33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 33º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

The images that both Malachi and Jesus envision regarding the end of the world are terrifying and foreboding. Jesus even prophesies that many of his followers will be put to death. But each ends his warnings with a huge reassurance. Malachi writes, “But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays” (Malachi 3:20). Those who remain faithful will be proven justified. Jesus says, “not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives” (Luke 21:18–19). Jesus here is looking past this life and on to eternal life. You will die, he tells his disciples, you may even be martyred, but you will not be destroyed, not even one little hair, for you will have new life in the Resurrection. During this Jubilee Year of Hope, this is the promise we cling to: that the injustices, tragedies, and hardships of this world are not the end. The end is eternal bliss in God’s presence. — *Pastoral Patterns*

Las imágenes que tanto Malaquías como Jesús visualizan con relación al final del mundo son aterradoras y fatídicas. Jesús hasta profetiza que matarán a muchos de sus discípulos. Pero tanto uno como el otro terminan sus advertencias con un inmenso consuelo. Malaquías escribe: “Pero para ustedes, los que temen al Señor, brillará el sol de la justicia, que les traerá la salvación en sus rayos” (Malaquías 3, 20). Aquellos que permanezcan fieles serán justificados. Jesús dice: “ni un cabello de su cabeza perecerá. Si se mantienen firmes, conseguirán la vida” (Lucas 21, 18–19). Aquí Jesús mira más allá de esta vida y hacia la vida eterna. Jesús les dice a sus discípulos que algunos de ellos morirán y aún serán martirizados, pero no serán destruidos, ni siquiera un cabello, porque tienen una vida nueva en la resurrección. Durante este Año Jubilar con el tema “Peregrinos de la esperanza” nos aferramos a esta promesa: que las injusticias, las tragedias y las adversidades de este mundo no tienen la última palabra. La última palabra la tiene la dicha eterna en la presencia de Dios. — *Palabras Pastorales*

THE WORK OF DISCIPLESHIP

It is easy to go through life non-reflectively, living the routines of our days and weeks without giving much thought to the larger questions of meaning, purpose, and calling. We may know we need to change but put it off, thinking we'll love, serve, and care more in the future. We may face trial personally and be weary of trying to live as we know we should. We witness discord, violence, and division and it may feel that it is the end of the world. Today's readings urge us to put laziness, fear, or distraction aside and get about the work of discipleship with the assurance that the Lord will provide what we need as we do so.

THE SUN OF JUSTICE WILL ARISE

It may seem as though Jesus is talking directly to us in today's Gospel. While it is always true that the Gospel speaks across time and space, today's message feels particularly appropriate as we near the end of another year that has been filled with pandemic, political division, international tension, and economic concerns. Christ reigns over all these things, and as Christians, we hold firm in the belief that we will as well. We must take the long view—the truly long view of eternity—as we meet the challenges of our time. The sun of justice will arise. All will be well.

NOT A HAIR ON YOUR HEAD WILL BE DESTROYED. PERSEVERE.

The message of the Gospel is not abstract, nor are we distant hearers of its message. We face choices every day about how we will live, what we will or won't do, how seriously we will take Christ's call to live the truth of the gospel. At times, the choices we face seem inconsequential: will we sit on the sofa night after night, or choose to spend time with family or serve in our parish? Will we get up for Mass on Sunday morning ready to praise God and be part of our faith community, or drag ourselves there, grumbling every step of the way (or not go at all)? Choices such as these are of consequence of course, not only because each decision matters, but the patterns we establish in our lives are rooted in the cumulative weight of the choices we make. We may be called upon to make harder choices and must be prepared to do so. Jesus tells us to persevere. By doing so, we will secure our lives.

LA VIDA ES DURA, PERO NO TENEMOS MIEDO

Las lecturas de hoy toman una mirada valiente a la realidad y llegan a la conclusión que todos sabemos, la vida es dura. El profeta Malaquías predica fuego y azufre, advirtiéndonos que los malhechores perecerán en llamas. San Pablo ofrece su propia advertencia a los tesalonicenses: manténgase ocupados, pero nunca en entrometidos. Él recuerda a los cristianos que los mismos apóstoles hicieron “trabajos pesados y penosos” como un modelo de cómo debemos contribuir a nuestra comunidad. El Evangelio regresa al tono apocalíptico de Malaquías, describiendo el caos total del final de los tiempos. Sabremos que el fin se acerca cuando la violencia, las catástrofes y el odio dominen la tierra. ¡Pero no debemos tener miedo! El plan de salvación de Dios nos da paz a nuestros corazones. EL FIN DE LOS DÍAS

Mientras nos preparamos para el próximo domingo para la fiesta de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo, escuchamos descripciones de acontecimientos funestos y catastróficos. A veces parece que nosotros mismos estamos viviendo el final de los tiempos, cuando la vida, así como actualmente la conocemos terminará para todos. En respuesta a lo que debe haber sido una pregunta temerosa, Jesús no endulza su predicción para los días futuros. Ni el profeta Malaquías del Antiguo Testamento flaquea de sus declaraciones sobre un mundo malvado. San Pablo, todavía escribiendo a los tesalonicenses, les advierte proféticamente en contra de caer en el síndrome de “El final se acerca”, es decir, a la pereza ante los últimos días. Sin embargo, tanto Jesús como Malaquías hablan de la recompensa por llevar una vida justa, curación y reivindicación. SCRIPTURAL BASIS FOR PRAYERS FOR THE DEAD

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us about the purpose of purgatory and the importance of praying for the dead:

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.

The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire:

As for certain lesser faults, we must believe that, before the Final Judgment, there is a purifying fire. He who is truth says that whoever utters blasphemy against the Holy Spirit will be pardoned neither in this age nor in the age to come. From this sentence we understand that certain offenses can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come.

This teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin." (2 Maccabees 12:46) From the beginning the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead:

Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them.

Pope's November prayer intention: **For the prevention of suicide**

Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

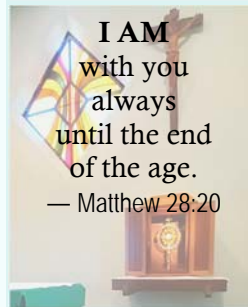
