Dear Sisters, Brothers and Friends of All Saints Catholic Church: Greetings and Praise the Lord.

Love that Seeks Us

Today, we stand before a profound mystery the Most Holy Trinity. A mystery not distant or abstract, but alive and active in our very lives. Wisdom itself tells us that before the world began, before the mountains, before the seas, the Lord possessed Wisdom. Wisdom was there as His craftsman, His delight, playing over the surface of the earth. This image reminds us that God is not solitary; God is a community of perfect love Father, Son, and Holy Spirit working together in harmony to bring forth and sustain all creation.

As we gaze at the heavens, the moon, and the stars the work of God's own fingers Psalm 8 calls us to marvel: "*What is man that you should be mindful of him?*" Yet, despite the vastness of the universe, God crowned us with glory and honor, placing us as stewards over all creation. This is the intimate care of the Trinity for each of us: we are not forgotten, not incidental, but beloved children, entrusted with God's creation and His love.

Saint Paul in Romans reveals to us the power of this relationship. Because of our faith in Jesus Christ, we have peace with God. But this peace is not the absence of struggle rather, it is the courage to face affliction, knowing it produces endurance, character, and hope. This hope is rooted in the love of God poured abundantly into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit is not distant but alive in us, empowering us to live with resilience and joy even amid trials.

In the Gospel, Jesus promises the coming of the Spirit of Truth the Holy Spirit who will guide us to all truth, who will glorify the Son, and reveal the fullness of the Father's love. The Trinity is not a doctrine locked away in ancient texts; it is a living reality that transforms and guides us every day.

So what does this mean for us? It means we are invited to live the life of the Trinity a life of unity, love, and mission. Just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit exist in perfect harmony, so too are we called to live in relationship with God and with one another. In our families, workplaces, and community, we become reflections of the Trinity when we love selflessly, forgive generously, and seek peace.

Let us be inspired today to embody this divine love, knowing that the God who made the heavens and earth, who delights in us, walks with us through every trial, and fills us with His Spirit. Let us walk boldly, confident that the same Spirit who guided the first disciples is alive in us guiding, strengthening, and leading us into the fullness of life. May the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity be our strength and joy now and always.

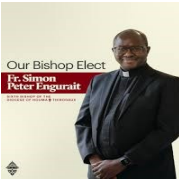

WASHINGTON – Pope Leo XIV has appointed Reverend Simon Peter Engurait, a priest of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux and current diocesan administrator, as the Bishop of Houma-Thibodaux.



The appointment was publicized in Washington, D.C. on June 5, 2025, by Monsignor Većeslav Tumir, chargé d’ affaires, a.i., of the Apostolic Nunciature, in the temporary absence of Cardinal Christophe Pierre, apostolic nuncio to the United States.

The following biographical information for Bishop-elect Engurait was drawn from preliminary materials provided to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops:

Father Engurait was born on August 28, 1971, in Ngora, Uganda. He attended St. Peter’s College in Tororo, Uganda, and studied at Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans, Louisiana. He received a bachelor’s degree at Makerere University in Kampala, Uganda (1995), a master of divinity from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans, Louisiana (2013) and a master of business administration at Maastricht School of Management in The Netherlands (1999). He was ordained to the priesthood on May 25, 2013.

Father Engurait’s assignments after ordination include: parochial vicar at the Cathedral of Saint Francis de Sales in Houma (2013-2015), Saint Genevieve parish in Thibodaux (2015-2016), and Christ the Redeemer parish in Thibodaux (2016-2017). He has served as pastor of Saint Bridget parish in Schriever since 2017.

Bishop-elect Engurait has also served as the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux’s vicar general (2017-2024), and as moderator of the curia since 2016. He has served as the Diocesan Administrator since 2024. He speaks English, Ateso, Kishwahili, and Spanish.

The Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux is comprised of 3,500 square miles in the State of Louisiana, and has a total population of 257,548, of which 75,761, are Catholic.

Mass is followed by Eucharistic Adoration.



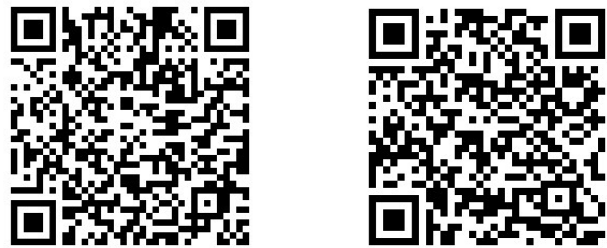

Most Holy Trinity

Because God is a triune God, God is organically in relationship with others. This is natural, for love and mercy are key qualities of God’s being. How can you be loving and merciful without an object for that love and mercy? No wonder God—and the wisdom of God—loved “playing on the surface of his earth...[finding] delight in the human race” (Proverbs 8:31). Recall that God is portrayed walking through the garden of Eden before the fall, eager to interact with the first man and woman. But even before God had anyone on earth to love, God could direct love and faithfulness to the other members of the Trinity.
