From our Pastor's Desk

Father Alfred Tumwesigye

ARCHDIOCESE OF MBARARA

The problems posed by the COVID-19 pandemic were enormous globally but worse in poor countries like Uganda that had to stay in lockdown for 8 months. Bishop Thomas John Paprocki and the Mission Office of the Diocese of Springfield are well aware of the tough situation that diocese in such countries is operating in as they struggled to remain alive and continue reaching out to people and support them in various aspects of life. Bishop Paprocki thought of extending help to some of those dioceses, but most especially those that have sent their priests to serve in the Diocese of Springfield by inviting them to participate in the Missionary Cooperation Plan for this year. Probably it was intentional that the invited dioceses were assigned to talk about their missionary work in Parishes where their priests serve. As a matter of fact, the Archdiocese of Mbarara which Fr. Iggy came to represent is the home diocese of Fr. Alfred Tumwesigye.

Covid worsened the already bad situation as Churches that depend on donations from Christians remained closed for 8 months and even when they were allowed to open, the number of attendants was limited to 50 people only, yet the majority of Christians had lost their jobs and had nothing to donate to Church. The situation is further worsening as Uganda is currently experiencing the 2nd wave of the Coronavirus.

You are kindly requested to make a generous donation to support the home diocese of our pastor and Fr. Iggy so that it remains functional in these extremely challenging times.

Briefly about the Archdiocese of Mbarara:

It was created in 1999 in Southwestern Uganda (Eastern Africa). The area covered by the diocese has a population of about 2,300,000 people of whom about 1,155,000 are Catholics. The Archdiocese has 185 priests of whom 170 are indigenous. It has 56 parishes and 150 Missions. 93% of the population served by the Archdiocese lives in rural places where there is no electricity and safe/clean water.

1. The diocese is challenged with spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ in a hostile political environment, and the rapid advance of Islam from North Africa to Sub-Saharan Africa. We therefore work and **provide services in the very rural parts of the Archdiocese so as to stand strong against Islamic Fundamentalism and other Pentecostal Churches** that are coming in larger and different forms.
2. Your support is coming to **Counteract High Levels of poverty: MCP funds support the faithful whose average annual per capita income is equivalent to the US \$200.00** by providing education to the most disadvantaged and orphaned children. We support orphans and widows to the HIV/AIDS and Malaria scourges that are left without any source of livelihood.
3. Your support will help in **providing Safe Water in rural areas:** The Archdiocese helps by building safe water centers

in rural areas. Some people walk up to ten miles for water to use in homes.

4. Your contribution will also be directed to **support the eradication of controllable and curable diseases, promote the Safe Motherhood Program, and boost the 22 Diocesan Health Centers in the fight against the current pandemic by providing PPEs to healthcare workers.**
5. Part of your donation will be directed toward supporting the **outreach mission of the Archdiocese of Mbarara in the Nakivale refugee camp.** Also, part of your donation will be directed to help **Ibanda babies' home** (nursing home for babies that are damped on streets by their parents).

Last weekend, I was pleased to receive via mail the Decree of Appointment from Bishop Paprocki, making my first diaconal assignment official. I am very excited to be able to announce that I have been appointed **“to assist as deacon the pastor of St. Elizabeth Parish.”**

I am so grateful to accept this assignment to serve the pastor and people here at St. Elizabeth as I begin my service as a deacon.

This week, Bishop Paprocki released a column in the *Catholic Times*, helping to share the news of his *Decree Withdrawing the Particular Dispensations from the Obligation to Attend Mass on Sundays & Holy Days of Obligation*. As Bishop explains, “Clearly, the full reopening of secular society means that the time has come for the Church as well to withdraw all remaining particular dispensations from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation, and I have issued a decree to that effect effective on the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Saturday, June 12, 2021. Those who believe they should continue to be dispensed should speak to their parish priest, who may grant a dispensation in individual cases for a just reason. Those who are ill are excused and do not need a dispensation.”

“It is good that our churches can again be opened to full capacity. I pray that the faithful will return in great numbers and will be able to experience the full richness of our sacred rituals.”
