# FATHER PAT'S SERMON NOTES

The Baptism of the Lord

# Moving from the Manger to the Mission!

The Christmas season officially concluded yesterday – the Saturday after Epiphany. After four weeks of Advent listening to the Old Testament prophesies of the coming Messiah and nearly three weeks of the Christmas season pondering over the question: "What Child is this?" it seems very fitting that today, the Feast of the Lord's Baptism, we hear the answer to this question not from the prophet Isaiah or John the Baptizer, nor from a legion of angels or poor shepherds or even the spirit-filled elders Anna and Simeon. No, today we hear from THE VOICE that matters the most: God, the Father. As if to dispel any lingering doubts about the identity of the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, God sets the record straight over 30 years after Jesus' birth by declaring on the day of his baptism: "You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased".


Having come to the end of the Christmas season, the critical question is not ONLY "What Child is this?" but "Whose child are you?" By celebrating the Baptism of the Lord, we are invited to realize the significance of our own baptism and the new identity that God gave us on the day we were born again by water and the Holy Spirit (John 3:5). We are invited to, in the words of Saint John: "SEE, what love the Father has bestowed on us in allowing us to be called Children of God; for that is what we are" (1 John 3:1-2).

Today we see that baby Jesus is all grown up. We need to grow up with him. The Christmas story is not a children's fable but a compelling witness of a God who entered into history like never before. Jesus is God's Anointed One filled "...with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil" (Acts 10:38). As Christians, we too are anointed by God with a mission greater than ourselves. But in order to embrace this mission we need to be clear about who we are and whose we are first. This is why God always calls us to BE (identity) before God calls us to DO (mission). Clear about who we are; what God said we are at our baptism (beloved children) now we can we move from the manger to the mission; from our childhood memories to our adult responsibility; from gazing at the Christmas babe, to realize that God's beloved Son is gazing at us and waiting to see whether we will join him in his mission of saving others.


