
The Greatest Commandment: Love the Lord your God with all your Heart, Soul, Strength, and your neighbor as yourself. (Luke 12:27)

Pier had a genuine love for God that came from his prayer life and devotion to the Eucharist and Mary, his <u>greatest loves</u>. He would often spend whole nights in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. He attended Mass daily. Prayer was central to his day.

Plan some time for you and your family to pray together this summer— pray a rosary together for a special intention, attend a daily Mass during the week, participate in an evening of prayer at the First Friday Adoration, read and pray through the Sunday's Gospel, pray the <u>novena</u> to Bl. Pier Giorgio.



We can love God with our soul and strength when we devote our whole physical existence to God, offering our entire being in effort to love God and our neighbor as ourselves.

Pier taught us that there is time for all—studies, family, friends, sports, service to others, and prayer. He did all his everyday, normal life activities with joy and with the intention to bring Christ to everyone he met. While hiking he and his friends prayed the rosary, and while studying at the university he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society to meet and serve the poor.



Pier had a heart for the poor. He lived his life for others, and saw Christ in those he served. He said "Jesus visits me every morning in Communion. I return his visit by visiting the poor."

Read the story of the Good Samaritan (Lk 12: 29-37) together as a family and discuss ways you and your family members can better love everyone that you meet—at your work, school, teams, etc. — especially those hardest to love.
