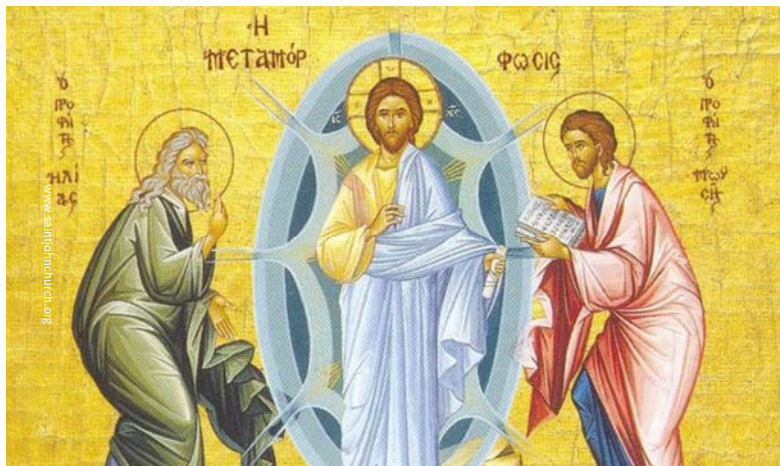

Today Jesus is seen transfigured, but in just over a month—on Good Friday—we will see our Lord disfigured: a crown of thorns thrust down upon his head, bloody welts on his body after being whipped by the soldiers, wounds in his hands and feet from the nails driven into them on the cross. For our sins, Jesus accepts becoming disfigured. But by putting his life in the Father's hands, he becomes transfigured in glory.

How can I see myself transfigured between now and Easter?

How will accepting my cross and following Jesus more closely help transform my life?

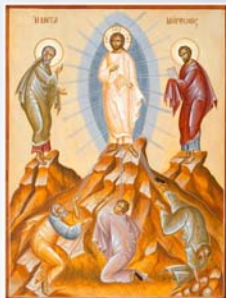

THE JOURNEY OF TRANSFIGURATION

“We used to be such good friends. How is it that you’ve moved so far away?” one man asked another. “Perhaps,” the other replied, “you have moved away. By standing still.” This exchange very well could have happened between Peter and Jesus, had Peter been allowed to erect tents to stay on the mount of the Transfiguration. He nearly succumbed to the temptation to stay in a place of wonder and light. But Jesus knew the hard truth: we are on a continual journey when we are walking the paths of God’s will. It is not good for us to stay in one place on our faith journey. Equally unhealthy is staying put in times of joy and wonder to avoid life’s difficulties, or to wallow in our trials and temptations and fail to be companions for our sisters and brothers who are also suffering—or celebrating! The pilgrim Church is required to do one thing on its Lenten journey: to walk continually with Christ as his Body born of water and the Spirit, seeking God’s will, helping the reign of God to be known on earth, being led to the end of our journey, transfigured for all time into the company of heaven.

“Solíamos ser tan buenos amigos. ¿Por qué te has alejado tanto?” un hombre le preguntó a otro. “Quizás”, le respondió el otro “tú te has alejado al quedarte quieto”. Este diálogo bien podría haberse dado entre Pedro y Jesús si a Pedro se le hubiera permitido armar tiendas para quedarse en el monte de la Transfiguración. Es igualmente malsano estancarnos en los momentos de alegría y milagros para evitar las dificultades de la vida que ensimismarnos en nuestros sufrimientos y tentaciones para evadir ser buenos compañeros de nuestras hermanas y hermanos que también están sufriendo; ¡o celebrar! La Iglesia peregrina debe hacer una cosa en su viaje de Cuaresma: caminar continuamente con Cristo como su Cuerpo nacido del agua y del Espíritu, buscando la voluntad de Dios, ayudando a que se conozca en la tierra el Reino de Dios, siendo guiada al final de nuestro viaje, transfigurada para siempre en la compañía del cielo.

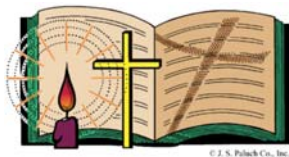

SAINTS PERPETUA & FELICITY (March 7) | SANTA PERPETUA Y SANTA FELICIDAD (Marzo 7)



O God, at the urging of whose love the Martyrs Saints Perpetua and Felicity defied their persecutors and overcame the torment of earth, grant, we ask, by their prayers, that we may ever grow in your love. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son. Amen.

Perpetua and Felicity (were believed to have died in 203 AD) were Christian martyrs of the 3rd century. Vibia Perpetua was a married noble-woman, said to have been 22 years old at the time of her death, and mother of an infant she was nursing. Felicity, a slave imprisoned with her and pregnant at the time, was martyred with her. They were put to death along with others at Carthage in the Roman province of Africa, during the reign of Septimius Severus. Knowing their own weakness but relying on the strength of Christ, who was fighting with them, they went to their martyrdom as to a triumphant celebration, to which they were invited by Christ. They were exposed to the fury of wild beasts in the amphitheater at Carthage, A.D. 203, and finally killed by the sword.

Perpetua y Felicidad (se cree que murieron en el año 203 d. C.) fueron mártires cristianos del siglo III. Vibia Perpetua era una noble casada, que se dice que tenía 22 años al momento de su muerte y madre de un bebé que estaba amamantando. Felicidad, una esclava prisionera con ella y embarazada en ese momento, fue martirizada con ella. Fueron ejecutadas junto con otros en Cartago, en la provincia romana de África, durante el reinado de Septimio Severo. Conociendo su propia debilidad, pero confiando en la fuerza de Cristo, quien luchaba con ellos, se encaminaron al martirio como a una celebración triunfal, a la que Cristo los invitó. Fueron expuestos a la furia de las fieras en el anfiteatro de Cartago, en el año 203 d. C., y finalmente asesinados a espada. catholicireland.net * catholicculture.org

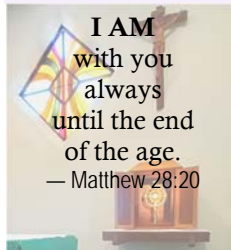
