FATHER PAT'S SERMON NOTES

12th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Jesus is in the Boat with You.

Isn't it true that we tend to listen and heed God more easily when in the midst of a crisis? God seems to command our attention with little effort when we are in pain, in an ambulance, at a loss or just overwhelmed. Maybe, this is why the first reading said that "the Lord addressed Job OUT OF THE STORM! God knew that he was going to get a hearing.

How about you? Been in any storms lately? When the disciples of Jesus found themselves in a boat during a violent squall and could see that the water in the sea was beginning to fill the boat (i.e., that they were in way over their heads), they were more than ready to hear a word from Jesus - who was asleep on a cushion! Even though the bible says that God never sleeps nor slumbers, circumstances can have us wondering sometimes! In the end, Jesus calmed the wind and the sea with a word of command: "Quiet! Be Still!" I can't help wondering whether it was really the storm that Jesus was primarily addressing. What I mean is that sometimes the scariest storms we face in life aren't the ones on the outside but the ones on the inside. Remember, in the first reading the scriptures said that God spoke to Job OUT of the storm. I wonder whether Jesus wasn't doing the same thing with his disciples. That is, speaking to them IN THE MIDST of the storm: "Calm down! Get a hold of yourselves! I am still here! Do not be afraid!

The disciples might have been thinking that this whole scary episode could have been avoided had Jesus not told them to cross to the other side in the first place. Or maybe had they said "No" instead of "Yes" to his invitation to become his followers back during that time when they weren't afraid of anything because they too preoccupied with being in AWE of Jesus. Sometimes we can have low moments when we forget why we started on this path called the Christian life in the first place. When you find yourself engaging in such "stinkin thinkin" because times are tough or scary, the following incite I once read may encourage you to stay the course or get back on track: "God never promised a smooth journey, but a safe landing. In fact, the "peace of God" is not the absence of storms in our lives, but the presence of Jesus Christ in the midst of every one of those storms." Let God calm the storm raging in your heart as you hone in on the presence of His Son; because despite what you may think, Jesus is in the boat with you!
