25th Sunday in Ordinary Time 25° Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Jesus leaves a little something out of his lesson on the responsible use of material wealth. He teaches us that it is important to be trustworthy with dishonest wealth so that we can be trusted with true wealth. But he does not tell his disciples what he means by “true wealth” (Luke 16:11). He contrasts God and mammon, so we know that it is different from material wealth. He speaks often about the kingdom, so we can guess that true wealth will lead us there. The selection from Paul’s first letter to Timothy leads us to one key example of true wealth. Paul writes that “Christ Jesus . . . gave himself as ransom for all” (1 Timothy 2:5–6). We usually think of ransom as a very large amount of money paid to free someone held captive. But here Paul uses ransom to mean a very high price that Jesus paid to free us from the captivity of sin. Rather than material wealth that could be put into a bag or bank account, this true wealth is Jesus’ life, which he freely gives to win us salvation. — *Pastoral Patterns*

Jesús deja algo afuera en su lección de ser responsables en el uso de las riquezas. Él nos enseña que es importante actuar fiablemente con las riquezas deshonestas de manera que podamos ser fiables con la verdadera riqueza. Pero no les dice a sus discípulos lo que él quiere decir con “los bienes verdaderos” (Lucas 16, 11). Él hace un contraste entre Dios y el dinero, lo que nos da a entender que los bienes verdaderos no son los materiales. Él habla con frecuencia acerca del Reino, por lo tanto podemos asumir que la verdadera riqueza nos llevará allí. El pasaje de la primera carta de Pablo a Timoteo nos señala un ejemplo clave de la riqueza verdadera. Pablo escribe que “Cristo Jesús . . . se entregó como rescate por todos” (1 Timoteo 2, 5–6). Usualmente pensamos en un rescate como una cantidad grande de dinero pagado para liberar a un cautivo, pero Pablo usa aquí la palabra rescate para referirse al gran precio que Jesús pagó para liberarnos de la cautividad del pecado. En vez del dinero que puede ponerse en una bolsa o en una cuenta bancaria, la verdadera riqueza es la vida de Jesús, que entregó sin reservas para ganarnos nuestra salvación. — *Palabras Pastorales*

Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

COUNTER TO OUR EXPECTATIONS

When we listen to the scriptures at liturgy, there is kind of an unspoken idea that we will hear something amazing and uplifting, that will stir our hearts into flame and make us better Catholics, better Christians, better people, as we carry the Living Word of God out in our lives. So how surprising is it when we get a day like today, when so much seems to run counter to our expectations? Amos warns us about cheating and taking away someone's rights. In Paul's first letter to Timothy, he explains we must pray for everyone, no matter what we think of them, even if they are in a place of power and authority. And Jesus' praise of the "children of this world" in today's Gospel passage is really disconcerting!

JUSTICE FOR ALL

When we grasp a better understanding of Amos, it really is a mirror of the Gospel message that we must be good stewards and offer kindness and justice to all. Remember that Jesus is in the midst of speaking through a series of parables. (We left off with the Prodigal Son last week.) When he is speaking of the steward, he is not telling us to get into money laundering or get-rich-quick schemes or engage in multi-level marketing. Rather, we can infer that we are to use our goods and our skills wisely and for the betterment of everyone. In the parable the steward is praised for his quick thinking and for finding a way to resolve the situation. The parable ends with Jesus telling us "You cannot serve God and mammon" and you must make a choice.

EVERYTHING IS A CHOICE

The Gospel parable tells us what the steward did one time to get out of a bind. But we are called to make the right choice, the best choice over and over. Sometimes it is hard. You may not be choosing between good and evil, but sometimes even have to choose between two goods. We frequently have to make choices like, "Do I spend this extra time at work to get that promotion? Do I bring the work home with me? Or am I able to leave it there and be with my family when I am done?" Parents often have to look at their savings account before they determine which activities they can afford for their children to participate in. Music and sports and the arts are wonderful, but all require special equipment and time. But making a sacrifice on everybody's part might reap great rewards. Sometimes, though, the choice is made to just get food on the table, or to clothe the family. We learn to make the choices that are best for ourselves and are decisions we can live with. We learn to discern what is best for those we love.

