Jesus does not make it easy for his disciples. Instead of sending them out in a group so that some could just tag along, he sends them out two by two. He sends them with no money or change of clothes, making them dependent on the people they meet (and on God). He sends them “like lambs among wolves” (Luke 10:3). But he gives them all that they truly need: the power to build the kingdom in his name. Jesus calls us to do the same. We can bring peace to a household with understanding and forgiveness. We can heal suffering with our presence and kindness. We can drive out the demons of hatred and discord, of injustice and oppression, by being the voice and hands of Christ in the world. Then may we rejoice as the disciples did, marveling at what we can accomplish in Jesus’ name. — *Pastoral Patterns*

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Jesús no les hace las cosas fáciles a sus discípulos. En vez de enviarlos en un grupo en que algunos pudieran tan sólo como pasar el tiempo, los envía de dos en dos. Los envía sin dinero o ropa adicional, lo cual los hace depender de la gente que encuentran en su camino (y de Dios). Los envía “como corderos en medio de lobos” (Lucas 10, 3). Pero les da todo lo que verdaderamente necesitan: el poder para construir el Reino en su nombre. Jesús también nos llama a nosotros para lo mismo. Podemos llevar la paz a un hogar con la comprensión y el perdón. Podemos sanar un sufrimiento con nuestra presencia y amabilidad. Podemos expulsar los demonios del odio y la discordia, de la injusticia y de la opresión siendo la voz y las manos de Cristo en el mundo. Y entonces podremos alegrarnos como los discípulos, maravillándonos de lo que podemos hacer en el nombre de Jesús. — *Palabras Pastorales*

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## EYES FIXED ON THE GOAL

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus sent the seventy-two out to prepare people's hearts and minds for him. The disciples whom he sent were to rely on the hospitality of those whom they served, and above all, to proclaim the kingdom of God. When they returned, joyful that so many had been healed through Christ's power, Jesus told them that true joy is to know our names are written in heaven. In other words, we must keep our eyes fixed on the ultimate goal, to be with God for eternity. In the heavenly Jerusalem, we will find comfort and overflowing nourishment. Our hearts will know joy beyond what we can imagine. Saint Paul tells us today that knowing the grace of Jesus Christ changes everything, giving new perspective, peace, and mercy.

## CALLED TO HIGHER THINGS

Think about a typical day for you. From the time you awake until your day ends, you may be busy, focused on work or family with little time to pause except perhaps a few moments for lunch or dinner. Most of us would say this is an accurate description of life as we know it. And if we are honest with ourselves, we see much good that comes from the attention we pay to the people in our lives and the tasks that we accomplish. We may even be mindful of our call to do these things with and through the Lord as we go about our lives. Yet we must remember that we are also called to higher things. We are in the world but not of it. Our ultimate goal is to be with God for eternity, and all our activities, tasks, and interactions must bear this great purpose in mind.

## THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS AT HAND

Jesus sent the seventy-two to proclaim the kingdom of God. They were to show people God's love by the way in which they lived. They were to travel simply, with only the provisions that were needed, rely on the good will of the people they served, and care for those who were in need. While some of us are called to live as missionaries, visiting places far from the comfort of home, most of us are called to live faithfully in our daily lives, where we are, with family and friends, co-workers, fellow citizens of our local towns and cities, our country, and the world. Whether we go to far-off lands to serve and share Christ's message of mercy or we serve in simple ways at home and in our local place, we must remember that whenever we reach out to heal, forgive, and show compassion, the kingdom of God is at hand. Christ is with us and will remain with us.

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### OJOS FIJOS EN LA META

En el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy, Jesús envía a setenta y dos discípulos para preparar los corazones y las mentes de las personas para Él. Los discípulos enviados debían confiar en la hospitalidad de aquellos a quienes servían y, sobre todo, proclamar el Reino de Dios. Al regresar, llenos de alegría porque muchos habían sido sanados por el poder de Cristo, Jesús les dijo que la verdadera alegría es saber que nuestros nombres están escritos en el cielo. En otras palabras, debemos mantener nuestros ojos fijos en la meta final: estar con Dios por toda la eternidad. En la Jerusalén celestial encontraremos consuelo y una abundancia de alimento espiritual. Nuestros corazones conocerán una alegría que supera todo lo que podamos imaginar. San Pablo nos dice hoy que conocer la gracia de Jesucristo lo cambia todo, dándonos una nueva perspectiva, paz y misericordia.

### LLAMADOS A COSAS MÁS ELEVADAS

Piensa en un día típico para ti. Desde que te despiertas hasta que termina tu día, puedes estar ocupado, enfocado en el trabajo o la familia, con poco tiempo para hacer una pausa, salvo quizás unos momentos para el almuerzo o la cena. La mayoría de nosotros diríamos que esta es una descripción precisa de la vida tal como la conocemos. Y si somos honestos con nosotros mismos, veremos mucho bien en la atención que prestamos a las personas en nuestras vidas y a las tareas que realizamos. Incluso podemos ser conscientes de nuestro llamado a hacer estas cosas con y a través del Señor mientras vivimos nuestro día a día. Sin embargo, debemos recordar que también estamos llamados a cosas más elevadas. Estamos en el mundo, pero no somos del mundo. Nuestra meta última es estar con Dios por toda la eternidad, y todas nuestras actividades, tareas e interacciones deben tener presente este gran propósito.

### EL REINO DE DIOS ESTÁ CERCA

Jesús envió a los setenta y dos para proclamar el Reino de Dios. Ellos debían mostrar el amor de Dios a través de la manera en que vivían. Debían viajar con sencillez, llevando solo lo necesario, confiando en la buena voluntad de las personas a quienes servían, y cuidando de quienes estuvieran en necesidad. Aunque algunos de nosotros somos llamados a vivir como misioneros, visitando lugares lejanos y fuera de la comodidad del hogar, la mayoría estamos llamados a vivir con fidelidad en nuestra vida diaria, donde estamos: con la familia y los amigos, compañeros de trabajo, conciudadanos de nuestros pueblos y ciudades, de nuestro país y del mundo. Ya sea que vayamos a tierras lejanas para servir y compartir el mensaje de misericordia de Cristo, o sirvamos de manera sencilla en casa y en nuestra comunidad local, debemos recordar que cada vez que extendemos la mano para sanar, perdonar y mostrar compasión, el Reino de Dios está cerca. Cristo está con nosotros y permanecerá con no-

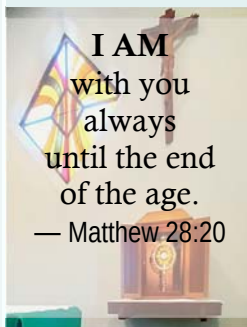
