FATHER PAT'S SERMON NOTES

6th Sunday of Easter

Keeping God Close Pushes Our Fears Away

The law of intimacy in relationships between persons is that people are either moving closer together or drifting apart. So, <u>no relationships are stagnant</u>. Our relationship with God is no different in the sense that it is a dynamic reality requiring our constant and deliberate attention, care, nurturing, energy and investment. This is what makes it exciting! The only way to be bored with God is to stand outside of him; to be disengaged and to keep your distance. This is why God is never bored with us – he is invested in our lives!

In today's Gospel, Jesus says: "Whoever loves me will keep my word... whoever does not love me does not keep my words..." (John 14:23, 24). Keeping God's word is the way we stay close to him and receive daily assurance that he dwells within us. Ignoring his word is the equivalent of "keeping our distance". The key to maintaining healthy relationships, especially the most intimate ones is realizing at least two things: One, hard work and sacrifice is required. And two, it's more than worth it! During our weekly bible study a few years ago on the Gospel of Luke, we discussed Jesus' words contrasting those who are "hearers" of the word and those who are "doers" of the word (Luke 6:46-49). I reminded those attending that even our time at bible study will only make a difference if we put the scriptures we study into action in our lives.

In fact, we shouldn't look at the bible as primarily a book to be studied, but a Word to be encountered and a Savior to be embraced! Nor is it simply a source of information but <u>a means of transformation</u> when our hearts and minds are open to it. In fact, the Word of God wants to bring about in each of our lives nothing short of a spiritual revolution! But any student of history knows that revolutions never turn out well if there isn't a functioning and just government established to replace the old one. But if we rely on and keep his word then Christ can take up his rightful seat in the throne room of our hearts and through his governance, deliver us from the tyranny of self-reliance. Jesus said that when we "keep" his word, he and the Father make their dwelling place within us. Let us heed our Lord's voice now so that the days of being troubled and afraid will yield to the abiding presence of the Living God.
