Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe  
Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo

Nearly everyone Jesus encounters in his final hours misunderstands him. The rulers, the soldiers, even one of the criminals crucified alongside him cannot understand why he saved others but has not chosen to save himself. They cannot imagine why someone sent by God as Messiah and King would allow himself to die on a cross. They do not realize that he came to save others, not save himself. They do not realize that he came to bring forgiveness and mercy to enable us to cope with human suffering, not to rid the world of the suffering that is part of being human. They do not realize that he did not come to save us from death in the way that he saved Lazarus—who would go on to die once more—but to lead us past death to new life in the kingdom of God. Surrounding Jesus on the cross, only one man understands. — *Pastoral Patterns*

Las imágenes que tanto Malaquías como Jesús visualizan con relación al final del mundo son aterradoras y fatídicas. Jesús hasta profetiza que matarán a muchos de sus discípulos. Pero tanto uno como el otro terminan sus advertencias con un inmenso consuelo. Malaquías escribe: “Pero para ustedes, los que temen al Señor, brillará el sol de la justicia, que les traerá la salvación en sus rayos” (Malaquías 3, 20). Aquellos que permanezcan fieles serán justificados. Jesús dice: “ni un cabello de su cabeza perecerá. Si se mantienen firmes, conseguirán la vida” (Lucas 21, 18–19). Aquí Jesús mira más allá de esta vida y hacia la vida eterna. Jesús les dice a sus discípulos que algunos de ellos morirán y aún serán martirizados, pero no serán destruidos, ni siquiera un cabello, porque tienen una vida nueva en la resurrección. Durante este Año Jubilar con el tema “Peregrinos de la esperanza” nos aferramos a esta promesa: que las injusticias, las tragedias y las adversidades de este mundo no tienen la última palabra. La última palabra la tiene la dicha eterna en la presencia de Dios.

## FEAST OF THE KINGSHIP OF JESUS CHRIST

The kingship of Jesus Christ has been affirmed going back to when Jesus was called the Messiah, but the actual feast was only added to the liturgical calendar one hundred years ago, in 1925. In the wake of World War I, history's first truly global war, Pope Pius XI created the feast as the antithesis of the divisive nationalism that led men to take up arms against their brothers, as well as an antidote to the growing secularism that denied the world's unity under God. One hundred years later and nearly two thousand years after Jesus began his public ministry, we still recognize his kingship over all the earth. Pastoral Patterns

## OF KINGS AND KINGSHIP

Americans have an uncomfortable relationship with kings. The American Revolution was fought for independence from King George, after all. Nonetheless, today every Catholic church around the world celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Today's feast invites us to look beyond our national loyalties and rejoice in our primary identity. We are children of God in Jesus, Christ the King. Our readings help us consider what it's like to belong to God's kingdom. The book of Samuel captures the deep longing of the Israelites for a king to shepherd them. Saint Paul reminds the Colossians that we belong to the kingdom of Christ, whose power he praises in a beautiful hymn. Finally, Luke's Gospel calls to mind the kind of king Jesus chooses to be—a suffering servant, a man for others. By sacrificing his life for us, Jesus throws open the gates of Paradise. ## THE TRUE KINGSHIP OF JESUS CHRIST

What kind of King is Jesus? How do you envision him? Remembering that they were promised a king from the line of David, the Israelites hoped for a Messiah who would set their political problems aright and bring about a worldly kingdom of Judaic power. Even Psalm 122 seems to describe this type of ruler. Luke's Gospel today shreds that image after the whip of the Roman soldiers tore at Jesus' flesh. Still, the Romans flaunted the traditional notion with their ironic inscription above King Jesus' crown of thorns. Soldiers and ordinary people jeered the royal title at him. Yet the throne of Jesus was the cross of Christ, from which he dispensed kingly mercy and justice toward the humble criminal who shared his execution. Writing to the Colossians, Saint Paul describes the truth about Jesus and his kingship, using words like fullness, peace, and forgiveness. So let us go rejoicing!

### **SOLEMNIDAD DEL REINADO DE JESUCRISTO**

El reinado de Jesucristo ha sido afirmado desde el tiempo en que Jesús fue llamado el Mesías, pero la solemnidad de hoy fue añadida al calendario litúrgico hace sólo cien años, en 1925. Tras la Primera Guerra Mundial, la primera guerra que incluyó al mundo entero, el papa Pío XI creó esta solemnidad como la antítesis al nacionalismo divisorio que condujo a los hombres a tomar las armas contra sus hermanos; también la creó como un antídoto al crecimiento del secularismo que negaba la unidad del mundo bajo Dios. Cien años más tarde y casi dos mil años después que Jesús empezara su ministerio público, reconocemos aún hoy su reinado sobre toda la tierra.

