doing one-on-ones outside the door of each room. We are reaching a very small percentage, five-six percent of the ministry.

Good News: Not one shut in has been diagnosed with Covid!

Bad News; Many staff personnel have been diagnosed, so staff changes often!

BE REASSURED: Communion Visitors will never give up! We will fight for every Catholic's right to receive the Body of Christ. Pray for that day to come soon.

Robert, like many of our volunteers, showed up each time and were just glad to help. Getting to know Robert a little bit, we realized he had been hit like many others from job loss and sudden home schooling.

Last Monday, we were able to pull together a few donated items to help Robert and his family have a Christmas dinner and a little cheer. Robert was over joyed (his indescribable joy will forever bring a smile to my face) by the canned oranges.

In my short time at St. Cecilia's, the joy people get from just being a part of a community by volunteering is priceless.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL (SVDP)

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor." Is 61:1 (Lk 4:18) St. Vincent de Paul volunteers have been diligently at work, throughout the Covid-19 pandemic, to ease the burdens of the poor and share the 'Good News of Jesus Christ'.

A Parish-wide campaign, working with St. Vincent de Paul, successfully shared monetary donations totaling \$24,823 with Our Lady of the Mountain Parish, Ashland and Sacred Heart Parish, Medford to aid in the wildfire relief. All of the proceeds went to the affiliated St. Vincent de Paul Societies in Southern Oregon to ease the burden in the communities devastated by fires.

Last year, our St. Cecilia-St. Vincent group served 2,331 families; distributed 330,531 pounds of food; assisted with \$28,096 rent and \$15,752 in utility payments; in total, serving 15,283 individuals. Volunteers gave a total of 12,150 hours of service to this community of St. Cecilia Parish. During the year, we added Jesuit High School and Valley Catholic student volunteers, two parish staff members, and a seminarian, who helped us over the summer months when volunteers were in short supply. On November 21, Girl Scout Troop 45084 collected more than 3,500 pounds of canned goods; the December 5 Boy Scouts (Packs 383 & 872) food drive brought in almost 3,000 pounds of canned goods. The Backpack program, working with local schools, helped 1,371 students and families. During the spring and summer months, St. Vincent de Paul assisted to distribute produce and Farm to Family food boxes after hours on Fridays to local families.

FAITH CAFÉ

With all the restrictions regarding social distancing, Faith Café has not been able to operate at all in doors. But, that doesn't stop them from serving a meal to our neighbors.

Each Sunday, meals are given out to about 50 folks who come to the Bethel Church for assistance. The bagged meals of sandwiches, fresh produce, snacks, drinks, etc. are prepared by the same church groups as before this pandemic and are served outside. During the cooler weather, a hot entrée is often served in takeout containers instead of the sandwich bags.

The number of volunteers has been greatly reduced so only two folks from each church volunteer in the kitchen, and the Faith Café board members do the serving. Our volunteers, Marika & Karen, have done a marvelous job in preparing the entrée in a timely manner. We greatly appreciate their service.

We are patiently waiting for the time when our entire volunteer crew will be able to once again welcome the guests, prepare the meal, serve with a smile and then cleanup at the end.

2020 has been a year filled with changes - some have been difficult, but with faith and hope, we know the will of God will be done. We thank your staff for continued financial support. Your parishioners have responded whenever we have expressed a need, and their response is greatly appreciated. Our guests tell us every week how much it means to them that Faith Café is still in operation. We could not do it without you. Your partnership through this past year has meant so much to us.



Dear Third, Fourth and Fifth Grade Families,

Happy Thanksgiving! We hope this finds you healthy and thankful for the blessings in our lives during this turbulent year. Service is a part of our mission at St. Cecilia School, and students in the Intermediate grades are a great age to share their time and talents with others as we prepare our hearts for the upcoming celebration of Christ's birth. Social distancing has made that a little more challenging this year, so we are grateful that a service opportunity has presented itself, and we are excited to share it with you!



A 2012 St. Cecilia alum, Joseph Fulitano, was active in the Iowa National Guard for the past 3 years. He graduated from the University of Iowa this spring, attended Basic Training at Ft. Benning in Georgia this summer, and is currently stationed in Qatar. We will be working in the classrooms to make Christmas cards for his troop, and would also like to send a care package from each of the Intermediate grade levels. Below is a list of small items that have been recommended to send overseas. The students do not need to bring in an item, but this

opportunity is available for those that do wish to contribute.

Qatar is entering into the season of winter, just like we are, so temperatures will be closer to 80 degrees each day, rather than 100 degrees. We have been advised not to send Christmas chocolates, but other candies that are individually wrapped will travel well.



Recommended small items: Beef Jerky * Protein bars * hard Pretzels * Hard candy (individually wrapped in a larger bag) * Chex Mix * Trail Mix *

Dried Fruit * Peanuts or Mixed Nuts (salted is preferred) * travel size Baby Wipes * travel size Hand Sanitizer * Body wash * Liquid Soap * Sunblock * Magazines

If you are fortunate to know the Fulitano family from St. Cecilia Parish, you know they are a beautiful family with strong service connections to their community and country. The Third, Fourth and Fifth grade service project this year is a great opportunity for the students to celebrate a small group of the men and women who are stationed overseas, and we are happy to use Joseph as our contact point!

Please be sure to send any items that children wish to contribute by Friday, December 4th. We wish to send our packages as soon as possible in order to have them arrive in Qatar by Christmas. Thank you for helping to actively demonstrate our theme for this year, "Do Small Things With Great Love!"





Han visto la gran importancia de no perder el entusiasmo por la fe y por server a otros, aunque las maneras de hacerlo han tenido que cambiar. Mucha oración, incluyendo EL ROSARIO, se está haciendo por teléfono para alentar y apoyar a los que están sufriendo el impacto de la pandemia de una manera más fuerte.

The Hispanic GOOD SAMARITAN MINISTRY GROUP has continued to be very active in spite of the pandemic. Seeing urgent needs both here and elsewhere, they have used the income from THE SALE OF EMPTY POP CANS deposited at the church by parishioners to extend assistance as far away as Chiapas, Mexico.

The accompanying pictures show some of the beautiful ways this money has helped families living in very poor communities, usually in isolated rural areas. Both food and household supplies as well as shoes for the children are very welcome. So, too, was the assistance to a family whose roof was damaged and leaking profusely; and a cement walkway built for an elderly lady living alone who was always in danger of falling in the mud and hurting herself during the rainy season when she needed to leave the house and come down the hill.

MANY THANKS to all who continue to bring their bags of bottles and cans by the church and leave them in the passage behind the office. The money is being put to excellent use.
