Campaign Update

We received the bids back for Phase I of our construction. This includes site work in the area around the parking lot and the foundation work. This bid package does not include putting up the walls and so forth. Normally this might be bid all at once, but we broke this out so that we could get started as soon as possible before the winter sets in. Overall, we were pleased with the bids that were submitted. It's about where we estimated it to be, and as a whole, is slightly less than the budget. That's good news, of course, but there are still many other things to bid out in the future. But it's at least a good first step.

We have begun the process of asking those who would perform the work to give us an idea of how much we would save if we moved Mass to the gym. We still don't know the answer to that question. I know that everyone is eager to know that, and I will certainly let you know as soon as I hear: but keep in mind that if we did vacate the church, it would NOT be until after Christmas.

Alternative to Mass Intentions NEW! at Holy Family

One of the things that is often a source of frustration to parishioners, not just here, but every parish, is that Mass intentions are often booked for the day they would like, or a Mass might not even be available for months. That's why we moved to a system that only allows the Mass intention book to be opened up six months at a time; so if you experience the loss of a loved one, you don't have to wait so long to get a Mass.


Another option we are going to offer, beginning this November and going forward from here on out, is to remember your loved one (or any intention you have) by paying for the Sanctuary candles to be lit in either the Adoration Chapel or in the church Sanctuary. The suggested donation will be \$25. We hope that will alleviate some of the demand that exists for Mass intentions. Of course, the best thing we can do for our deceased loved ones is to offer them a Mass, but if one is not available, this is a nice alternative. You may notice that this is something done in other Catholic churches, as well, and so I thought it might be nice to offer it here, as well. You can contact Kristin in our office if you are interested in reserving a week.


Healing Mass Next Week





True Death with Dignity - Mary Schmich, Chicago Tribune, "Margaret Coleman liked to joke that it took one mother to care for 14 children and now it takes 14 children to care for one old mom. In the 1950's & 60's, a family of 14 kids wasn't remarkable, not in the South Side neighborhood of Beverly (Chicago). Finally, the day came that Marge was alone and determined to stay in her old house until the end, which worked just fine

until, inevitably, it wasn't, leaving her and her children in a quandary familiar to many elderly parents and their children. If taking care of an elderly parent is a common experience, what's not common is how the Coleman siblings managed the challenge of giving their mother the gift of finishing life at home. Each of the 14 children took one 12-hour shift, coordinating their calendars online, conducting teleconferences, and convening in person if there were a crisis. As time passed, Marge's children obliged her one of her final yearnings. They packed up her portable oxygen and her wheelchair and took her to the family cottage in Michigan, where she had gone since she was a girl in the 1930s. They moved her bed next to the front windows so she could see the lake. They threw a party. One week later, she died. As they stood around her hospital bed, they talked about how happy it made them that she could die at home. 'She left us with a smile. She always said that Sundays were for families to be together and it seemed very poignant that she died on a Sunday with her whole family there,' said her daughter." 


"Lord, when did we see You hungry, or thirsty, or a stranger, or needing clothes, or sick, or in prison, and did not help you?"
