October 21 & 28. Thursdays, from 6:30 pm to 7:45 pm, on Zoom or in the social hall.

Oct. 21 speakers: Sacred Heart parishioner Meg Gollnick is a co-founder of the Pullman Schools Food Pantry Program and Pullman Arts Foundation. Meg will talk about how climate change impacts her and her family. Meg's husband, John Gollnick, serves with the Pullman Fire Department and is a 24-year firefighter.

Mike Heston, is the Pullman Fire Chief since 2013 and a 25-year veteran with the Pullman Fire Department, and serves on two regional Incident Management teams dealing with wild land and large area fires.
