- (2) **Altar Server:** Available for 4th graders and older, these volunteers serve and assist at the altar during the Mass.
- (3) **Usher/Greeter:** Welcomes parishioners and visitors. Helps with seating, collection and Communion flow during Mass. (Usually serves once or twice a month)
- (4) **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion:** Distributes the Body and Blood of Christ during Mass.
- (5) **Flower Committee:** Prepares floral arrangements for the weekends and feasts of the Church. (Usually serves once a month)
