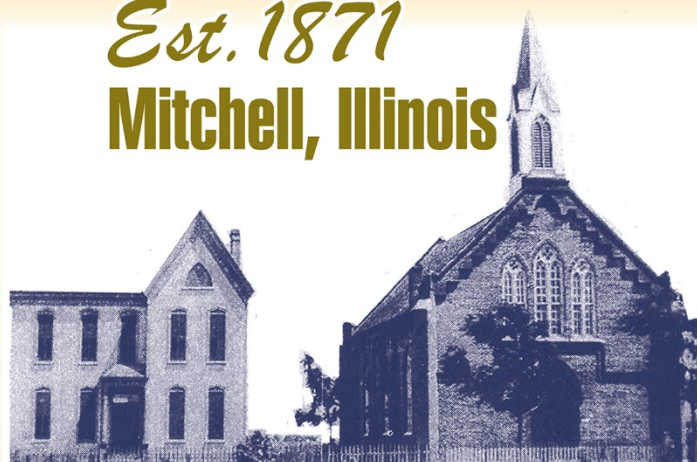

MEET OUR NEW SEMINARIAN

Seminarian 'Kaz' joins Seminarians Ryan & Dan serving and ministering among us on Sunday mornings through this school year. Welcome, Kaz!

My name is Kazimir Biesiada and I'm happy to be here at St Elizabeth Catholic Church! I am from Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. In High School I thought about what I was going to do the rest of my life and started to discern the priesthood. I knew that I was called to serve but couldn't decide between the military and the seminary. I decided to apply and attend the US Naval Academy in Annapolis in 2011. Before commissioning there is something called 'service selection', where a midshipman writes his preferences for which community he wants to serve in (Pilot, Marine Officer, Submariner, and etc). I spent a lot of time in the chapel talking to Jesus and knew that I had to go to seminary. After starting the process to commission as a Navy Catholic Chaplain Candidate, the Navy made it clear that I was to commission as a Surface Warfare Officer. I served on the USS Bataan (LHD-5) and USS Monterey (CG-61) for the next few years making two deployments in the Middle East, and many 'underways' in other Areas of Operation.

During these years I continued to grow in my prayer life and kept hearing the call to priesthood.

After my service obligation, I contacted the vocation directors for the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City and the Archdiocese for the Military Services. I was accepted as a seminarian and just started my second year at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St Louis!

The greatest graces that I have received from my first year at seminary are a deep appreciation for a Christ-centered and Christ-loving community and a deepened desire to serve as a priest. To go into more detail about my deepened desire for priesthood: I was praying and asking Jesus for the reason He wanted me to be a priest. After a long silence I heard the words "because I love you". This made absolutely no sense in my head, but it soothed my heart. I brought this to my spiritual director and he clarified what God had told me. If a groom was asked on his wedding day why he was getting married, what better answer is there than "because she loves me"? I was completely overcome with joy.

I continue to grow in prayer and in my love for Jesus. Please know of my prayers for everyone at St Elizabeth!

Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. Please keep the Pope's missions in your prayers and be generous in the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

MONTH OF ALL SOULS

The month of November is marked with heightened meditation on the Communion of the Saints and on prayer for those who have gone before us, and especially for the souls in purgatory. There are special indulgences available through the month as well.

- A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who,
 - on any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed;
 - On All Souls' Day (or, according to the judgment of the ordinary, on the Sunday preceding or following it, or on the solemnity of All Saints), devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed.
- A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who,
 - devoutly visit a cemetery and at least mentally pray for the dead;
 - devoutly recite lauds or vespers from the Office of the Dead or the prayer Requiem aeternam (Eternal rest).

A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. Cemeteries like Calvary Catholic Cemetery in Edwardsville have car paths, allowing one to "visit" even if you stay in the car.

The "Eternal Rest" prayer gains a partial indulgence and can be prayed all year. Passing a cemetery and praying the "Eternal Rest" can help out the souls in need: ***"Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."***

To gain a Plenary Indulgence (only one per day), the faithful must be in the state of grace and the following conditions must accompany the prescribed act:

- have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- receive the sacrament of confession
- receive the Holy Eucharist (it is certainly better to receive it while participating in Holy Mass, but for the indulgence only Holy Communion is required)
- and recite prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary is suggested as a minimum, but any other additional prayers may be added).

All attachment to sin, even venial sin, must be absent. In the absence of some of these conditions, the indulgence is partial.

One important tradition in Latin American cultures is a special altar or table of the dead, where family members leave photos and other memorials of their deceased loved ones. This year, in addition to the book in which we can write the names of our deceased loved ones for prayers for the month, we'll also have two tables set up in the gathering space to which you can bring a small framed or unframed photo or other small token of memory of your loved one. (Note: it's common in the culture to bring their favorite food dish – please don't bring perishable food!)

ALL SOULS DAY MASS AT CALVARY- Fr. Stephen Thompson will also be celebrating All Soul's Day Mass, Tuesday, November 2, at 6:00 pm. outdoors at Calvary Catholic Cemetery in Edwardsville. Please bring your own seating. A goodwill offering will be collected. If weather prohibits, the Mass will be at Holy Family Church at 6:30 pm.