### **DE REYES Y REINADOS**

Los estadounidenses tienen una relación incómoda con los reyes. La Revolución Estadounidense se peleó para lograr la independencia del Rey Jorge, después de todo. Sin embargo, hoy cada iglesia católica alrededor del mundo celebra la Solemnidad del Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. La celebración de hoy de la Iglesia nos invita a ver más allá de nuestras lealtades nacionales y regocijarnos en nuestra primera identidad. Somos hijos de Dios en Jesús, Cristo el Rey. Nuestras lecturas nos ayudan a considerar cómo pertenecer al Reino de Dios. El libro de Samuel captura el profundo anhelo de los israelitas por un rey que los pastoree. San Pablo recuerda a los colosenses que pertenecemos al reino de Cristo, cuyo poder alaba en un hermoso himno. Por último, el Evangelio de Lucas evoca el tipo de rey que Jesús elige ser, un siervo sufriente, un hombre para los demás. Al sacrificar su vida por nosotros, Jesús abre las puertas del Paraíso. ### **LA VERDADERA REALEZA DE JESUCRISTO**

¿Qué clase de Rey es Jesús? ¿Cómo te lo imaginas? Recordando que se les prometió un rey del linaje de David, los israelitas esperaban a un Mesías que arreglara sus problemas políticos y trajera un reino terrenal de poder judaico. Incluso el salmo 122 parece describir este tipo de gobernante. El Evangelio de Lucas de hoy destruye esta imagen después de que el látigo de los soldados romanos desgarrara la carne de Jesús. Sin embargo, los romanos hicieron alarde de esa noción tradicional con la inscripción irónica en el letrero que pusieron sobre la cabeza de Jesús que está coronada con espinas. Los soldados y la gente de a pie se burlaban de su título de realeza. Sin embargo, el trono de Jesús era la cruz de Cristo, desde la que administraba misericordia y justicia majestuosa hacía el criminal humilde que compartía su ejecución. Al escribir a los colosenses, san Pablo describe la verdad sobre Jesús y su realeza, utilizando palabras como plenitud, paz y perdón. Así que ¡vamos a alegrarnos! Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

By St. Gertrude*

Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, for those in my own home and within my family.  
Amen.

*The Prayer of St. Gertrude, above, is one of the most famous of the prayers for souls in purgatory. St. Gertrude was a Benedictine nun and mystic who lived in the 13th century. According to tradition, our Lord promised her that 1000 souls would be released from purgatory each time it is said devoutly.*

### TEACHINGS OF POPE ST. JOHN PAUL II ON THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

*Pope St. John Paul II also encouraged prayers for the dead:*

Joined to the merits of the saints, our fraternal prayer comes to the aid of those who await the beatific vision. Intercession for the dead, just as the life of those living according to the divine commandments, obtains the merits that serve the full attainment of salvation. It is an expression of the fraternal charity of the one family of God, by which “we are faithful to the Church’s deepest vocation” (Lumen gentium, n. 51): “to save souls who will love God eternally” (Thérèse of Lisieux, Prayers, 6; cf. Manuscript A 77r<sup>o</sup>). For the souls in purgatory, waiting for eternal happiness and for meeting the Beloved is a source of suffering, because of the punishment due to sin which separates them from God. But there is also the certitude that once the time of purification is over, the soul will go to meet the One it desires (cf. Ps 42; 62).

### POPE FRANCIS ON PRAYING FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

*Pope Francis teaches that:*

Even now we experience a communion between the Church on earth and the Church in heaven through our union with those who have died. The souls in heaven assist us with their prayers, while we assist the souls in purgatory through our good works, prayer and participation in the Eucharist. As members of the Church then, the distinction is not between who has died and who is living, but rather who is in Christ and who is not...

There is a deep and indissoluble bond between those who are still pilgrims in this world – us – and those who have crossed the threshold of death and entered eternity. All baptized persons here on earth, the souls in Purgatory and all the blessed who are already in Paradise make one great Family. This communion between earth and heaven is realized especially in intercessory prayer.

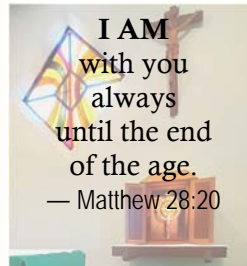
