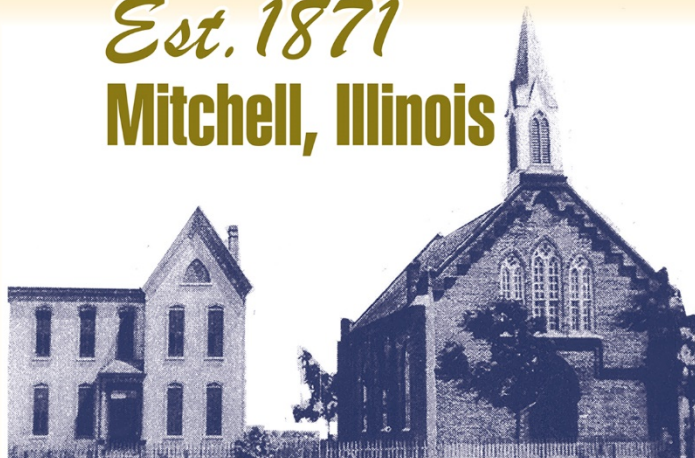

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Theological Thoughts with Seminarian Ryan

Hello All,

This week is one of my favorite weeks of the year! At first glance you may think I say this because it's Thanksgiving week, but that isn't the reason (although I do love Thanksgiving). I am excited for this week because it is the final week of Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar, and most especially because this week we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the Universe.

This Solemnity is one of the most important days of the liturgical year for Catholics. It is a week of Hope and rejoicing because in it we focus on Christ's Kingship over all of creation, and we have Hope-filled excitement that he is coming again at the end of time to reign definitively as King.

Other than having what in my mind is one of the most incredible titles ("King of the Universe"), this Solemnity marks the end of the year for us. In fact, next Sunday is both the first Sunday of Advent and Catholic New Years. The beauty of this is that the last week of the liturgical year is focused on Christ, and it is meant to remind us that Christ has the final say in all of time. Keeping this in mind, I think it would be good to consider what God's desires are for each of us -that way we can better realize what exactly Jesus will do as King. (Pull out your Bibles for this)

God is a God of the living and not of the Dead, therefore Jesus the King is coming to bring life to those who belong to him -that is: to the Faithful in the Church (see: 1 Cor. 15:21-28).

And again, Jesus has plans for our salvation and joy! (see: Jer. 29:11-14).

Jesus will remove all sorrow and sadness definitively bringing us to live in the place he has gone to prepare for us (see: Rev. 21:1-8, also see: John 14:3).

In short, when Jesus returns in His second coming everything we have lived for as Catholics will be fulfilled! Did you ever wonder why you have been Baptized, Confirmed, and received the Eucharist? It is so Jesus can draw you into His Family -The Church! We do this so that you and I can share in "the life of the world to come." Those last words might ring a bell for you, because they are the final words of our Creed (the faith we profess at Mass), when we say that "we look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen." we are saying that we look forward to Jesus return as the King of the Universe to reign in glory and splendor!

This is why I get so excited about this Sunday, and this week, because we are Hoping and celebrating the Joy of the Gospel-that we have life in Christ Jesus!

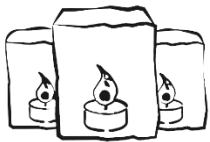

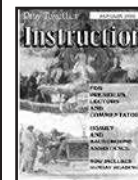
