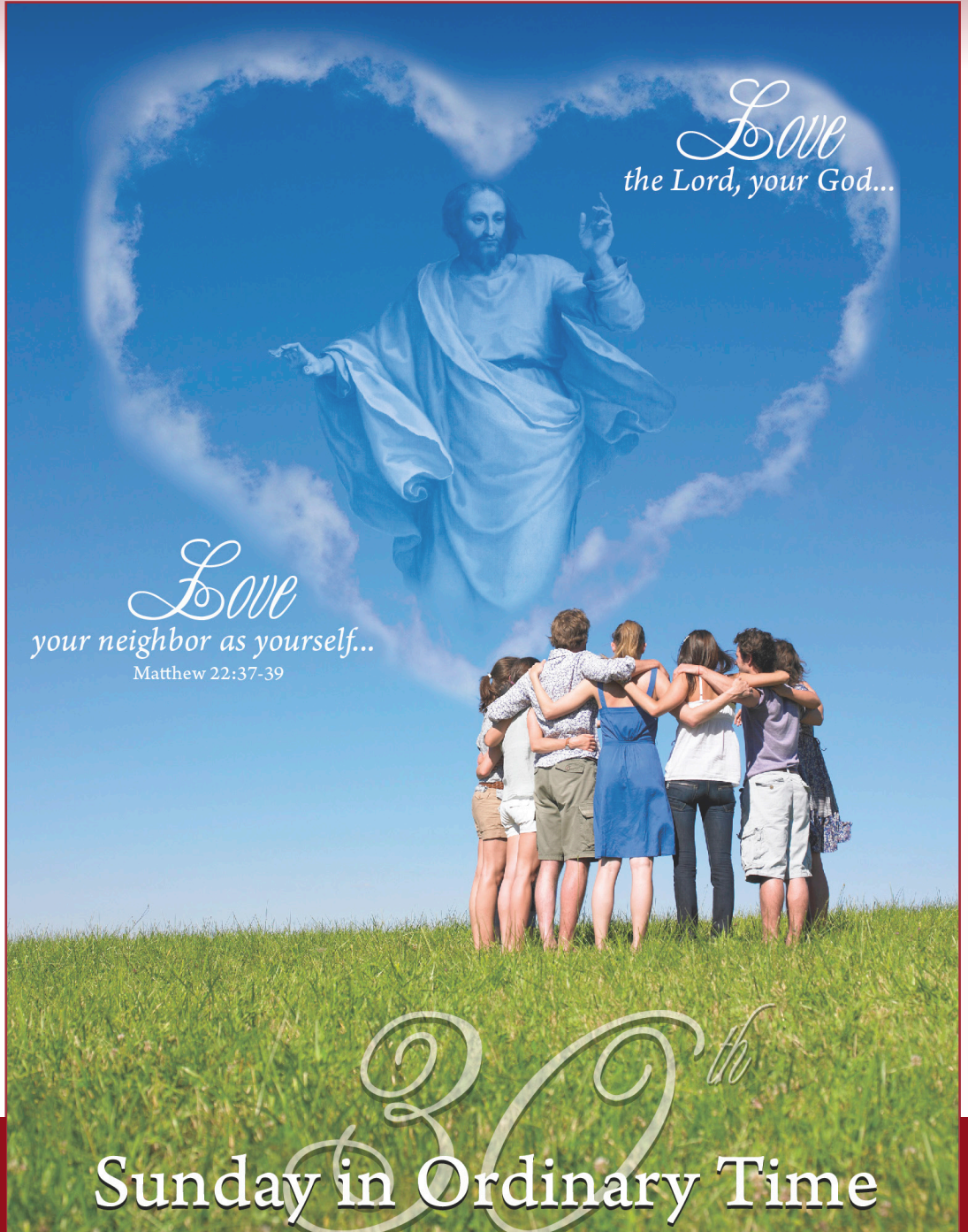

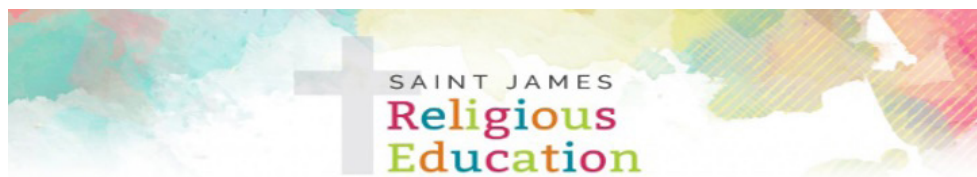

How often do we wake up in the morning and immediately spring into action and jump into our busy days?! How many times do we yearn for a bit of a slow-down? A little time to sit in silence? To pray? To have a bit of time to give thanks for all that God has given to us?

I've found that I crave this quiet and reflective time. Time in solitude and stillness. Time to listen to the "still, small voice" of the Holy Spirit within me. As a young teacher I discovered I was very good at giving advice. I had no children of my own but I advised parents on discipline and how to get their children to complete their homework independently. It was only after I became a parent I realized that it's easy to spout



off answers, but much more difficult to live them!

The Pharisees, who strictly followed Mosaic law, were gathering evidence against Jesus. He did not follow the laws such as resting on the Sabbath, ritual cleansing, and over 630 others that their people had been following for hundreds of years. So, to trick Him they asked which is the greatest commandment. Jesus' answer: Love God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind and love your neighbor. He didn't dismiss Mosaic law, but said that all the law and the prophets depend on this love. They were silenced.

Jesus didn't just say these words, He lived them. The Gospels are full of stories of Jesus' love shown through healing, forgiveness, and encouragement. He didn't just offer them to the holy people, but to all: the sinners, the Gentiles, the sick and those thought to be cursed.

Knowing Jesus' words is the

easy part. How do we live them? How do we love God with our whole heart, soul and mind? We learn from the Pharisees that rituals are not enough. We must entrust God with our worries, our hopes our pain, and our joys. We must listen to His guidance.

We must look at the people He has put in our lives? It is easy to love those who love us, but what about that sibling, neighbor or coworker who is difficult? How can we love that neighbor as Jesus did? This week resolve to do an act of kindness for someone you would avoid. Let Jesus guide you with His example. "What you do for the least of my brothers, you do for me."

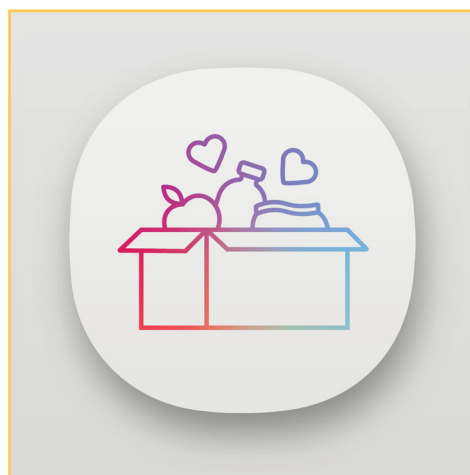
Thanksgiving Basket Project

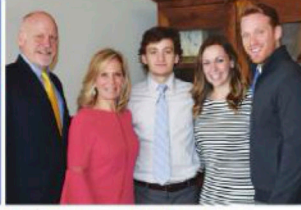

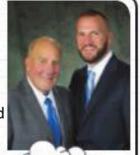
