<u>RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF</u> ADULTS

The RCIA is a process by which adults, continuing on their journey of faith, are fully initiated into the life of the Catholic Church. Participants may include: Those who have never been baptized (Catechumens). Those baptized in another faith tradition (Candidates). Baptized Catholics who have not received other sacraments or instruction in the faith.

The goal of initiation is not simply to receive the sacraments but discipleship in Jesus Christ. The whole parish is responsible for the RCIA through their prayer, witness and attention given to Catechumens and Candidates. In this way the Church fulfills Jesus' mandate to proclaim the Good News of God's salvation to all people and baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Please call the parish office to register.

This program has begun and runs weekly on Wednesdays from 7-8:30 p.m. All are welcome!
