# First Sunday of Lent Primer Domingo de Cuaresma

### GOSPEL REFLECTION:

*The readings for the 1st Sunday of Lent Year C emphasize the importance of wholeheartedly surrendering ourselves to God. Moses instructs offering the best to the Lord, the psalm sings of deliverance, Paul urges following Jesus with both heart and mind, and the gospel portrays Jesus resisting temptation in the desert, trusting in God. The themes encompass giving ourselves to God, preparing for our mission, and facing and overcoming temptation.*

## RELYING ON GOD

Face it, the last couple of years have worn us all down. Sometimes we don't know how to pray, or we don't seem to find the words we want. It is easy to falter and waver. Lent is a time to get back to the basics. There is much hope and strength in our readings as we begin our Lenten journey. The letter to the Romans tells us today that "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved," and this is an idea we hear throughout the scriptures. Psalm 91 shows us exactly how to cry for help, "Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble." In Deuteronomy, Moses teaches the people to bring their firstfruit offerings to God, and put their faith and trust in God, and Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel that we find our life in the word of God.

## GOOD ZEAL AND TEMPTATIONS

In the chapter of Luke preceding today's Gospel, Jesus was baptized in the Jordan and began his adult ministry. Immediately afterward he was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tested. While this might seem almost surreal as we imagine the devil taking Jesus from place to place, it is really much more simple and common than that. For many of us, as we strive to live our lives, we deal with many temptations. Sometimes it is a matter of having the zeal and desire, but not the practical experience or knowledge to carry out a goal. Other times, we are afraid to ask for the assistance that we need to carry a project through to completion. Or we might think that we deserve more, or that our results should be happening more quickly. Our egos can be destructive.

## KNOWING YOUR TOUCHSTONES

When Jesus found himself tested by the devil, he was given several different scenarios. The devil brought up situations that he knew could specifically test Jesus, but similar situations would test any of us. Physical hunger is a real need, and many of us might yearn for success, or better paying jobs, or power, or the like. The difference is that when Jesus was tempted, he had some strong "touchstones" to hold onto, secure answers to lead him. He went to simple, basic scriptures that he could call upon in his time of need. For many, one of those basics would be Jeremiah, "I know the plans I have in mind for you—plans for peace and not disaster." For another it might be the Beatitudes or the twenty-third Psalm. Whatever it may be, have ready those touchstones, those "go to" prayers or phrases that you can hold onto during the times when you are sorely tested in your life. Let those stones be your firm foundation.

**PRIMER DOMINGO DE CUARESMA**

### CONFIANDO EN DIOS

Reconócelo, los últimos dos años nos han desgastado a todos. A veces no sabemos cómo rezar, o parece que no encontramos las palabras que queremos. Es fácil flaquear y vacilar. La Cuaresma es un tiempo para volver a lo básico. Hay mucha esperanza y fuerza en nuestras lecturas al comenzar nuestro viaje cuaresmal. La carta a los romanos nos dice hoy que “todo el que invoque el nombre del Señor se salvará”, y esta es una idea que escuchamos a lo largo de las Escrituras. El salmo 91 nos muestra exactamente cómo clamar por ayuda: “Acompáñame, Señor, cuando esté en apuros”. En el libro del Deuteronomio, Moisés enseña al pueblo a traer sus ofrendas de primicias a Dios, y a poner su fe y confianza en Dios, y Jesús nos enseña en el Evangelio de hoy que encontramos nuestra vida en la palabra de Dios.

### BUEN CELO Y TENTACIONES

En el capítulo de Lucas que precede al Evangelio de hoy, Jesús fue bautizado en el Jordán y comenzó su ministerio de adulto. Inmediatamente después fue conducido por el Espíritu al desierto para ser probado. Aunque esto podría parecer casi surrealista, ya que nos imaginamos al diablo llevando a Jesús de un lugar a otro, en realidad es mucho más sencillo y común que eso. Para muchos de nosotros, mientras nos esforzamos por vivir nuestras vidas, nos enfrentamos a muchas tentaciones. A veces se trata de tener el celo y el deseo, pero no la experiencia práctica o el conocimiento para llevar a cabo un objetivo. Otras veces, tenemos miedo de pedir la ayuda que necesitamos para llevar a cabo un proyecto. O podemos pensar que nos merecemos más, o que nuestros resultados deberían producirse más rápidamente. Nuestro ego puede ser destructivo.

### CONOCIENDO TUS REFERENTES

Quando Jesús se encontró con la prueba del diablo, se le dieron varios escenarios diferentes. El diablo planteó situaciones que sabía que podían poner a prueba a Jesús, pero situaciones similares nos pondrían a prueba a cualquiera de nosotros. El hambre física es una necesidad real, y muchos de nosotros podemos anhelar el éxito, o un trabajo mejor pagado, o el poder, o cosas similares. La diferencia es que cuando Jesús fue tentado, tenía algunos “referentes” fuertes a las que aferrarse, respuestas seguras para guiarlo. Acudió a pasajes de las Escrituras sencillas y básicas a las que podía recurrir en su momento de necesidad. Para muchos, uno de esos fundamentos sería Jeremías: “Yo sé los planes que tengo para ti: planes de paz y no de desastre”. Para otro, podrían ser las Bienaventuranzas o el salmo 23. Sea lo que sea, ten preparadas esos referentes, esas oraciones o frases “imprescindibles” a las que puedas aferrarte en los momentos en que tu vida sea sometida a una dura prueba. Deja que esos referentes sean tu fundamento firme.



## St. Timothy Catholic School Advisory Board Call for Nominations

2025-2026 Board Positions

We are currently seeking nominations for the Advisory Board of St. Timothy Catholic School.

We are looking to fill one position to serve a minimum of a 4 year term.

The purpose of the Board shall be to provide advice and assistance to the Pastor in establishing goals and defining policies which shall govern the operation of St. Timothy Catholic School, subject to such rules and regulations that precede from the Archbishop through canon law and the corporate structures of the Archdiocese and the Archdiocesan Superintendent of Schools and the Archdiocesan Board of Education.

The Board, functioning as an advisory body, shall be guided by the following responsibilities:

1. To recommend policies to the School Administrator and the Pastor governing operation of the school;
- 2.
3. To create a better understanding of Catholic education in the community by fostering the relationship of the school to the entire community, both civic, religious, and cultural groups, and the public schools of the area;
- 4.
5. To analyze the school budget to determine if it realistically reflects the general financial and physical needs of the school;
- 6.
7. To verify that fiscal expenditures are prudent and in the best interest of the school;
- 8.
9. To discuss and evaluate reports presented to it by professional staff members;
- 10.
11. To recommend resources needed for improvement of the school's facilities.
- 12.
13. To support the development of educational programs.
- 14.
15. To monitor and evaluate programs which were established as a result of the pastor's policy decisions;
- 16.
17. To suggest criteria and provide counsel to the Pastor in the hiring, evaluation and dismissal of school administrators;
- 18.
19. To suggest criteria for the selection of school staff.
- 20.

You may nominate yourself or someone else by simply emailing the Selection Committee at [boardnominations@sttimothyschool.org](mailto:boardnominations@sttimothyschool.org). You or the nominee will then receive a questionnaire to fill out.

In April, the Selection Committee of the School Board shall screen the candidates and in May, the Pastor, in consultation with the School Board, shall select the new members of the School Board.


