



St. Oliver Plunkett | July 1

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift

locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.

In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.


VIVIR LA LITURGIA - INSPIRACIÓN DE LA SEMANA

Dios nos llama en medio de las cosas ordinarias. A menudo, solo buscando a Dios en lo dramático, espectacular, el ritual o los lugares sagrados, nos perdemos que Él está caminando a nuestro lado. En cada momento de cada día, en cada circunstancia y experiencia, Dios nos está llamando: "Sígueme". A veces, estamos demasiado distraídos para escuchar esta llamada. Otras veces, preferimos ignorarlo o fingir que no se escuchó. Dios, sin embargo, es muy persistente. Ya sea que sintonicemos nuestra audición para recibir esta invitación ahora o cuando cerremos los ojos en la muerte, debemos tomar una decisión. La elección implica dejar algunas cosas atrás y seguir adelante, asumiendo riesgos. Al elegir mantenernos enfocados y decididos, el lente que usamos para ver nuestro mundo y los demás es de Dios, no el nuestro. La vida ya no se trata de lo que es importante o me importa a mí, sino de lo que le importa a Dios. Adquirimos un nuevo filtro y se nos pide que lo usemos para tomar decisiones, establecer prioridades y determinar qué dirección tomaremos y cómo amar. Una vez que aceptamos la invitación de Dios, no podemos seguir mirando hacia atrás a lo que se quedó, solo hacia las sorpresas que están por venir.

San Oliver Plunkett | 1 de julio

San Oliver Plunkett fue el último mártir católico romano en morir en Inglaterra. Fue canonizado en 1975, el primer nuevo santo irlandés en casi 700 años. Oliver nació en Loughcrew, Oldcastle, condado de Meath en noviembre de 1625, hijo del barón de Loughcrew. Cuando era joven, quería ser sacerdote, pero era ilegal viajar al continente para ingresar al seminario. Aun así, emprendió el peligroso viaje con otros cuatro jóvenes y un enviado papal. Fueron perseguidos por corsarios ingleses, tormentas en el mar y ladrones en tierra. Sin embargo, Oliver entró en Roma en 1647 y fue admitido en el Irish College. Fue un excelente estudiante y fue ordenado el 1 de enero de 1654. Oliver permaneció en Roma, estudió derecho y se desempeñó como capellán en la Universidad de Spienza, ministró en el hospital Santo Spirito y atendió a los pobres y enfermos. Hacia 1657 era profesor de Teología y más tarde de Apologética o Controversias en Propaganda College. La década de 1650 fue una época difícil para los católicos en Irlanda, la mayoría de la población, ya que Cromwell aprobó muchas leyes penales contra ellos y se prohibió la práctica del catolicismo. Durante este tiempo, Oliver fue designado por los obispos irlandeses para ser su agente en Roma. Después de la Restauración de la Monarquía, el Papa Clemente IX nombró a Oliver Arzobispo de Armagh y Primado de toda Irlanda en 1669. Oliver regresó a un país donde la Iglesia Católica estaba en desorden y dividida. Tuvo que viajar en gran parte de incógnito y realizar sus funciones en improvisados ubicaciones. Se le atribuye haber unificado la Iglesia y haber viajado por las once diócesis bajo su competencia, confirmando a miles y ordenando a varios sacerdotes. En 1673, la persecución de los católicos volvió a aumentar y los obispos fueron prohibidos. Oliver pasó a la clandestinidad, pero en 1679 fue arrestado y acusado de traición. Fue ahorcado, dibujado y descuartizado en Tyburn en julio de 1681. Antes de su muerte, perdonó públicamente a los responsables.



Vicar General and Chancellor

Question:

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

Answer:

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.
