

Throughout his ministry, Jesus gave life to those in need. Early on, it was to people who were ill or possessed by demons, freeing them from conditions that worsened or shattered their lives. He cured lepers, restoring them to life in society. He forgave the woman caught in adultery, saving her life. He raised Jairus's daughter, thought to be dead, and Lazarus, already entombed. Finally, he sacrificed his own life, saving us from the permanency of death when he was raised to eternal life. Therefore, we can rejoice, for in Jesus we have a Savior who offers us the fullness of life, both now and forever. — *Pastoral Patterns*

### LOOKING TO THE LAST DAY

Today the Church remembers all who have walked the way of Christ and passed from this life. The readings all look to the last day, when we shall all rise from the dead and be reunited.

The prophet Daniel announces words of warning and welfare. He cautions us against the judgment to come, but he also comforts us and assures us that all who live a life of virtue and justice will find life eternal.

The reading from Romans reminds us that, because of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection and our entrance into that paschal mystery through baptism, we now share in the new life won by Christ. This recognition has repercussions: we need to live righteously now, that we might rise to life forever with Christ on the last day.

In the Gospel Jesus pledges that all the Father has given him will not be lost. All the faithful will be raised to joy and live forever in the presence of God.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

For those of Mexican heritage, November 2 means celebration of *el Dia de Los Muertos*, or "the Day of the Dead." One of the most important days of the year for many, they join All Saints and All Souls together, visiting the graves of babies and children on All Saints, since they are *santitos* (little saints) or *angelitos* (little angels). Flowers, their favorite toys, favorite music, and so on, are taken to them. The following day, people spend time—some of them all day—at the cemetery with their loved ones who have died. From the ancient customs of the Indians the families pray, talk with them, and take them their favorite food. It is a most solemn but joyful day. It is a day to celebrate Christ's victory over death: "Death, where is your sting?" There is a mocking of death as people make skeletons, candy that represents death, and *Pan de los Muertos* (bread of the dead) and consume them in a kind of role reversal.

One of the customs is to build an *altarcito* (little altar) where one places mementos and pictures of those who have died. There are also favorite foods, candles, statues or pictures of favorite saints, books, and Bibles. Some parishes have begun to build an *altarcito* where all parishioners can join in honoring the deceased. A remembrance book can be placed to write names in. The *altarcito* is traditionally left up for the month of November.

### MIRANDO HACIA EL ÚLTIMO DÍA

Hoy la Iglesia recuerda a todos los que han seguido el camino de Cristo y han partido de esta vida. Las lecturas apuntan al último día, cuando todos resucitaremos de entre los muertos y nos reuniremos con Dios.

### TESOROS DE NUESTRA TRADICIÓN

Para quienes tienen ascendencia mexicana, el 2 de noviembre significa la celebración del Día de los Muertos. Es uno de los días más importantes del año para muchos, pues une la celebración de Todos los Santos y la de los Fieles Difuntos, visitando las tumbas de bebés y niños el Día de Todos los Santos, ya que son santos o angelitos. Se les llevan flores, sus juguetes favoritos, su música preferida, etc. Al día siguiente, la gente pasa tiempo — algunos todo el día— en el cementerio con sus seres queridos fallecidos. Según las antiguas costumbres indígenas, las familias rezan, hablan con ellos y les llevan su comida favorita. Es un día solemne, pero a la vez alegre. Es un día para celebrar la victoria de Cristo sobre la muerte: «Muerte, ¿dónde está tu aguijón?». Se burlan de la muerte al hacer esqueletos, dulces que la representan y pan de los muertos, que consumen en una especie de inversión de roles.

Una de las costumbres es construir un altarcito donde se colocan recuerdos y fotos de los difuntos. También se incluyen comidas favoritas, velas, estatuas o imágenes de santos predilectos, libros y Biblias. Algunas parroquias han comenzado a construir un altarcito donde todos los feligreses pueden participar en el homenaje a los difuntos. Se puede colocar un libro de condolencias para escribir los nombres. Tradicionalmente, el altarcito permanece durante todo el mes de noviembre. —Rev. James Field, Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

## NOVEMBER: Month dedicated to the Souls in Purgatory



*Prayer for  
the Souls in  
Purgatory  
By St. Gertrude*

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, for those in my own home and within my family.  
Amen.

*The Prayer of St. Gertrude, above, is one of the most famous of the prayers for souls in purgatory. St. Gertrude was a Benedictine nun and mystic who lived in the 13th century. According to tradition, our Lord promised her that 1000 souls would be released from purgatory each time it is said devoutly.*

### MONTH OF THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise.

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with

godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." We know that a defiled soul cannot enter into heaven. source: catholicculture.org

### INDULGENCES

A partial indulgence can be obtained by devoutly visiting a cemetery and praying for the departed, even if the prayer is only mental. One can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between November 1 and November 8. These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory.

A plenary indulgence, again applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is also granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a public oratory on November 2. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required, that one Our Father and the Creed be recited.

A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, can be obtained when the Eternal Rest (*Requiem aeternam*) is prayed. This is a good prayer to recite especially during the month of November:

*Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.*

### Pope's November prayer intention: **For the prevention of suicide**




