

A Look Into Parkinson's Disease

April is Parkinson's Awareness Month.

What is Parkinson's? According to the National Parkinson Foundation (NPF), Parkinson's Disease is a neurodegenerative brain disorder which progresses slowly in most cases. Most people with Parkinson's live for years with the disease and symptoms may take years to develop.

What is occurring in a person with Parkinson's? The brain is slowly stopping production of dopamine, and with decreased dopamine a person has less ability to control their movements, body and emotions (NPF).

How common is the disease? Nearly one million people in the United States live with Parkinson's, and more than 10 million people worldwide have it, according to the Parkinson's Disease Foundation (PDF).

What are signs and symptoms of the disease?

According to the Mayo Clinic, the disease starts gradually. Early signs can be mild and go unnoticed. They often begin on one side and remain worse on that side, even when symptoms start to affect both sides. Symptoms can include, but are not limited to: a hand tremor, stiffness or slowing of movement, little or no facial expression, rigid muscles, arms that do not sway when one walks, soft or slurred speech, and writing changes. Symptoms worsen as the condition progresses over time.

What are the risk factors for Parkinson's?

According to the Mayo Clinic, there are several. Parkinson's normally begins in early or late life. People usually develop the disease around age 60 or older. Having close relatives with the disease can increase the chances of a person having it, but risks are still small unless many in the family have it. Men are more likely to have the disease than women. Ongoing exposure to herbicides and pesticides may put people at a



slightly increased risk for the disease.

Is it fatal? Parkinson's disease is not fatal, but complications from it are serious.

Is there a cure? There is not currently a cure for Parkinson's Disease. That said, there are ways to treat symptoms to improve quality of life, according to the NPF. In certain cases, doctors may suggest surgery to regulate regions of the brain and help with symptoms, according to the Mayo Clinic. Other treatments may include ongoing aerobic exercises, physical therapy to help with balance, and help from a speech pathologist to improve speech problems.

How is Parkinson's diagnosed? Parkinson's can be diagnosed by a skilled practitioner's review of a patient's symptoms and, likely, a series of diagnostic testing.

For those who suspect they or someone they know may have symptoms of Parkinson's Disease, the foundation suggests making an appointment with a movement disorder specialist. To find a specialist by location, the foundation has a help line available Mondays through Fridays from 9am to 5 pm at 800-457-6676.

RESIDENT HIGHLIGHT: BETTY ANDERSON

Betty Anderson was born in Anoka, Minnesota in 1926 at home on her families landlord's birthday. The landlord was so excited he brought over a gold ring for Betty's mom to give her when she was older. Betty still has this gold ring today. Betty fondly referred to the landlord as Grandma and Grandpa Groat. Grandpa Groat was killed in a tornado but his wife survived and Betty's family kept in touch with her until her death. Betty has one brother, Richard, who is just one year older and two younger sisters, Dot and Karen. Richard has written a 650 page memoir! Betty's dad worked in construction building roads, bridges, and dams. During this time he would build "shacks" on the job sites and that is where they family would live. One project he worked for was the Fort Peck Dam and his picture appeared on the first cover of LIFE magazine! When Betty was in the 5th grade her great grandma died and her mom and dad bought her farm in Zimmerman, Minnesota. They moved to the farm over Christmas vacation. Richard put Betty on his shoulders to try and turn on the light that was hanging from the ceiling and he tripped and dropped her and she fell against the floor sweeper and got a black eye. When she started school after vacation with her black eye a classmate, Robert, decided then and there that she was one he was going to marry. When they were 15, Robert drove a horse team for a sleigh ride for Betty and her Girl Scout troop. When the ride was over, Robert dropped off all the other girls and then tied up the team and walked Betty home. This was when they had their first kiss! Before graduation Robert enlisted in the Marines and was stationed in the Pacific for 4 years. Betty wrote letters to all the guys that enlisted, sometimes up to 4 or 5 letters every night. When Robert returned from the Pacific they rode the bus to Minneapolis to go shopping, he kept elbowing her into the jewelry store, finally she gave in and they bought a ring. He proposed and they were engaged on February 4, 1946 and were married on June 11, 1947. Robert worked for the county and in construction. He also

dictated to Betty his experiences during his enlistment up until a certain battle and then he spoke no more about it. Betty used the letters he wrote to her and completed his story and has a copy of it in her possession. Betty worked for The Elk River Clinic until they were married and had children. They had two boys and one girl, David, Chris, and Susan. Betty stayed home and cared for the children until Susan was in 6th grade. Then she worked as a school secretary for a total of 23 years in 3 different schools, in 3 different states at 3 different levels. After Minnesota Betty and Robert moved to Grand Junction, CO where Robert built modular houses. After Susie graduated from Mesa College and moved to Denver, Betty and Robert sold everything and moved to Bozeman, MT. She applied and got a job as school secretary for Wilson Middle School and Robert went to work for Wiseman and then Kenyon Noble Lumber Co. They started out their time in Bozeman out on Baseline Road and moved to town upon their retirement in 1990. After only two years of retirement Robert died of prostate cancer that had metastasized to his bone before it was ever diagnosed. Betty took care of Robert at home by herself up until the last week when Hospice came in to help. She then lived alone for 20 years and then moved in with her grandkids for 2 years before moving to Bozeman Lodge on August 8, 2016. Betty really enjoys the residents and the help! You might run into her at current events, lattes, playing BINGO, or selling

greeting cards in the lobby. Be sure to stop and say "Hello" if you do, she has lots more stories to tell. Welcome to the Lodge Betty Anderson.
