20th Sunday in Ordinary Time 20° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Weeks ago, we heard Jesus send the disciples out two by two to heal the sick, drive out demons, and attract disciples in his name. The disciples did so and returned to the Lord rejoicing. Jesus could be pleased that they had taken those lessons to heart so well. But on the other hand, they cannot come to terms with his warning that he—the Messiah—would suffer greatly, be killed, and be raised on the third day. Today we hear Jesus challenge his disciples, sounding like he would wish it would happen already so that they might finally understand. He had, after all, been born into this world in order to suffer and die for it. The baptism he describes is his death, which is necessary for his resurrection, which is necessary for our redemption. Until this is all accomplished, his mission is incomplete, no matter how many are healed, comforted, or transformed. — *Pastoral Patterns*

REJECTION AND DIVISION?

Tomorrow is the Solemnity of the Assumption. Mary stands with the “great cloud of witnesses” described in Hebrews: those who kept their eyes firmly fixed on Jesus. We may not be thinking of Mary when we hear Jesus’ harsh words in today’s Gospel, but when she said “yes” to Gabriel, it carried the risk of the rejection and division that Jesus describes. As the early Christians surely knew, to hold Jesus as the sole leader and perfecter of faith meant that you would likely find yourself divided from those in your household who held other beliefs. This occurrence is not unknown in our own time and place, and many of us surely know a household divided on the issue of religion, even if the divisions are occurring solely through indifference. A life of faith lived to the full will likely eventually call on us to separate ourselves somehow, keeping our gaze firmly on Jesus, so we will also one day join the great cloud of witnesses.

FIRE IN THE MUD

Prophets have been described as being on fire with God’s message. Today, that fire in Jeremiah has to keep burning in the bottom of a muddy cistern. The rulers of his own people (including Judah’s king, Zedekiah) have placed him there for speaking an unpopular, if truthful, message to them. His own leave him there, mired in the mud, to starve and die. It takes a foreigner, an outsider, to convince Judah’s king that Jeremiah ought to be rescued, his life spared to continue as God’s prophet. As so often happens in the lives of the prophets, the help and saving power of God are shown through unexpected people in unexpected ways. We can often find ourselves mired in mud of one sort or another. Do we truly have the fire of God’s message in us, so that we can look for our rescue from places we might not expect?

SPIRIT FIRE IN THE SUMMER

A generation or two ago, these Summer Sundays in Ordinary Time would have been known as Sundays “of Pentecost.” That naming convention helped recall that the Spirit’s Pentecost fire was carrying us through all the Sundays until the end of the liturgical year. Though we may no longer use that name for these Sundays, the underlying reality is the same. The fire that Jesus speaks about today is the blaze of the Spirit. The fire he spoke about when he told his followers they were light for the world was the flame of the Spirit lighting the lamp of discipleship. It takes courageous disciples to allow the blazing fire of which Jesus speaks into their lives, to allow its light, warmth, and even cleansing to work in them and through them. Though we may not want to think about the heat of the Spirit’s fire on a summer Sunday, that Spirit is always with us, burning within.

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¿RECHAZO Y DIVISIÓN?

Mañana es la Solemnidad de la Asunción. María se encuentra entre la “gran nube de testigos” descrita en la carta a los Hebreos: aquellos que mantuvieron su mirada firmemente puesta en Jesús. Tal vez no pensemos en María al escuchar las duras palabras de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy, pero cuando ella dijo “sí” al ángel Gabriel, aceptó el riesgo del rechazo y la división que Jesús menciona.

Como bien lo sabían los primeros cristianos, reconocer a Jesús como el único guía y perfeccionador de la fe significaba, probablemente, quedar divididos incluso dentro de su propia casa frente a quienes creían de otra manera. Esto no es algo ajeno a nuestro tiempo ni a nuestra realidad: muchos de nosotros conocemos hogares divididos en cuestiones de fe, incluso si esas divisiones ocurren simplemente por indiferencia.

Una vida de fe vivida plenamente seguramente nos exigirá, en algún momento, separarnos de ciertas cosas o personas, manteniendo siempre nuestra mirada fija en Jesús, para que un día podamos unirnos también a esa gran nube de testigos.

FUEGO EN EL LODO

A los profetas se les ha descrito como encendidos con el fuego del mensaje de Dios. Hoy, ese fuego en Jeremías debe seguir ardiendo en el fondo de una cisterna llena de lodo. Los gobernantes de su propio pueblo (incluido el rey de Judá, Sedecías) lo han arrojado allí por proclamar un mensaje impopular, aunque verdadero.

Los suyos lo dejan abandonado, atrapado en el lodo, para que muera de hambre. Es un extranjero, un forastero, quien convence al rey de Judá de que Jeremías debe ser rescatado, de que su vida debe ser salvada para que continúe como profeta de Dios.

Como sucede con frecuencia en la vida de los profetas, la ayuda y el poder salvador de Dios se manifiestan a través de personas y caminos inesperados. También nosotros podemos encontrarnos hundidos en algún tipo de lodo. ¿Llevamos verdaderamente dentro de nosotros el fuego del mensaje de Dios, para poder reconocer la salvación viniendo desde donde menos lo esperamos?

FUEGO DEL ESPÍRITU EN VERANO

Hace una o dos generaciones, estos domingos de verano del Tiempo Ordinario se conocían como domingos “de Pentecostés”. Ese nombre ayudaba a recordar que el fuego del Espíritu de Pentecostés nos acompañaba a lo largo de todos los domingos hasta el final del año litúrgico.

Aunque hoy ya no se utilice ese término, la realidad sigue siendo la misma. El fuego del que Jesús habla hoy es la llama del Espíritu. El fuego al que se refería cuando dijo que sus discípulos eran la luz del mundo es la misma llama del Espíritu que enciende la lámpara del discipulado.

Se necesita valor para ser un discípulo dispuesto a dejar entrar en su vida el fuego ardiente del que habla Jesús, y permitir que esa luz, ese calor e incluso esa purificación actúen en nosotros y a través de nosotros.

Aunque quizás no queramos pensar en el calor del fuego del Espíritu en un domingo de verano, ese Espíritu siempre está con nosotros, ardiendo en nuestro interior.

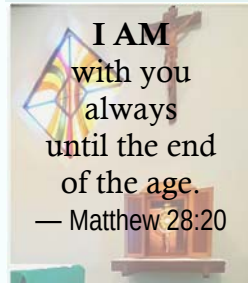
