## Catholicism Series Outline for Video for Week 9 Do you know these two indispensable men?

- 1. Peter and Paul: The Indispensable Men
  - a. The Christian movement would never have survived without Peter and Paul
  - b. Peter, head of the 12, one chosen by Jesus to be the leader, rock, witness to the resurrection
  - c. Paul, first Christian theologian, saw the full implications of the resurrection of the dead
  - d. Not just historical but archetypes in the Church for today
  - e. Bishops go to Rome to visit the pope but more to visit the tombs of Peter and Paul.

## 2. Peter

- a. Stories of Peter in the Scriptures
  - i. Calling of Peter
    - 1. Jesus calls Peter by making him put out into deep water for a catch
    - 2. Caught a great catch
    - 3. Jesus called him to be fishers of men
  - ii. Transfiguration
    - 1. Peter said, Lord it is good for us to be here
    - 2. Peter loved Jesus the most
  - iii. Storm at Sea
    - 1. Peter walked on the water to Jesus
    - 2. When he took his eyes of Jesus, he began to sink
  - iv. At the courtyard at Jesus Trial
    - 1. Denied him three times
    - 2. Peter wept
  - v. Resurrection
    - 1. While fishing Peter jumps in the water to go to Jesus at the shore
    - 2. Jesus asks Peter if he loves Jesus 3 times to reverse the 3 denials
- b. Peter is the archetype in that we see ourselves and our journey with Jesus
  - i. Saints know they are sinners as all who are moved toward the light.
  - ii. The great saints are the first to say that they are the worse sinners
- c. Jesus asks the disciples, who do you say that I am
  - i. They got the wrong answers except Peter
  - ii. Peter says "you are the Christ, the son of the living God"
  - iii. Jesus tells Peter that the Father inspired Peter to this knowledge
  - iv. Peter is the Rock, and upon this Rock Jesus builds the church
    - 1. The church rests on this confession of Peter
    - 2. On him he will build the Church for all those to follow too
- d. Peter as the definitive witness to the resurrection

- i. The wavering apostle came the definitive witness
- ii. Peter's speech in Acts the people were cut to the heart
- iii. Peter went to Rome in the 50-60 AD
  - 1. St. Mark is the companion of Peter
  - 2. He was crucified in Rome
  - 3. They buried his body outside of Rome
  - 4. A church was built there, torn down and the one we see was built
  - 5. They excavated under the Church and found the tomb of Peter
  - 6. Christianity is based on a person who was the friend of Peter
  - 7. Christianity rests on the personal foundation of people's experience

## 3. Saint Paul

- a. Paul's background
  - i. He was Jewish and Greek and became a Roman citizen
  - ii. The three great cultures of Judaism, Greek and Roman
  - iii. Studied at the foot of Gamaliel in learning of classical Judaism
  - iv. He became a zealot who was bothered greatly by the rise of Christianity
  - v. Saul is present at the stoning of Steven and looked on with approval
- b. The story of Jesus as a threat to the current trends of all times
