For women and men suffering after abortion: May the Church's abortion healing ministry, Project Rachel, help them find forgiveness and peace through Christ's endless mercy; We pray to the Lord: Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### October 31st

For those nearing the end of life: May they place their faith in Christ and be strengthened in hope for eternal life with Him; We pray to the Lord: Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time
