From our Pastor’s Desk

Father Alfred Tumwesigye

Praised be Jesus Christ! **WE MADE IT THROUGH THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY YEAR, STRONG IN FAITH! A BIG THANK TO EVERYONE, ESPECIALLY THE 150 ANNIVERSARY COMMITTEE WHO CARRIED US THROUGH JOYFULLY.** Now, Advent season is here, a liturgical season of waiting. Talk of waiting - any one of us can understand what this means - from sitting in traffic to waiting in a line at the store or waiting in line at an airport to board the plane. While waiting, we get stuck sometimes, and in our stuckness we face powerlessness, our mortal minutes counting down, we feel like pushing or cutting our way through or just honk our horn in traffic as an act of rage and protest. Have you ever been caught up in such a trap? Where you feel like you are the captain of the clock! Where everything seems to move so slowly - and you murmur, ‘this is taking forever.’

Well, this is the season inviting us to slow down and simply wait. Many times, personally for the good of my soul, there are moments where I need/like to wait to let the moments march past. The truth is, everyday life teaches us that we have to wait. We wait for help, for monthly payment checks, for visitors, for our kids to get home, to everyone to buckle up before we drive off or the plane lifts off...etc....and we wait for rescue and redemption...and like all of us, I am waiting to die and have eternal life.

As Christians, we are a people who wait - in the already and the not yet. Christ has come and he will come again. We wait and wait. How can we live as children who watch and wait for the coming of the kingdom? As you notice, our daily lives show habits of impatience - of speeding ahead, trying to squeeze more into our already cluttered days. We barely wait! Hans Urs van Balthasar, says that ‘Impatience is at the root of all sin’. And he goes on to suggest that “patience is the basic constituent of Christianity...the power to wait, to persevere, to hold out, to endure to the end, not transcend one’s limitations, not force the issue by playing the hero, or the titan, but to practice the virtue that lies beyond heroism, the meekness of the lamb which is led” (A Theology of History, 1994).

Now, this is Advent. A Season of waiting. A Season when the new year begins in the chronology of the Church’s own time - the liturgical time. This is where the beautiful Church calendar teaches us the rhythm of life through a narrative of the liturgical season. It reminds us that every year the story of Jesus is retold. It reminds us that every day we participate in God’s creative work. Therefore, as we begin this beautiful season of Advent, waiting for Christmas, and then epiphany (manifestation), just know that we are a people longing for the Messiah, the nativity of Jesus, and his revelation to the world. While waiting we are slowly pointed to the ‘Christ the King of all the world’ and ‘the Heavens.’

As we wait and participate in the liturgical season of waiting, we are called to make lots of space for the one who is to come. This is the season of preparation for the celebration to come - Christmas. As we wait, we unclutter, we mourn and ache, we repent, and we wait. Let us prepare. Let us wait. Let us embrace the waiting world, waiting for something to be born in our lives, families, communities, and in the world. Let us make the Kingdom come. With Jesus who is already come, we wait with the expectation of Jesus who is to come. Let us wait for it with patience (Romans 8:25).

Whereas our Culture tends to rush us, together let us learn to wait, hope, slow down, and prepare ourselves through the Advent Men and Women retreats, Net Retreat, and Tri-City Reconciliation service here at St. Elizabeth Catholic Church and School and together celebrate the joy to the world - Christ has come. May our waiting be active and purposeful in anticipation of the good to come.

Let us pray for God’s Grace, that together as the Church we may practice the Church’s time of waiting (Advent). **“May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we have for you, so as to strengthen your hearts, to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. Amen.”** Romans (1 Thessalonians 3:12-13)

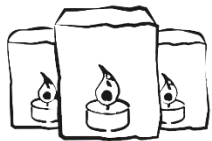

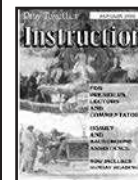
