





Living the Gospel with Kids

You'll likely be spending some time this week in preparation for Halloween. Bring your faith into this holiday by finding ways to share God's love. For example, your children could brighten the lives of some elderly neighbors by giving them a Halloween treat.



Luke 18:9-14

This week we celebrate Halloween, a fun time for decorating and dressing up. The holiday began with the Celtic festival of Samhain, when people gathered to celebrate the end of harvest and the beginning of winter. It was thought that on Oct. 31, the veil between the living and the dead was at its thinnest and so people wore masks and lit bonfires to frighten away evil spirits. Over the centuries other cultures influenced the traditions. Then, in the 8th century, Pope

Gregory declared November 1st All Saints Day, and so Oct. 31 became All Hallows (Saints) Eve, or Halloween. Irish and Scottish immigrants brought their Halloween traditions to the United States, including carving gourds and trick-ortreating.

For our children it is a fun time to pretend to be someone or something they are not.

We have great memories of our children choosing how they want to dress and creating or buying everything needed. We would have friends over for pizza and then the trick-or-treating would commence. Imagine you could dress up as someone or something else. What would you be?

In the Gospel, Jesus proposes two characters that you would not likely choose to dress as. One was a tax collector, a person the community seen as a cheat and a traitor, because

he worked for the Romans and pocketed money for himself. The second was a Pharisee, a leader in the community and the church. Pharisees were known to be pompous and demanding, caring more about their status than God's people. In prayer, the Pharisee boasts of his fasting and tithing while the tax collector humbly confesses his sinfulness.

This poses the question: How do we dress up before God? Do we proudly profess our holiness and self-reliance or do we appear in humility, expressing our need for Him and His forgiveness? Whatever we do, God knows our hearts. He sees who we are under our layers of costumes. Not only that, but He loves us dearly and encourages us to be the unique, holy people He calls us to be, on Halloween and through the rest of the year.

Breast Cancer Incidence Still Rises and Death Rate Still Declines

A new American Cancer Society (ACS) report finds that the incidence of breast cancer in women has continued to increase, rising by 1% a year during 2012 to 2021, for all women combined. These cases are largely confined to localized-stage cancers, which have not spread from the breast, and hormone receptor-positive disease (either estrogen positive or progesterone positive), the most common type of breast cancer

Typically, the disease occurs in women older than age 50, so it's concerning that women younger than age 50 saw a steeper increase in breast cancer (increasing 1.4% a year) than women older than 50 (0.7% a year).

Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) women had the fastest increase in breast cancer incidence for both age groups. AAPI women younger than age 50 had a 2.5%



increase in incidence a year and AAPI women older than age 50 had a 2.7% increase. The increase in younger AAPI women is particularly striking because it has moved this population from the second lowest incidence rate in 2000 compared to other racial and ethnic groups to sharing the highest breast cancer incidence rate with White women in 2021.

In contrast to rising incidence, the death rate for breast cancer among women in the United States has dropped 44% from its peak in 1989 to 2022. That translates to nearly 518,000 fewer breast cancer deaths during this time compared to the number that would have occurred if the peak rate had continued.

The continuous decline in breast cancer death rates is attributed to advances in treatment and early detection. But, as with breast cancer incidence rates, there are wide ethnic and racial disparities in death rates. For instance, American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) women have experienced no decrease in

breast cancer death rates over the past three decades.

The largest breast cancer disparity is between Black and White women. Black women are 38% more likely to die from breast cancer even though they are 5% less likely to be diagnosed with the disease. This is partly because Black women are the least likely to be diagnosed with an early stage of breast cancer, when the cancer can usually be treated more effectively. Only 58% of Black women are diagnosed at a localized stage compared to 68% of White women.

Still, Black and White women have similar survival when the cancer is diagnosed at a localized stage. For diagnoses at a regional- or distant-stage, and for every subtype of breast cancer, Black women have worse survival than White women.




Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

Letter from Fr. Ed:

October 2025