CONTRA NUESTRAS EXPECTATIVAS

Cuando escuchamos las Escrituras en la liturgia, existe la idea tácita de que escucharemos algo asombroso y edificante, que encenderá nuestros corazones y nos hará mejores católicos, mejores cristianos, mejores personas, al llevar la Palabra Viva de Dios a nuestras vidas. Entonces, ¿qué tan sorprendente es cuando nos encontramos en un día como hoy, cuando tanto parece ir en contra de nuestras expectativas? Amós nos advierte sobre el engaño y la privación de los derechos de alguien. En la primera carta de Pablo a Timoteo, explica que debemos orar por todos, sin importar lo que pensemos de ellos, incluso si están en una posición de poder y autoridad. ¡Y la alabanza de Jesús a los "hijos de este mundo" en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy es realmente desconcertante!

JUSTICIA PARA TODOS

Cuando comprendemos mejor a Amós, vemos que refleja el mensaje del Evangelio: debemos ser buenos administradores y ofrecer bondad y justicia a todos. Recordemos que Jesús nos habla mediante una serie de parábolas. (La semana pasada, terminamos con el Hijo Pródigo). Cuando habla del administrador, no nos dice que blanqueemos dinero, ni que nos enriquezcamos rápidamente, ni que nos involucremos en el marketing multinivel. Más bien, podemos inferir que debemos usar nuestros bienes y habilidades con sabiduría y para el bien de todos. En la parábola, se elogia al administrador por su rapidez de pensamiento y por encontrar la manera de resolver la situación. La parábola termina con Jesús diciéndonos: "No podéis servir a Dios y a las riquezas" y que debéis tomar una decisión.

TODO ES UNA ELECCIÓN

La parábola del Evangelio nos cuenta lo que hizo el mayordomo una vez para salir de un apuro. Pero estamos llamados a tomar la decisión correcta, la mejor opción una y otra vez. A veces es difícil. Puede que no tengas que elegir entre el bien y el mal, pero a veces incluso tienes que elegir entre dos cosas buenas. Con frecuencia tenemos que tomar decisiones como: "¿Dedico este tiempo extra al trabajo para conseguir ese ascenso? ¿Me llevo el trabajo a casa? ¿O puedo dejarlo ahí y estar con mi familia cuando termine?". Los padres a menudo tienen que revisar sus ahorros antes de decidir qué actividades pueden permitirse para sus hijos. La música, los deportes y las artes son maravillosos, pero todos requieren equipo y tiempo especiales. Sin embargo, hacer un sacrificio por parte de todos puede traer grandes recompensas. A veces, sin embargo, la elección se hace simplemente para poner comida en la mesa o para vestir a la familia. Aprendemos a tomar las decisiones que son mejores para nosotros y con las que podemos vivir. Aprendemos a discernir qué es lo mejor para quienes amamos.

Fr. Faber on the Seven Sorrows

God vouchsafed to select the very things about Him which are most incommunicable, and in a most mysteriously real way communicate them to her. See how He had already mixed her up with the eternal designs of creation, making her almost a partial cause and partial model of it. Our Lady's co-operation in the redemption of the world gives us a fresh view of her magnificence. Neither the Immaculate Conception nor the Assumption will give us a higher idea of Mary's exaltation than the title of co-redemptrix. Her sorrows were not necessary for the redemption of the world, but in the counsels of God they were inseparable from it. They belong to the integrity of the divine plan. Are not Mary's mysteries Jesus' mysteries, and His mysteries hers? The truth appears to be that all the mysteries of Jesus and Mary were in God's design as one mystery. Jesus Himself was Mary's sorrow, seven times repeated, aggravated sevenfold. During the hours of the Passion, the offering of Jesus and the offering of Mary were tied in one. They kept pace together; they were made of the same materials; they were perfumed with kindred fragrance; they were lighted with the same fire; they were offered with kindred dispositions. The two things were one simultaneous oblation, interwoven each moment through the thickly crowded mysteries of that dread time, unto the eternal Father, out of two sinless hearts, that were the hearts of Son and Mother, for the sins of a guilty world which fell on them contrary to their merits, but according to their own free will. — Fr. Frederick Faber, *The Foot of the Cross*.

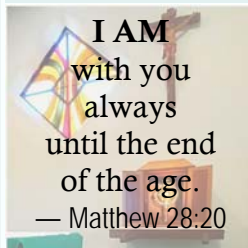
