27th Sunday in Ordinary Time 27º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

The scenario Jesus paints today with the servant seems rather heartless. The master is quite demanding, commanding the tired servant to work some more, then feeling entitled instead of grateful. Are we those “unprofitable servants” now (Luke 17:10), obligated to obey God’s commands without expecting appreciation, let alone love? Perhaps we should look at those words separately. Recall that when Jesus told his disciples they must take up their cross, he asked, “What profit is there for one to gain the whole world yet lose or forfeit himself?” (Luke 9:25). We should not look for profit in worldly accomplishments; in that sense we want to be unprofitable. Putting aside the negative connotations of servanthood, we believe that we are called to serve God. What we do in service of the gospel, which we are obliged to do by our baptism, fulfills our faith. — *Pastoral Patterns*

La situación hipotética que describe Jesús hoy con el siervo parece bastante insensible. El amo es bien exigente, ordenando al siervo cansado trabajar más y arriba de eso se siente con ese derecho en vez de mostrarse agradecido. ¿Acaso pensamos erróneamente que ahora nosotros “no somos más que siervos” (Lucas 17, 10), obligados a obedecer los mandatos de Dios sin esperar agradecimiento y mucho menos amor? Recordemos por un momento que cuando Jesús les dijo a sus discípulos que debían cargar sus cruces también les propuso la pregunta, “¿de qué le sirve al hombre ganar todo el mundo, si se pierde a sí mismo o se destruye?” (Lucas 9, 25). Hay que echar a un lado las connotaciones negativas de servidumbre, porque eso no es lo mismo que servir a Dios, lo cual es ponernos al servicio del Evangelio y lo cual estamos obligados a hacer en virtud de nuestro Bautismo. Ser siervos de Dios, que nos ama, no es lo mismo que ser serviles como lo entiende el mundo.

THE STRENGTH OF GOD

The mulberry tree is especially difficult to uproot, as it has an extensive root system. One can only imagine how difficult it would be two thousand years ago, without the excavating equipment we have available to us today. And yet the task is no match for a small amount of faith. We may have had occasion ourselves to rely on as much faith as we can muster to cope with the grief of the loss of a loved one, to overcome an addiction, or to survive a tragedy in our lives. We probably did not know how strong our faith was until we put it to the test. These same apostles needed to do the same thing after the death of the Lord on the cross. We have the advantage of knowing that God is stronger than death, that Jesus is the resurrection and the life, and that the Holy Spirit is with us forever. Pastoral Patterns

A LITTLE FAITH

Today our readings are about faith, frustration, and how much is enough. Habakkuk is a complainer having an argument with God. Timothy is encouraging a community challenged by cowardice and the apostles want more faith than they have. Things aren't happening fast enough for any of them or for us. All of them and we want God to do something sooner rather than later and we want God to give us a reason to believe that it will all work out. What does God do? God puts it back on them—and us—telling Habakkuk to describe the world he wants; telling the apostles to do more than the expected. Doing more with less is a familiar phrase today and a reminder that a little faith may be enough even for the most difficult times. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

THE GIFT OF FAITH

Faith is a gift. When the disciples asked Jesus to increase their faith, they were going to the source of that faith with their request. God is the giver of all good gifts, including faith. When we put our faith in Christ, we believe that with us, even though we cannot physically see God. Or can we? If we are attentive, we see the evidence of God's presence in the love of family and friends, care poured out in service of our neighbors, the living beauty of creation. This is not blind faith, but rather is the result of seeing with the eyes of faith. LA FUERZA DE DIOS

Un árbol frondoso es difícil de arrancar de raíz porque sus raíces se extienden. Uno sólo puede imaginarse lo difícil que sería arrancarlo hace dos mil años sin los equipos excavadores que tenemos hoy. Y sin embargo ese cometido no puede competir con la fe, aunque fuese pequeña. Puede que a nosotros mismos se nos haya presentado la ocasión en que dependimos de toda la fe que pudimos sacar para poder enfrentar la pena de perder a un ser querido o de vencer una adicción o de sobrevivir una tragedia en nuestra vida. UN POCO DE FE

Hoy nuestras lecturas acerca de la fe, la frustración y cuánto es suficiente. El profeta Habacuc es un quejoso que tiene una discusión con Dios. Timoteo está animando a una comunidad desafiada por la cobardía y los apóstoles quieren más fe de la que tienen. Las cosas no suceden lo suficientemente rápido para ninguno de ellos. Todos ellos y nosotros queremos que Dios haga algo mucho más antes que después y queremos que Dios nos dé una razón para creer que todo saldrá bien. ¿Qué es lo que quiere Dios? Dios se lo devuelve a ellos, y a nosotros, diciéndole a Habacuc que describa el mundo que él quiere; diciéndole a los apóstoles hacer más de lo que se espera. EL DON DE LA FE

October: Month of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. According to an account by fifteenth-century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others.

“Since the prayers of the Rosary come from such excellent sources — from Our Lord Himself, from inspired Scripture, and from the Church — it is not surprising that the Rosary is so dear to our Blessed Mother and so powerful with heaven.

“If we consider the power of the Rosary as seen in its effects, we find a great abundance of proofs of its wonderful value. Many are the favors granted to private individuals through its devout recitation: there are few devoted users of the Rosary who cannot testify to experiencing its power in their own lives. If we turn to history, we see many great triumphs of the Rosary. Early tradition attributes the defeat of the Albigensians at the Battle of Muret in 1213 to the Rosary. But even those who do not accept this tradition will admit that St. Pius V attributed the great defeat of the Turkish fleet on the first Sunday of October, 1571, to the fact that at the same time the Rosary confraternities at Rome and elsewhere were holding their processions. Accordingly, he ordered a commemoration of the Rosary to be made on that day. Two years later, Gregory XIII allowed the celebration of a feast of the Rosary in churches having an altar dedicated to the Rosary. In 1671, Clement X extended the feast to all Spain. A second great victory over the Turks, who once, like the Russians, threatened the ruin of Christian civilization, occurred on August 5, 1716, when Prince Eugene defeated them at Peterwardein in Hungary. Thereupon Clement XI extended the feast of the Rosary to the whole Church.

“Today, when dangers far greater than those of the ancient Turks threaten not only Christianity but all civilization, we are urged by our Blessed Mother to turn again to the Rosary for help. If men in sufficient numbers do this, and at the same time carry out the other conditions that she has laid down, we have the greater reason for confidence that we will be delivered from our dangers.”


