

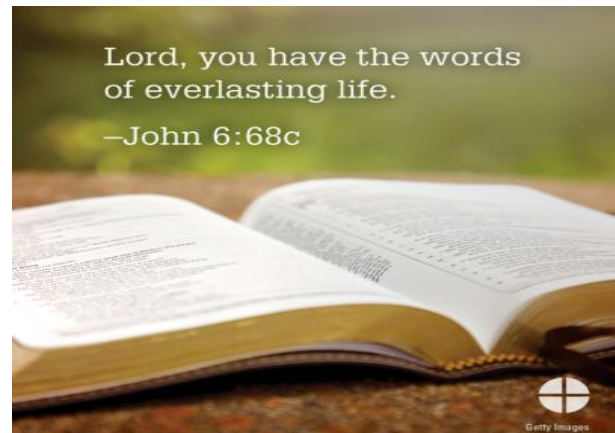

PRAYER AND WORSHIP . . .

✠ A REFLECTION FROM FR. CANISIUS ✠

Dear Parishioners,

This is the Third Week of Lent already! Lent is a time that invites us to step back and take the long view. Through special practices and prayer, we look for ways to grow closer to God and to one another. We aim for holiness, freedom in Christ, and the opportunity with God's grace to be more and more conformed to Christ. We always do so within the circumstances of our lives.

Each of us longs to know and love God better. Each of us needs the grace of God in our lives. Today's readings subtly teach us something important about receiving grace and instruction from God. First, he must cleanse us. First, he must make room in our hearts so that he can fill us with his grace.

We notice in today's first reading that, before God gave the Israelites the **Ten Commandments, writing his law on their hearts, he had to get them out of Egypt. He had to free them so that they could be free to love and serve him.** In today's Gospel, Jesus cleanses the temple, making *a whip out of cords* and overturning tables! But then, he teaches. He prophesies his glorious resurrection.

Lent is a time for examining what obstacles to grace and instruction from God may be in our lives. Remember that God respects our free will, and so he doesn't "force" his grace upon us; we have to cooperate. And so, we, in humility, ask ourselves: What do we need to "cleanse" in order to "make room" for God's abundant grace? What false idols might we rank higher than God, even unconsciously? We know that *the temple of Jesus' body* was destroyed and raised. Therefore, we can trust that the same God who raised Jesus from the dead can also cleanse and breathe new life into our hearts.

To the world, it may seem foolish to place God and his commandments first in our lives, above money, power, and pleasure. But Saint Paul reminds us that to unbelievers, the simple fact that we glorify Christ crucified, Jesus killed as a criminal, is foolish, at best. God, in his infinite wisdom, desired this to be the way humankind was saved, and so we proclaim with joy: **Christ has died, Christ is risen, and Christ will come again.** As we continue on our Lenten journey, let our simple prayer be: **Jesus, I want to cleanse my heart to make more room for you.**

Days of Fast & Abstinence

The current regulations concerning Lenten fasting and abstinence for Roman Catholics in the United States generally are as follows:

Abstinence from all meat is to be observed by all Roman Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Roman Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 60. **Catholics may eat only one full meal during the day. Additionally, they may eat up to two small meals or snacks. Any amount of water or other beverages may be consumed.**

For Roman Catholics whose health or ability to work would be negatively affected by fasting and/or abstinence, the regulations above do not apply.

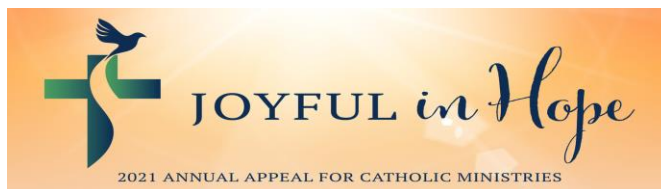

SAFE HAVEN SUNDAY: EQUIPPING THE FAMILY, SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN

The family home is to be a safe haven. But the inappropriate use of technology in the home deprives it of this role, and is the greatest threat to the sanctity of marriages and families today. Pornography and other online threats are often one click away, and parents can feel overwhelmed with not knowing how to best protect their children in our fast-paced digital world. Next weekend, **March 13-14**, the Archdiocese of Baltimore is taking a bold step to help families by celebrating **Safe Haven Sunday**. This awareness day will provide access to practical resources that any caring adult can use to protect themselves and our young people from online risks.
