



## Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome Dedicación de la Basílica de Letrán

In today's Gospel, Jesus refers to his body as a temple, confusing the authorities because they assume that he is speaking of destroying the Jewish temple. But keep in mind that this dialogue occurs after another action of Jesus': the cleansing of the temple of whatever didn't belong. We too must clean the temples of our bodies from whatever doesn't belong, for instance the "marketplace" of our secular culture, which judges everything by its material worth. Since this way of thinking can unconsciously seep into our lives, we are challenged today to cleanse ourselves of making financial matters our overriding priority. After all, if we are temples of God, we should not have "marketplaces" within us.

En el Evangelio de hoy Jesús se refiere a su cuerpo como un templo, lo cual confunde a las autoridades que asumen que él habla de destruir el templo judío. Pero recordemos que este diálogo ocurre después de otra obra de Jesús: la limpieza del templo de todo lo que no pertenece allí. También nosotros debemos limpiar el templo de nuestros cuerpos para quitar todo lo que no pertenece ahí, por ejemplo el "mercado" de nuestra cultura secular, que todo lo juzga según su valor material. Ya que esta manera de pensar puede calarse inconscientemente en nuestra vida, aceptemos el reto hoy de limpiarnos del hacer de los asuntos financieros nuestra prioridad imperiosa. Después de todo, si somos templos de Dios, no debemos tener un "mercado" dentro de nosotros.

### **THE TEMPLE AND WORSHIP**

In all of today's readings, the temple is prominently mentioned. Ezekiel speaks of streams of living water flowing out from the temple, watering the desert, bringing life to all living things, offering fresh healing to God's people.

Paul reminds the Corinthians that their faith rests upon the firmest of foundations, Christ himself. More than that, Paul reveals that those who follow Christ are themselves temples, temples of the Holy Spirit; that is, God dwells not only with them, but in them.

For the Jews of Jesus' time, the temple had come to be identified with the presence of God and the only place where authentic worship of God took place. Jesus had a different perception. Jesus identified himself not with the temple, but as the temple. In so doing, Jesus indicated a dramatic shift in what it means to worship God, to be in God's presence. No longer was a place to be the focus of prayer. Instead, a person, the person of Jesus Christ, becomes the center of our worship. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

### **MOTHER AND HEAD OF ALL THE CHURCHES**

The Lateran Basilica in Rome, the only church building whose dedication is celebrated as a feast, is an enduring symbol of the universal church. Inscribed on its façade is "omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput," meaning, "mother and head of all the churches of the city and of the world." Originally completed in 324 CE, soon after Emperor Constantine legalized Christianity, the Lateran Basilica is a sign of the triumph of the faithful who survived underground for generations when Christians were persecuted. Although we likely are gathered in a much humbler setting today, we are nonetheless inextricably linked to this historic church—our mother church. —Pastoral Patterns

### **BUILDING UP THE KINGDOM OF GOD**

It is unlikely that there is an actual stream of water flowing out from this church we worship in. If there is, we may need to look for a busted pipe! But as we leave this celebration of the Eucharist today, we can be that life-giving water flowing from this church building. Since the Spirit of God dwells in us, we are able to bring the presence of God from this gathering to whomever we encounter throughout the week. On this day when we celebrate the dedication of the mother church built in Rome, we rededicate ourselves to building up the kingdom of God here in the shadow of our own parish church, aware that both celebrate their foundation in Jesus Christ. —Pastoral Patterns

### EL TEMPLO Y LA ADORACIÓN

En todas las lecturas de hoy, el Templo es mencionado predominantemente. Ezequiel habla de aguas vivas que fluyen del Templo, regando el desierto, trayendo vida a todas las cosas vivientes, brindando salud y frescor al pueblo de Dios.

Pablo recuerda a los corintios que su fe reposa sobre bases firmes, Cristo mismo. Más que eso, Pablo les revela que quienes siguen a Cristo son templos ellos mismos, templos del Espíritu Santo, es decir, que Dios no solamente habita con ellos, sino dentro de ellos.

Para los judíos de los tiempos de Jesús, el Templo era identificado con la presencia de Dios y como el lugar santo en donde la verdadera adoración a Dios tenía lugar. Jesús tenía una percepción diferente. Jesús se identifica a sí mismo no con el Templo, sino como el templo. Al hacerlo, Jesús mostró un cambio dramático en lo que significa adorar a Dios, estar en la presencia de Dios. Ya no sería un sitio el centro de oración. ### MADRE Y CABEZA DE TODAS LAS IGLESIAS

La Basílica de Letrán en Roma, el único edificio de una iglesia que se celebra como una fiesta, es un símbolo imperecedero de la Iglesia universal. En su fachada está escrito “omnium Urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput”, lo cual significa “madre y cabeza de todas las iglesias de la ciudad y del mundo”. La Basílica de Letrán original se terminó de construir en el año 324 D.C., poco después de que el emperador Constantino legalizara el cristianismo, y es un signo del triunfo de los creyentes que sobrevivieron el clandestinaje durante generaciones durante las cuales los cristianos eran perseguidos. Aunque probablemente estemos reunidos en un lugar mucho más humilde, no obstante estamos vinculados inextricablemente a esa histórica iglesia—nuestra iglesia madre. – Palabras Pastorales

### CONSTRUIR EL REINO DE DIOS

Dado que el Espíritu de Dios habita en nosotros, podemos llevar la presencia de –Dios desde nuestra congregación hasta todos aquellos con quienes nos encontremos durante la semana. En este día en que celebramos la dedicación de la madre iglesia construida en Roma, renovamos nuestra dedicación a construir el Reino de Dios aquí a las sombras de nuestra propia iglesia parroquial, conscientes de que tanto la de Roma como la nuestra celebra su fundación en Jesucristo. – Palabras Pastorales


