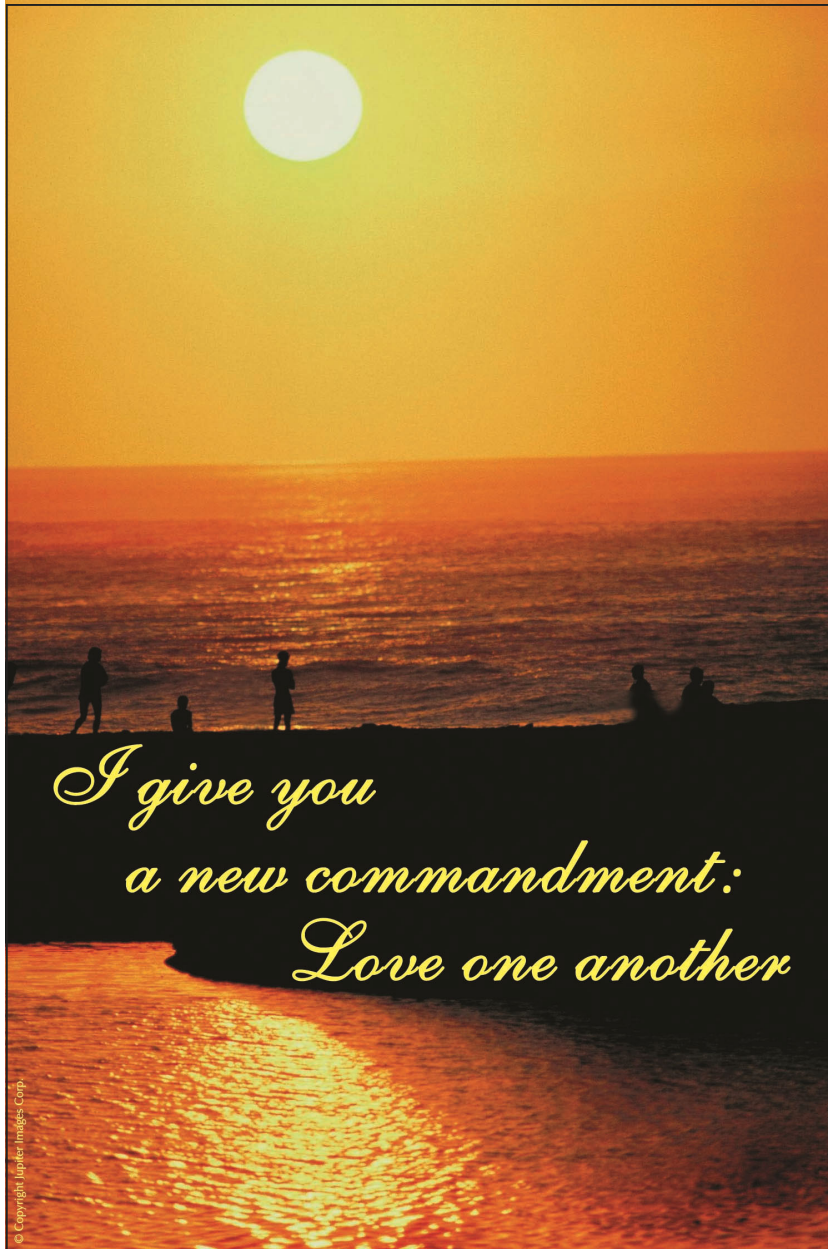

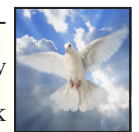


Many thanks to the volunteer who prepared the Parents and Godparents for this Sacrament and those who helped set up. Your efforts were much appreciated!

**Pastor’s Corner**

What must it have been like for the early Jewish-Christians to let go of some of their customs, of what was familiar to them? They needed to start fresh yet with a firm foundation from the past. When the apostles encountered non-Jews who wished to follow the gospel, they were forced to drop some of their dietary customs and eliminate the requirement for circumcision. They came to the understanding that although their customs were comforting for them as Jews, they were a hindrance to welcoming non-Jews into the Church community. They reevaluated all their customs in light of their new belief that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ and His redemptive suffering, death, and resurrection. Therefore they were able to let go of what was comfortable and move on to the future in Christ’s Church.

As disciples of the Lord, we too are often asked to let go of what is familiar and comfortable in our daily lives and take a step forward in faith. The future is always a leap of faith, but with our trust in God we can grow in our understanding of our mission of serving God and neighbor. The years following Vatican Council II were unsettling to a lot of Catholics. In that turmoil I think we may have lost sight of the greater mission of the Church, of proclaiming God’s redeeming love to all who ask for mercy for their sins. Today we hear of the New Evangelization in the Church, proclaimed by Pope John Paul II and his successors. It is a reawakening in all of us of the need to be witnesses of Christ in the world.

We know that saying that “God loves us” is highly accepted by people, but to then proclaim that love means doing good and avoiding evil (and then listing the common evils in our society) brings opposition to the Church, to each of us. The early church was able to persevere through this opposition because of great prayer and trust in Christ, and we will also be able to do this with prayer and trust. I cannot emphasize enough that this is a spiritual challenge for us, and we need deep prayer to help us form our future Church. I hope all of us will see this challenge as an opportunity to deepen our faith and commitment to serving Christ through our church community. May God bless us as we move forward in faith for His service!

During the week we engage in service projects during the day and then relax with games, talks, and prayer time in the evening. The cost is \$125 for the week which covers everything, including food. We will be staying at St. John the Baptist in Longmont for the week.

### **Prayer and Action: An Overview**

Prayer and Action sessions last five days. Students arrive Sunday evening and stay until Friday morning. Throughout the week the students will paint, clean, do yard work, and perform other meaningful tasks for the poor, disabled, and elderly. The students spend the week in an atmosphere that is free of distractions which fosters their faith, inspires their charity, and leads them closer to Christ. The experience will also allow them to get to know other high school students from other parts of the Archdiocese who share their Catholic faith.

The Prayer and Action experience will be facilitated by the mission team which consists of seminarians and other dynamic young adults. This team and the parish adult leaders will be with the students at the worksites, working side-by-side.




