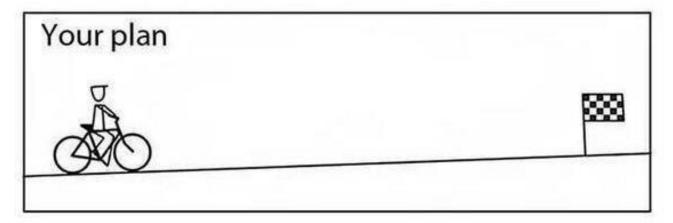


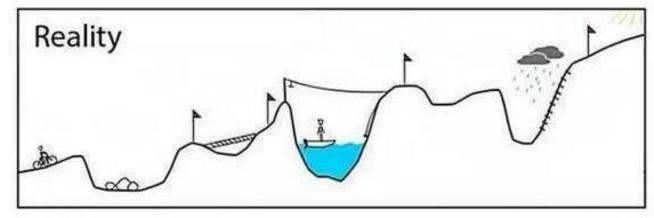




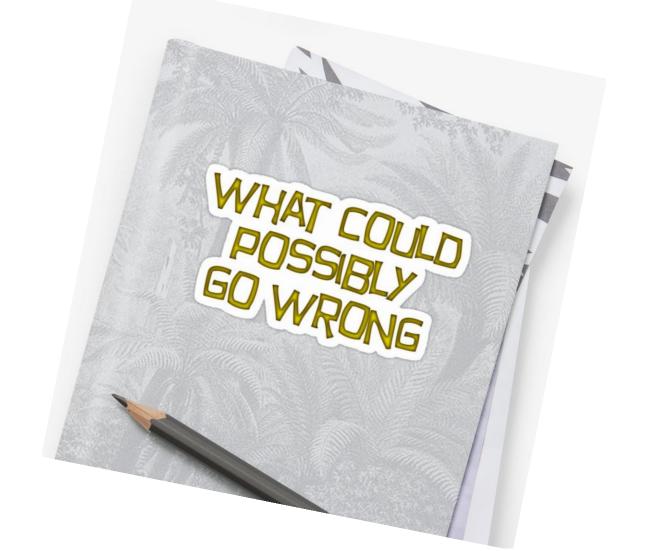
Hiccups and Glitches

What to do when things don't go according to plan.









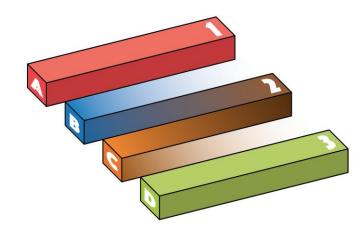












Don't get tripped up!

- Everyone CELEBRATE!!!





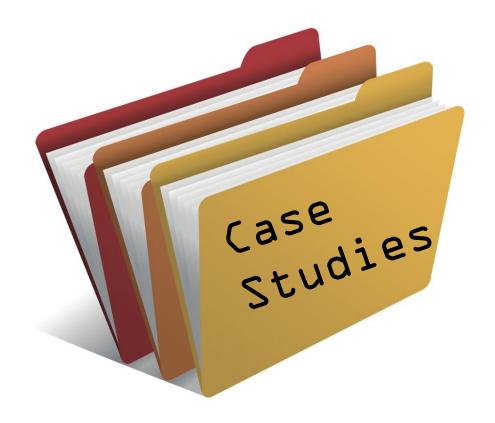


It's ironic that we use technology to communicate (land line, mobile phone, email, fax, etc.) about this process and we sometimes find that communication to be the most challenging part of the process.

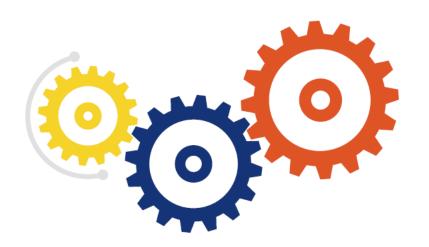
