Hearing Aids Can Help Your Brain

Hearing aids have been proven to improve the quality of life for seniors with hearing loss. Now, new research indicates they may also contribute to cognitive function. Results from a recent Columbia University Medical Center study show that participants with hearing aids scored significantly higher on tests than those without hearing aids. Researchers believe that hearing loss is linked to sensory-specific cognitive decline, but the simple use of hearing aids can slow that decline or even prevent it by keeping seniors with hearing loss socially engaged and connected.

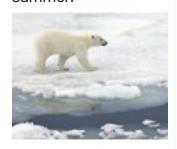

Happy holidays! I hope you enjoy these interesting facts about eggnog.

Eggnog is also known as:

- Coquito in Puerto Rico.
- Rompope in Mexico.
- Biersuppe in German.

History shows that eggnog was first enjoyed in America during the 18th century. George Washington was a fan of eggnog.

One cup of eggnog contains 342 calories, 34 grams of carbohydrates and 19 grams of fat.

The main ingredients of eggnog:

- cream
- milk
- eggs (pasteurized eggs are the safest—the only kind used at American House)
- sugar
- cinnamon
- nutmea
- alcohol, if you choose.

Enjoy some eggnog this holiday season!

Sugar Cookie Recipe

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 cups butter, softened
- 2 cups white sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 5 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt

Directions

- In a large bowl, cream together butter and sugar until smooth. Beat in eggs and vanilla. Stir in the flour, baking powder, and salt. Cover, and chill dough for at least one hour (or overnight).
- Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Roll out dough on floured surface 1/4 to 1/2 inch thick. Cut into shapes with any cookie cutter. Place cookies 1 inch apart on ungreased cookie sheets.
- Bake 6 to 8 minutes in preheated oven. Cool.
