LETTER OF APPEAL FROM ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY ON WILDFIRES DEVASTATION

St. Vincent de Paul-St. Cecilia is committed in providing assistance to those suffering in the midst of the wildfires in southern Oregon. Our previous Vicars, now assigned to the affected areas, are facing the brunt of this catastrophe. Rev. Brent Crowe, in Ashland, has 18 families burned out of their homes. Rev. Ken Sampson, at Sacred Heart Parish as Pastor, is facing the fact that 130 parishioners have lost everything, their homes and vehicles. There are 42,000 people displaced in Jackson County, between those two parishes, and those numbers are an estimate. In Medford, 3,000-4,000 housing units were destroyed in the fires. People have lost the tools of their livelihood. They have lost the security of facing the fall and winter months without permanent shelter. They have and are experiencing trauma.
