The God we encounter in the Torah does not hesitate to punish those who disobey or break the commandments. When the Chosen People complain to Moses, accusing him of bringing them to the desert to die of thirst, and Moses complains to God, God could have made them pay for their insolence. But instead God quenches their thirst by taking a rock as hard as their hearts appear to be and imbuing it with flowing water. Similarly, Jesus does not shame the woman for her many marriages or her current lifestyle, but offers her living water, water that within her will well up to eternal life. Paul points out that Jesus went on to die for us on the cross while we were still sinners, saving us rather than condemning us. May we realize that the life-giving water we receive in baptism is a gift most undeserved.

El Dios que encontramos en la Torá no duda en castigar a quienes desobedecen o quebrantan los mandamientos. Cuando el pueblo escogido se queja a Moisés y lo acusa de haberlos llevado al desierto para morir de sed, Moisés se queja a Dios. Bien hubiera podido Dios hacer pagar al pueblo por su insolencia, pero Dios, por el contrario, sacia la sed de ellos al hacer que de una peña, tan dura como el corazón de ellos, brotara agua. De manera similar Jesús no avergüenza a la mujer por todos sus matrimonios y por la vida que actualmente lleva, sino que le ofrece el agua viva, que dentro de ella será un manantial hacia la vida eterna. Pablo señala que Jesús murió en la cruz cuando aún éramos pecadores y nos salva en vez de condenarnos. Que nos percatemos de que el agua viva que recibimos en el Bautismo es un don completamente inmerecido. — Palabras Pastorales

THIRSTING FOR LIFE-GIVING WATERS

Especially during the Lenten, Holy Week, and Easter seasons, the prayer texts of the Eastern Church revel in paradoxical images of Christ: the eternal life who is put to death, the host of the supper who is also its meal, the thirsty crucified one with living water streaming from his side. These images flow from the evangelists' portrayals of Jesus and from his very ministry, during which he often upset or reversed people's expectations about him or the ways of God. This “reversal” is at play in today's Gospel, as Jesus speaks to an enemy foreigner who is also a woman beneath his status. In addition he, the thirsting one, shows the woman to be the one truly thirsting. He—whose parched lips will say “I thirst” before he dies—is the source of life and life-giving water. Lent calls upon us to dwell on how each of us is thirsting for Christ, and it leads us, ultimately, back to the life-giving waters of our baptism into his Body.

SEDIENTOS DE LAS AGUAS QUE DAN VIDA

Especialmente durante la Cuaresma, la Semana Santa y el tiempo de Pascua, los textos de oración de la Iglesia Occidental se deleitan con imágenes paradójicas de Cristo: la vida eterna que muere, el anfitrión de la cena que es también alimento, el crucificado sediento del que mana agua de vida de su costado. Estas imágenes fluyen de las representaciones de Jesús por parte de los evangelistas y de su mismísimo ministerio, durante el cual muchas veces cambió o invirtió las expectativas que las personas tenían sobre él o sobre los designios de Dios. Esta “inversión” está en juego en el Evangelio de hoy, cuando Jesús habla con una extranjera enemiga que está por debajo de su condición social. Además él, el que tiene sed, demuestra que la mujer es la única que tiene sed verdadera. Él —cuyos labios secos dirán “Tengo sed” antes de morir— es la fuente de vida y del agua que da vida. La Cuaresma nos llama a reflexionar sobre cómo cada uno de nosotros tiene sed de Cristo y nos lleva, en última instancia, de vuelta a las aguas dadoras de vida de nuestro bautismo en su Cuerpo. SAINT FRANCES OF ROME (March 9) | SANTA FRANCESCA ROMANA (Marzo 9)

St. Frances of Rome, lay family woman, carer of the poor and sick during a plague and a healer. Born in Rome in 1384; died there on March 9 in 1440. Frances established a community of laywomen who followed the Rule of Saint Benedict (Oblates of Mary) and ministered to the poor, a dedicated laywoman who, in a time of plague and civil war, worked tirelessly for the poor and the sick yet without compromising her love for her husband and family. Eventually they bought a house where the widowed members could live in community. Frances's last words were: "The angel has finished his task – he beckons me to follow him". Possibly it was because she had such continuous contact with her guardian angel that Pius XI named her the patron saint of motorists.

Santa Francesca Romana, mujer laica de familia, cuidadora de pobres y enfermos durante una plaga y sanadora. Nacida en Roma en 1384; murió allí en 9 de Marzo en 1440. Francesca fundó una comunidad de mujeres laicas que seguían la Regla de San Benito (Oblatas de María) y atendían a los pobres. Una laica dedicada que, en tiempos de plaga y guerra civil, trabajó incansablemente por los pobres y los enfermos, pero sin comprometer su amor por su esposo y su familia. Finalmente, compraron una casa donde los miembros viudos pudieran vivir en comunidad. Las últimas palabras de Francesca fueron: "El ángel ha terminado su tarea; me llama a seguirlo". Posiblemente fue debido a su contacto tan continuo con su ángel de la guarda que Pío XI la nombró patrona de los automovilistas.



O God, who have given us in Saint Frances of Rome a singular model of both married and monastic life, grant us perseverance in your service, that in every circumstance of life we may see and follow you. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

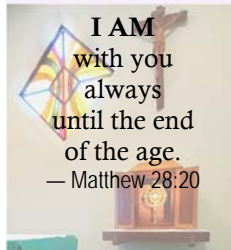
